

The Legislature is in its closing weeks, and will recess September 13th, and then return in January, 2014. During the final days of its session, the Legislature is dealing with the Supreme Court's decision that will force thousands of prisoners convicted of serious crimes, to be released due to overcrowding. Governor Brown and the Legislature are attempting to come up with an alternative plan to house these prisoners because of the revenue windfall from the passage of the initiative that raised all of our taxes.

We hope to have a **HUGE** win for our new off-road ABATE members. SB 234, by Senator Mimi Walters and Assemblyman Tim Donnelly. The bill has been enrolled and presented to Governor Brown for his signature, he has twelve days to sign or veto it; if Governor Brown signs this bill it will signify to our off-roaders who changed the seating in their side by sides that they will be grandfathered in and these modified vehicles will always be legal for off-road use. Again, this would be a huge Victory for ABATE and the proposals was mine. That is to have the our members.

We are **VERY** involved in protecting the rights of both highway and off-road motorcycling.



The lane sharing bill, SB 350, will **NOT** BE HEARD UNTIL JANUARY, 2014. It's also important to note that our PAC voted at the May meeting to OPPOSE SB 350 as it is currently written.

On August 8th, I attended the California Motorcycle Safety Program (CMSP) Advisory Committee annual meeting where I currently sit as ABATE's representative. The Committee moved as a motion to meet twice a year, rather than only once annually, and we will continue to be aggressive with motorcycle safety proposals. One of Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) and the CHP do more motorcyclist safety Public Service Announcements.



## **Motorcycle Safety**

SAY WHAT? I CAN'T HEAR YOU!

from my observation, most of us have a pair and they are not a matching set, close but no cigar. Some ears are extra large and some are tiny, then there's the average size - I hope I'm in that category. Most ears are like side scoops on your head, some are like a baloney cut exhaust system slicked back, some stick out like air brakes on an F15 fighter jet! The point is that no matter what size or type of ears you have we are all subjected to noise pollution, especially when we ride! The most dominating noise I hear is my pipes (or the person riding next to me as well) and the wind. The wind noise I hear dominates the noise my pipes make when I hit a certain speed. The pipes sure make a sweet noise and I tolerate them easily, but the wind creeps up and the sweet sound is drowned out, bummer.

There are many styles of helmets, from novelties to high cut, full face, and whatever you can get away with, hmmm, no helmets! Most helmets we choose don't offer any protection for your ears, but some offer somewhat low rating protection, just because they cover your ears. We get certain types of helmets for various reasons, we want to look cool, or we don't like the confinement, it doesn't matter because we all have different opinions anyway. Besides we want to look as cool as our bikes, right! Then there's the geek looking type of helmet that we would never be caught wearing.

The full face helmet probably offers you the best protection for noise levels when you are riding. The only setback about this is

Ears come in all sizes and shapes and

that your head weighs five pounds more and grew in size 15%. This is not a fact, just an observation. It could be more pending on the size of your head! We should never rely on any helmet for ear protection, even though some offer more than others it's still not an excuse to not have any type of protection.

Have you ever been to some type of motorcycle event, and you see the multitudes of bikers and their passengers that don't use any type of ear protection? The number that doesn't will surprise you, what could be their excuse for not having any type of ear protection? When you think about it there aren't that many choices to make to protect your hearing. Check this out, the pipes on your bike are loud let's say, but when you pass the 35 miles per hour speed, the wind noise starts dominating your ears, the speed is approximate, but if you need to confirm this then get on your bike and test it out. This may differ because not all of us have

the same hearing and some may already have some hearing loss, but do this to see for yourself. Think about this; you were riding your

bike all day, maybe stopping here or there for some refreshments etc. and you decide to go home. Your ride is from, let's say, a gentle cruise to breakneck speeds. The sensation of riding and the speed in which you travel has your adrenaline pumped. You get home in record time. You've left your buds behind eating your dust and you get into your pad and it's all quiet, except the noise you now hear - is it a buzzing or ringing sound? It's not the phone or doorbell. Here's a hint, it's inside your skull, maybe on both sides. I would say with confidence that most people have experienced this phenomenon. It's called TTS, Temporary Threshold Shift. This is a temporary shift in your hearing due to overexposure to loud noise. Has this happened to you before?

I remember going to a rock concert in my youth and after enjoying the loud music I would be half deaf and my ears were ringing as I left. Do you remember doing this? It would eventually go away and I probably escaped damaging my ears permanently because I did it once in a great while. If I did this every other day I would probably be deaf right now! I would gamble on this and say we've all done this before. That effect is the same as riding without ear protection. If you ride most of the time and you don't have any type of ear protection you will start to see this Temporary Shift become a permanent one with the unpleasant side effect of a constant ringing or the good ole' buzzing of the ears. This condition is usually related to the beginning of hearing loss and I'll tell you like all the doctors would say, "It's not

The tiny hair cells in the inner ear, the ones that convert sound to the electrical impulses that are sent via the auditory nerve to the brain, are permanently damaged by loud sounds, i.e. loud pipes, wind, loud music, etc. One of the most important facts about hearing loss is that it is a gradual thing, excluding a freakish accident. The next level of earplugs is the silicone molded earplugs. I'm sure most of you have seen the multitude of ads out there. I've seen these companies at events and they will make them for you on the spot as well (approximately \$30.00 and up). How cool is that? And for a few bucks more, probably a lot more, you can have molded in the ear monitor earplugs - the cream of the crop especially if you have a killer stereo on your bike.

> You have to be more than smart when you're wearing any type of ear protection; you can't relax thinking all is good because you've conquered one problem. Stuff happens and maybe a certain noise you need to hear can prevent an accident or major motorcycle related problems. You don't want to notice all of a sudden a trail of black smoke two miles long coming from your back end!

There are many types of earplugs out big bucks. It's what you want that counts, because everyone is different. Everyone has their own philosophies about hearing loss. Being protected is what counts the most. You have to make a conscious effort in doing this. It should be as standard as putting on your sunglasses or helmet.

If you think it's macho not wearing earplugs or worried some people may laugh at you, well at least you'll be able to hear them! Just remember ear plugs help reduce the permanent effects of hearing loss. To all you older people, this is not a younger generation thing, the sooner you start protecting your ears, the longer you'll be able to hear more. It is better to be safe than sorry and I'll tell you, down the road when you get older and have used earplugs, you'll be happy when you don't have to say, "EH? Say what? Can you speak up? I'm hard of hear-

FEDERAL BILLS WOULD PROTECT MANUFACTURERS OF ETHANOL FU-ELS: Even as motorcyclists and others are calling for further research and testing of fuels containing ethanol, and the fact that E-15 (gasoline containing 15% ethanol) is not approved for use in any of the millions of motorcycles on and off-road, two bills have been introduced in Congress to protect the fuel industry from lawsuits resulting from its use. Illinois Congressman John Shimkus, otherwise a longtime friend of motorcycle rid-

ers, has authored H.R.1214, the Domestic Fuels Protection Act of 2014; "To provide liability protection for claims based on the design, manufacture, sale, offer for sale, introduction into commerce, or use of certain fuels and fuel additives." Likewise, Texas Congressman Gene

Green has offered H.R.2267, the American Fuel Protection Act of 2013, which "Deems a claim for liability against a qualified entity as a claim against the United States for damages resulting from, or aggravated by, the

use of transportation fuel containing etha-

nol in concentrations greater than 10% to operate an internal combustion engine. Abrogates U.S. sovereign immunity and makes the United States exclusively liable for such claims. Limits awards to actual damages sustained by a claimant. Defines "qualified entity" to mean an entity engaged in the manufacture, use, sale, or distribution of: (1) transportation fuel or renewable fuel, or (2) products which use transportation fuel. Grants U.S. district courts exclusive juris-

Both bills have been referred to committee, and either proposal would indemnify fuel manufacturers and suppliers from legal actions for damages caused by their product, leaving U.S. taxpayers to foot the bill for clean-ups from leakage and limiting their liability to actual damages by a claimant, such as the out-of-pocket cost to rebuild an engine damaged by E-15 gas.

MISSOURI INITIATIVE MAY PUT RIDERSHIP TO A VOTE: The secretary of state's office has announced that a petition to restrict passengers on motorcycles has met standards for circulation, and supporters can begin collecting signatures to get the proposal on the 2014 ballot.

The proposal, to be put to voters to decide, would require Missouri motorcycle



passengers. The restrictions would not apply to those who have had a motorcycle license for the previous two years and were born in 1984 or earlier. The first violation would be a misdemean-

State Representative Meredith Strang Burgess (R-Cumberland) has told the Journal Tribune newspaper that she's setting a deadline of year's end for collecting preorders. If the pre-registrations are gathered, it will take three months for the state to produce the plates before the first ones will be seen on Maine motorcycles.

BIKERS ROUSTED AFTER SHOOT-ING SUE POLICE: Members of a motorcycle club claim their constitutional rights were violated when Arizona officers rousted them at gunpoint at a campsite where a man shot his wife and two others before killing himself at a 2011 bike rally near Flagstaff.

The Sons of Hell have filed a federal law-

suit last week against the Arizona Department of Public Safety and the Coconino County Sheriff's Office seeking monetary compensation. Its members claim officers were trying to collect information for a criminal street gang database, even though they knew club members weren't involved in the shooting.

However, the SAAQ says the premiums are needed in order to compensate victims involved in motorcycle accidents. The board adjusted insurance premiums after a review revealed a \$109 million deficit in 2006. While Mosca admits that motorcycles are higher-risk vehicles, he claims that "When there are accidents between cars and motorcycles, 94 or 95% of the time it's the car's fault, so the motorcyclist is being punished when he's not at fault."

Instead of increasing fees, Mosca suggests the SAAQ should do more to educate people about road safety, adding that it's time people change their minds about motorcycles. "Motorcycles consume less fuel, they cause less pollution, less damage to the roads, which is beneficial to the whole planet," he said.



On Friday my leg looked red and swollen



### **TECH TIPS** by Craig Griswold

**EZ Clutch Install** 

Whether you're a big city commuter or just find yourself riding in parades and processions, the "Popeye clutch" commonly found on earlier Harley-Davidson and other big twin models can make the ride challenging. Folks with smaller hands, guys like me with arthritis kicking in early, or just the comfort of not having to fight the damn thing; all good reasons to do this install.

One introduces a lever to the ball and ramp mechanism and is sold by several different aftermarket suppliers. There are application the Harley-Davidson kit in a future issue. tions for 2000-2012 Big Twin, 87-99 Big Twin, and 86-93 Sportsters.





The other is a kit that is a direct replacement of the ball and ramp mechanism and the diaphragm spring, sold through Harley-Davidson. Since the latter uses a reduced effort spring, it may not be suitable for higher horsepower applications. Where that threshold is defined is not known to us. From experience, we can say that stock engines There are two types of kits available. 80-96 cubic inches with mild performance upgrades did well. In this month's column, we'll discuss the lever style install and cover

> To install the lever style kit, follow your service manual on procedures for removing the clutch release cover.



Most models will require at least partial removal of the exhaust system. Once the side cover is off, installing the kit is a piece of cake. In a nutshell, you will be bolting

on a lever to the end of your clutch cable; a force multiplier of sorts.




The spacer included in the kit is installed on the threaded portion of the clutch cable and takes up some of the slack that is introduced from the extra travel. Without it, most cables will not have enough adjustment in the turnbuckle to compensate. A word of caution: This spacer will preclude a significant amount of thread engagement between the clutch cable and cover. Although the instructions do not call out for any modification, we remove about .100" of material from the spacer to get a few more threads exposed. This still gives us plenty of adjustment in the cable. Don't over tighten the

Re-install the clutch release cover and complete all adjustments in accordance with service literature. The advertised reduction in pull is 40%. I can tell you from experience the difference is nothing short of amazing!


