
The Legislature adjourned September 13 after sending Governor Brown over 900 bills for him to sign or veto. He signed 90% and vetoed 10% of them, in becoming the longest serving Governor in California history.

He passed Earl Warren who was elected to three consecutive terms as Governor of California, and was then appointed Chief Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court by President Dwight PAC meeting in Fresno on October

Governor's desk affected motorcyclists adversely. We were able to kill or hold negative bills in their policy committees. For example, Senator Beall's SB 350 that changes the current lane sharing conventions will/ may be heard in January when the Legislature returns.



I met and discussed with either the staff



Here are some possible one rider issues that could go bad: You are riding at a fast pace on the freeway in heavy traffic and your throttle cable busts, you are in the fast lane and there is no shoulder to your left side and now you have to maneuver across three lanes to get out of the way of speeding car drivers that don't know your situation. Scary thought! How about this, you're cruising on the same freeway and you lose all power, under your seat a positive wire grounded out killing all electrical life in your bike. You are going down like a plane with no wings. Have you ever been out in the middle of nowhere and your belt snapped?

Simple things like this happen all the time: Have you ever blown your bikes' fork seals? One of your brakes locks up? Here's a good one, a major part on your bike gets loose (multiple bolts loosen up) either engine or drive train and you spew oil and are smoking like a diesel with bad fuel! These things happen all the time! I have been a part of this as either the one or with someone who has. It's just the reality of riding; sometimes it's really unforgiving especially when a rider gets hurt or killed.

This is why when I do a major detailing of my bike I make sure all the nuts and bolts and screw's and cables and gas lines, brake lines, electrical wires etc. are up to factory specs or my own specs. It takes time to do this and for me it's a two day affair or longer, it depends on how far I want to go. It is worth it to me because any type of mechanical failure can kill your trip or you!

After I have finished with the main frame of my bike I go thru all the electrical wires to include all of the lights on my bike, I count on all my lights working, and it's a good thing to be highly visible in daylight as well as night.

Stay the course and hopefully we will see good results.


