Lobbyist's Legislative Report



Once again, the Legislature's business has been slowed down drastically by the Budget mess! Our Helmet Repeal bill, and many other good bills, were killed because of partisan fighting between the Democrats trying to extend the sales tax and vehicle license fee taxes, and the Republican legislators who oppose them. Assemblyman Chris Norby (R–Fullerton) did a courageous job and an outstanding presentation on our Repeal bill, AB 695, in committee on April 25; and Johnny O'kane and I were given the usual time to testify in support.

However, once again, it was voted down, on a completely party line vote, 8 Democrat NO votes to 4 AYEs by Republicans, with Assemblymen Blumenfield and Achadjian abstaining! We do have several Democrat legislators who support AB 695, Members who do not support AB 695.

We need to work hard on a select group of legislators, plus we may need to take some amendments to our bill to get it to pass the Assembly! Stay tuned — ask your PAC

Our ban on motorcycle-only checkpoints effort is being blocked, not because of the substance of the legislation, but because our author will not support tax increases! Using a different approach, we are researching introducing a Joint House Resolution to ban motorcycle-only checkpoints.

The Preliminary draft reapportionment maps will be out in June and this too will throw everyone in the Legislature into more chaos trying to figure out what district they will be running in. In 1990 Assemblyman Floyd and Dave Elder were thrown together: I told our PAC to support Juanita McDonald and we were able to take Dick Floyd out. WASHINGTON STATE ENACTS NA-TION'S FIRST ANTI-PROFILING

LAW: Motorcycle riders routinely report being profiled by law enforcement, but a new law in Washington State is intended to prohibit police from singling out bikers for stops without clear and legitimate reason.

Modeled after a 2002 state law outlawing racial profiling by police, the nation's first "anti-profiling" bill passed unanimously through both the House and Senate, and was signed by Gov. Chris Gregoire on April 13. Sponsored by Rep. Steve Kirby (D-Tacoma), the new law will force local law enforcement agencies to adopt a written policy designed to condemn and prevent the profiling of motorcyclists, and it institutes training to address the problem.

gests that retail sales improved in the first three months of the year. According to an analysis by Raymond James & Associates, 55% of the dealerships surveyed said they had a year-over-year sales increase in the quarter, and nearly all reported that inventories were "ideal" or "light".

The MIC also reported that tire sales, which it says are an indicator of motorcycle use, also rose in the first three months of the year. Motorcycle and scooter tire sales increased 29%, while sales of tires for on-highway bikes rose 28% and scooter tires jumped 49%.

The industry council's owner survey estimates the number of motorcycle miles traveled rose 5% to 27.6 billion miles from 2008-09. The percentage of U.S. households with at least one motorcycle grew to 6.8% in 2009 from 5.4% in 2003.

E-CYCLE GROWTH FORECAST: More and more motorcycles and scooters powered by electricity are hitting the road, and some experts predict that the number of electric two-wheel vehicles could swell to more than 100 million worldwide within the next 5 years.

Currently, there are about 17 million electric motorcycles and scooters on the road, but a new study by Pike Research shows that that the global market could expand to more than 138 million by 2017.

"Electric motorcycles and scooters have strong appeal for many consumers," says senior analyst Dave Hurst. "They are relatively low cost







Tech Tips by Craig Griswold

The Great Oil Debate (Part I)

Few things generate more debate in the automotive/motorcycle world than the subject of oil. In this series, we'll clear up some of the bad information floating around, break down oil in technical terms. and talk about maintenance.

Many moons ago, oil selection with regards to quality, varied greatly. Anything from real cheap non-detergent oil to the more expensive synthetics and everything in between made selection a little more complicated. These days, there's no shortage of choices, but most name brand

oils are of excellent quality. As long as you are using the right oil for the application, you'll be in good shape.



Let's start by clarifying some of the "facts" and rumors. First, there's the synthetic vs. fossil oil argument. Here's my can go back and forth all day long. Not take. This is a good merge into some of the industry's best hum dingers. Synthetic IS NOT TOO SLIPPERY! Your bearings WILL NOT SKID. This was a favorite back before Harley started selling synthetic oil. 






All in all a great ride. For those that didn't make it, get ready, lucky number 13 is next year!















It was a great day for riding, made even better with good companions and meeting interesting folks.















Say What??? by John Del Santo

Listen to a conversation between a bunch of motorcycle riders, and the phrases you'll hear repeated most often are "What?" and "Say that again." Along with other things we've done in our lives, riding a motorcycle can put a lot of strain on our hearing. Usually it's not the sound of the bike that does the damage, but the sound of the wind passing our ears for thousands and thousands of miles year after year. A full helmet doesn't guarantee hearing protection, and some helmets increase the noise in our ears. A good set of earplugs is a great way to protect our hearing.

Everyone loses some hearing over the years depending on genetics, our trade, or the sports we've been involved in during our lives. Folks who listen to music with headphones and the volume cranked up can expect trouble down the road; people who exercise at the gym with earphones on and the volume high can do excessive damage. Are you one of the I-POD crowd? Hearing experts recommend never having the volume set higher than ³/₄ on the scale.

Anyone who spent a lot of time at rock concerts or clubs will probably spend a lot of their later years not being fully included in many conversations. If we add motorcycle riding to any of those, the earlier we start to protect our hearing, the better.

Some people, like this writer, don't give the subject much thought (what, me worry?) until they start hearing tones or sounds like there's water running in the next room 24 hours a day, or find themselves saying "What?" an awful lot. You can pump iron to get your muscles back in tone, or even do exercises that will improve your eyesight, but like diamonds, hearing loss is forever.

You can find good washable, reusable earplugs, custom fitted plugs, or good disposables. If you use a computer, try www.webbikeworld.com/Earplugs/earplugs.htm. You can also try safety supply houses, motorcycle shops (I don't think they make earplugs in chrome, yet) or at sporting goods stores. If you are not a user yet, try out a pair; follow directions putting them in, and take them out slowly and carefully to avoid damage to the eardrum. Keeping the right and left plugs separate is considered to be a safe thing to do to prevent the transfer of ear infection.

They are a little weird when you first start using them; your engine sounds different, and you'll be concerned that you may not hear that car moving into the lane next to you. But after all, we should probably save whatever we can, or get used to writing notes to each other somewhere in years to come.

Be Alert, Ride Safe, and Hear! Hear!

Following the rally, those in attendance visited with the legislators, encouraging them to pass biker-friendly legislation.
































