Lobbyist's Report



The Legislature has returned from the November Elections with 55 Democrats to 25 Republicans in the Assembly and 29 Democrats to 11 Republicans in the Senate. The Assembly re-elected John Perez as its Speaker, and the Senate re-elected Daryl Steinberg as its President pro Tempore. Both houses have the number of votes to override a veto by Governor Brown, but that remains to be seen if they try.

For the first time in the past 5 years the state is **ONLY** a few Billion \$ short of its Budget versus the \$20 to 25 billion short in the past few years. Many programs have been cut, and many Democrat members have expressed interest in restoring funds to OF DEFENSE THIS YEAR! many of their favorite programs that were members to stay the course and keep spendthe recession.

What and how does that affect us as motorcyclists? It means the Legislature may finally focus on programs such as our streets and roads to make them safer, we hope, pear. 



As you will recall, right after Assemblyman Paul Cook passed AB 1595 - the SxS bill that mandates helmets and outlaws aftermarket parts - ABATE's lobbyist stated that it would take about \$10,000 to get a repeal or modification bill through the assembly and to the governor before the recess. Well that deadline came and went, but our lobbyist, Jim Lombardo, still wanted to try and help because he has years of both off-road and on-road motorcycle legislative experience, and he has numerous contacts in Sacramento. He has agreed to write a repeal bill (which he has

done) and submit it in time for the next legislative session in January of 2013. He is doing this with no money up front and said that IF we can get our off-road division off the ground and attract new members, he will present us with a discounted bill to be taken out of the new members' dues from the off-road division! This will ensure that the off-road division will pay for this in its entirety and no money will come from the on-road side of ABATE! This is an unprecedented offer and should not be taken lightly. This will give off-roaders a chance to have a full time lobbyist looking out for THEIR concerns,

not the manufacturer's concerns! As ABATE already has a political machine in place, this is a win/win option for off-roaders

everywhere!

If we don't get enough new members by July 1, 2013 when all of AB 1595 provisions kick in, we will simply shut down our off-road division and keep working on-road issues only. CURRENT ISSUES FOR OFF-ROADERS

AB 1595: Requires all drivers and passengers in ROHVs (Rhinos, Razors, etc.), regardless of age to wear helmets.

(Effective January 1, 2013)
Requires factory installed passenger seats. Aftermarket passenger seats will be illegal whether or not they were

professionally installed. (Effective July 1, 2013)

Requires factory installed roll cages. Aftermarket roll cages will be illegal even if professionally built and installed. (Effective July 1, 2013)

Requires drivers to be 16 years old unless accompanied by an adult. (Effective January 1, 2013)

Requires factory installed seat belts and shoulder straps. No aftermarket belts or straps. (Effective July 1, 2013)

UPCOMING ISSUES FOR OFF-ROADERS

ATV opponents ask federal safety agency to require seatbelts and roll cages: The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission asked the public to comment on ATV safety following its ATV Safety Summit held on October 11 and 12, 2012 in Bethesda, Maryland and opponents of ATVs responded in force. Most of the comments were from people and organizations demanding that children be banned from operating ATVs and other drastic measures be taken to make ATVs "safer".

These measures included mandatory roll cages, speed limiters, inter-lock systems so that an ATV cannot be operated if a person had consumed alcohol and a ban on aftermarket accessories such as rear rack bags. They also want smaller seats.

CONGRESS GIVES TAX BREAK TO ELECTRIC MOTORCYCLE BUY-**ERS:** Tax hikes and spending cuts dominated holiday headlines as the federal gov-

ernment teetered on the edge of the Fiscal Cliff, but the legislative package passed on New Year's Day to resolve the issue, dubbed

the American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012, included several tax credit extensions that didn't generate as much media interest – in-

cluding one for electric motorcycles.

Oregon Senator Ron Wyden (D) sponsored the amendment extending the EV tax credit, which covers 10% of the cost of a qualified electric vehicle, up to \$2,500. Vehicles must be a two- or three-wheeled

plug-in electric designed "primarily for use on public streets, roads, and highways" and "capable of achieving a speed of 45 miles per hour or greater."

Electric-powered two wheelers have been the end of 2011, when the original tax break expired that was part of the \$800 billion stimulus package passed in 2009.

A coalition of EV motorcycle companies, through Plug-In America, lobbied Congress to extend the tax credits, which are also retor EV chargers purchased in 2012 as well.

The EPA's response was to require a minimum four gallon purchase, the misguided rationale being that it would dilute any residual E15 remaining in a gas pump's lines. Again, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency came under fire, with powersports and automotive groups pushing back against

the federal agency's push for the grain alcohol-blended biofuel. Apparently realizing that a viable solution to the problem needs to be conceived, the EPA is abandoning its four-gallon minimum on blender pumps that dispense both E10 and E15 from the same pump, and instead the government body says it will likely require gas stations to label shared pumps, as well as offer a dedicated E10 pump/hose for non-approved vehicles.

In the meantime, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia has denied a rehearing on the EPA decision to put E15 on the market. premises," Chief Commissioner Ken Lay has vowed to ban bikers from pubs and clubs across Victoria. "The legislation is designed to ensure that doesn't occur," he told the Herald Sun newspaper of his plan to move "bikies" out of venue ownership, operation and security. Earlier this year, police swooped on bikies


in a series of raids and seized 120 guns after ruling them not fit people to have the weapons under the Firearms Act. Meanwhile, police are telling licensees

not to allow patched-up bikies entry, so some Melbourne strip clubs, bars and nightclubs are refusing entry based on a "dress code standard," and some have even banned motorcycles from parking outside.

Inspector Paul Ross, of licensing enforcement, said police "advised" licensees "it's probably better if they don't allow outlaw motorcycle gang members inside ... wearing

One operator, who is enforcing the ban, said police asked him and others to sign an agreement that the dress code standard relating to bikies was upheld.

Pour the requisite amount of fluid into the primary through the derby cover opening. Most models will require a full quart, some will need more. Check your service manual for the capacity. It is important to not overfill. This will saturate the clutch plates and cause them to stick. Known as "clutch drag" this can cause hard shifting and make finding neutral difficult. Regardless of stated capacity, the fluid level should be at the bottom of the diaphragm spring.



Install the derby cover using a new o-ring or gasket and torque to specification. Pre-Twin-Cam models have a 3 bolt pattern and the holes are open to the oil side so sealing washers should be used. The later 5 bolt covers have blind threads and do not need the sealing washers. Don't forget the blue (medium strength) thread locker.

Ride safe!







Our Toy Run this year was for the benefit of the Valley Children's Hospital.



we get to keep going forward.























