It appears that enough signatures have been gathered to put the Recall of Governor Newson on the Ballot! The Democratically controlled Legislature is already investigating how they can prolong the Special Election Vote being taken - just as they did for Senator Josh Newman (D – Fullerton) when he was recalled in 2018 when Governor Brown was last in Office!

With Covid 19 protections/
restrictions on attending inperson for Committee hearings,
testifying by telephone etc. this
recall has been adding to the
chaos in the Capital! Add to this
the demolition of the East Capital
Building Annex and staff moving
over into the new building
before the Billion Dollar remodel
upcoming. The building you have
been in for the Transportation
Committee hearings and to visit
the Assembly/Senators is on
schedule to be torn down July 1st,
right before the Legislature returns for the final push of Bills in for
August-September deadline to get Bills to the Governor's Desk

**AB 43 Friedman** (D – Glendale, Chair of Assembly Transportation). **Traffic Safety**: This bill would require, beginning June 1, 2022, and every 6 months thereafter, Caltrans to convene a committee of external design experts to advise on revisions to the Highway Design Manual. This bill would extend the period of time a prima facie speed limit may be justified by an engineering and traffic survey, as specified, if a registered engineer evaluates the section of the highway and finds that there has been an increase in traffic-related crashes.

**AB 122 Boerner Horvath** (D – Oceanside) **Vehicles: required stops: bicycles**: This bill would require a person riding a bicycle, when approaching a stop sign at the entrance of an intersection, to yield the right-of-way to any vehicles that have stopped at the entrance of the intersection, have entered the intersection, or that are approaching on the intersecting highway close enough to constitute an immediate hazard, and shall continue to yield the right-of-way to those vehicles until reasonably safe to proceed.

AB 232 Gallagher (R – Yuba City) Off-highway vehicles: reciprocity: Existing law requires every off-highway motor vehicle that is not registered under the Vehicle Code to display an identification plate or device issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles, with certain exceptions, including an off-highway motor vehicle with a currently valid identification or registration permit issued by another state. Except as otherwise specified, a violation of the Vehicle Code is punishable as an infraction. This bill would permit application of that exception only if the other state recognizes an identification plate or device issued by the department as valid for use in that state.

**SB 66 Allen** (D – Santa Monica) **California Council on the Future of Transportation: advisory committee: autonomous vehicle technology**: This bill would require the secretary to establish an advisory committee, the California Council on the Future of Transportation, which would require the council to gather public comment on issues and concerns related to autonomous vehicles and to submit, no later than January 1, 2024, a report to the Legislature with, among other things, recommendations for statewide policy changes and updates, and to continue to update the report, or submit a new report, of its recommendations biannually thereafter, or more frequently at the secretary's discretion.

SB 227 Jones (R – Santee) Off-highway vehicles: This bill would require, for the issuance or renewal of a competition identification, a specified configuration for the vehicle identification number and product identification number for an off-highway motor vehicle or ATV that is model year 2022 or later and is used solely for competition not on a public highway. The bill would impose restrictions on the operation of a competition motorcycle or ATV on public lands, including, among others, a requirement that a rider possess a current and valid competition card from a competition-sanctioning organization when practicing for a sanctioned event on public lands. Because operating a competition motorcycle or ATV on public lands in violation of those requirements would be a crime, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program.

SB 799 Glazer (D – Orinda) Off-highway vehicular recreation: Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area: Alameda-Tesla Expansion Area: This bill would require the Department of Parks and Recreation to preserve the portion of the Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area known as the "Alameda-Tesla Expansion Area" for conservation purposes, as specified. The bill would make implementation of this provision contingent upon at least \$9,000,000 being appropriated by the Legislature in the annual Budget Act or another statute, transferred, or donated to the Off-Highway Vehicle Trust Fund for its purposes.

Many bikers attended and those that could not, were able to join in via Zoom, a good alternative for sharing other than in person.

The meeting, for the most part, was comprised of patch holders, many representing their clubs and other MRO's such as ABATE. A special invitation was sent out to the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF), the first motorcyclists' rights advocacy organization with a full-time legislative and political presence in our nation's capital. The only Washington voice devoted exclusively to you, the street rider. The MRF function is very similar to that of ABATE's but operates at the Federal level as opposed to ABATE at the State level, indeed the MRF is comprised of a great cross-section of all riders from independents to club patch holders, but the prevalent group are ABATE members from all over the United States.

The event, entitled. "Bridging the Gap," was to discuss opportunities for the motorcycle club community to work in partnership with the MRF on national legislation. The MRF gave two presentations, the first on our 2021 legislative agenda and the second on the outlook for motorcycling going forward. The unity and cooperation of the groups proved a great success.

I feel it is imperative to pool our resources as a biker community, to communicate and join together across the spectrum in our legislative efforts, preserving and developing our rights and freedoms. I want to thank all members for their support, attendance and ask you all to do your best to help increase our income flow while your Board of Directors does its best to keep the operating expenses of your organization as low as possible. We have a financial obligation to cover for legislative representative in the form of a 'Lobbyist' and operation of our State office. This Board is committed wholeheartedly to fulfilling our obligations to our members and the riders of California.

California has always allowed valid "out of state" OHV registered vehicles to use our public lands. It has come to our attention that some of our neighboring states have recently implemented a "non-resident" fee for OHV's being operated in their state. By no longer honoring our California registration these states are reneging on a long standing tradition in the OHV community. These new regulations will be expensive and prove onerous to every legally licensed OHV owner that travels and recreates in other states. Our ABATE OHV Division is asking for your help and financial support in fighting this type of legislation. Assembly Bill 2761 sponsored by Assemblyman Gallagher (Republican—Yuba City) seeks to remedy this issue of reciprocity and ABATE of California is asking you to help the OHV communities of our states restore equal access to OHV areas for all legally licensed users.

In addition to AB 2761, Abate of California is proposing two other bills for our elected official's to consider this year. Our first bill would require DMV to allow rider's to take both the M/C skill's test and their DMV written exam during their CHP certified M/C training classes. After a rider successfully completes and passes both tests the school would submit the information to DMV and they would issue a valid M/C endorsement card by mail to the rider that is valid for the duration of their current. California drivers license. Upon license renewal the M/C endorsement would then be added to their new license thereby saving the student the time and expense associated with visiting and testing at their local DMV office.

Our second hill would seek to exempt all M/C riders and especially our Military Veteran riders from being accessed a toll fee when traveling on a toll road within the state of California.

ARE GAS-POWERED VEHICLES ENDANGERED?: More than three years after President Trump pulled the U.S. out of the Paris climate agreement, we're back in. On Biden's first day in office on January 20th, one of his first priorities was to sign an executive order to re-enter the global pact to slow climate change. Rejoining the accord was simple; the next step gets harder: How can the world's second-largest polluter shrink emissions 45-50% by the end of this decade to comply with the deal? One of Joe Biden's campaign promises was to "Transition away from oil" and create a "carbon pollution-free power sector" by 2035, as part of a \$2 trillion investment to build back the economy by investing in green

The Paris Agreement does not prescribe exact methods for eliminating emissions behind global warming, but establishes binding targets for avoiding worrisome temperature thresholds. Research conducted by the German Aerospace Centre, says that passenger car engines as we know it need to be completely phased out from new sales before the end of the next decade in order for Europe to limit global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius, the most ambitious part of the Paris pact's "well below 2 degrees Celsius" overall aim. More than 14 countries and over 20 cities around the world have proposed banning the sale of fossil fuel vehicles at some time in the near future.



GM SETS 2035 TARGET TO PHASE OUT GAS-, DIESEL-POWERED VEHICLES GLOBALLY:

General Motors has set a 2035 target date for phasing out gasoline and diesel powered vehicles from its showrooms globally, among the first major auto makers to put a timeline on transitioning to a fully electric lineup.

One of the world's largest automakers, GM wants to end sales of combustion engine vehicles by 2035 as part of a broader pledge to become carbon neutral by 2040. Other car companies committed to the climate pledge include BMW, Ford, Mercedes-Benz, Volkswagen and Volvo.

<u>DOUBLE-DIGIT MOTORCYCLE SALES INCREASE DURING WORST YEAR THIS CENTURY</u>: In spite of the economic and health uncertainty posed by the Coronavirus pandemic for the bulk of 2020, the powersports sector experienced an 18.4%

The double-digit growth was owed largely to a big bump in off-highway bikes and ATVs, which jumped 46.5% & 33.8% respectively, but new-model motorcycle and scooter sales were also up 11.4% over 2019, according to the Motorcycle Industry Council Retail

"Overall, the industry had a good year under difficult circumstances," noted Erik Pritchard, president and CEO of the Motorcycle Industry Council (MIC), stating; "The COVID-19 pandemic forced all of us to be nimble and to make the changes we needed to survive. In the end, many in the industry saw strong growth, and now our opportunity is to keep all of these new riders riding and to inspire even more people to join us on two, three, and four wheels."

This positive turn after years of dwindling sales figures, with the industry as a whole reaching in every possible direction to inspire a new generation of dedicated riders, is quite encouraging, and hopefully the trend will continue into the future.

ELECTRIC MOTORCYCLE BUYERS GET A U.S. TAX CREDIT THROUGH 2021: If you're thinking about buying a new electric motorcycle this year, and you live in the USA, here's some good news: the federal tax credit that went into effect for new electric bike models at the end of 2019 has been extended until January 1, 2022.

Any electric motorcycle that can go at least 45 mph is eligible for a 10% tax credit, up to \$2,500.

Electric motorcycle owners new and old should also know that, at the same time that electric motorcycle credit got extended, the 30% EV charger installation credit was re-upped by the federal government as well. For 2021, you're eligible for a credit up to \$1,000

for home installations and up to \$30,000 for business installations on new EV chargers.

"The electric motorcycle industry is rapidly responding to our country's need for affordable and environmentally responsible transportation," said Zero Motorcycles' CEO Sam Paschel, adding that "These tax credits represent an investment in a cleaner energy future, and also effectively create jobs in the ever-growing electric vehicle industry."

Details are still being hammered out, but other concurrent federal government plans include additional federal tax incentives to get everyday people to switch from gas to EV, though it's unknown at this time how those will specifically affect the electric motorcycle industry. industry.

DAYTONA BIKE WEEK IS A 'GO'!: By a 6-1 vote on January 20th, the Daytona Beach city commission endorsed plans for the 80th annual bike rally, scheduled for March 5th – 14th. Daytona Bike Week's organizers feared they might have to pull the plug on the 2021 rally, due to a resurgence of the COVID-19 pandemic, but the event is a huge economic driver for the region, and with this year being the 80th anniversary, businesses were especially looking forward to the needed financial boost. Masks, hand sanitizer stations, temperature checks, signs and social distancing come with the commission's new rules, and most bars, restaurants and other businesses will be required to limit occupancy to 60%, but otherwise Daytona Bike Week went on as scheduled!"

AMERICADE POSTPONED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS: This year's Americade Motorcycle Touring Rally, typically held in June in Lake George, N.Y. each year since 1983, has been rescheduled to September 21st – 25th due to Coronavirus concerns. Last year's Americade was first postponed to July before being canceled altogether because of the global pandemic.

BILL COMMEMORATES ROUTE 66 CENTENNIAL: Federal legislation was signed into law on December 23, 2020 to establish a commission to recommend ways to commemorate Route 66's upcoming 100th anniversary. The first all-paved U.S. highway was completed in 1926 and ran from Chicago to Los Angeles.

The new 15-person commission is to include representatives from the states through which the highway ran: Illinois, Missouri,

Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona and California.
