

However, ABATE is run like a clean machine and there are very few expenses to be cut. I also think just cutting expenses is the lazy way to try to fix a problem.

WE NEED INCOME! To raise income people have to get off their butts and do something. People have to think. People have to ACT. If the hours devoted by folks reading and writing on the 'discussion line' were devoted to fund raising for ABATE, we would be a prosperous and a more effective organization.



Chairman's Report by Sarge Matthews

Economy Sucks

Are we going to be able to survive? We are trying to do what we can and we already know we can not please all the people all the time, so we are trying to have all the people (ABATE of California) survive during this fiscal crisis. This year our income is down a minimum of approximately \$30,000. So what can we do to help our organization keep the doors open?

Let's see, no money from a bike raffle, no money from the Southern Regional Rally, no money from Northern Regional Rally and some Locals donations are down. So what do we do? Stop mailing the Bailing Wire to our members and make it available on line for people to go to our website (another story, we hope to work out all the kinks by Jan 2010) and open it in a PDF file or the best method to do that.

We will continue to ship/mail/UPS boxes to our Presidents and to our businesses that currently get them; that way members that are unable to access the internet will still have a couple of methods to receive and have a hard copy available for them. Those that **absolutely** cannot get one any other way, the office will look at it on a case-by-case basis. Do we have a solution for that yet? Not that I am aware of, but we do have approximately 4 months to work that one out also. One solution *might* be to have those that want one mailed to pay approximately \$1.25 per issue to be sent first class mail as we will no longer do bulk mailings for the Bailing Wire.

These few simple steps will save us approximately \$13,000 a year, \$900 a month on mailings, savings of approximately \$2-3,000 more on printing and folding. We would be able to drop our printing down approximately 22-

2300 pieces a month. Was this an easy decision? No, not by any means! The Board of Directors discussed and discussed this very issue over an extended period of time.

One way the Locals can save money is to have someone sponsor the cost of their flyers. For example, Aid to Injured Motorcyclist - put their logo on the bottom of your flyers and they will pay UP TO \$250 for printing cost thus saving the Locals some money on printing and then maybe they can make a little more and donate more to the state office and one of our various funds. Hell, put on your flyer's printed by "ABC muffler shop" if they want to pay for that. But think of it this way, one club in Tennessee put on four runs + was reimbursed to the tune of \$850.00 for their 4 runs. Lets see, we have approximately 45-50 Locals, if each does 1 run (most do more) at say a savings of \$100.00 each, that would generate approximately another \$5,000.00, but lots more could be available. See the flyer on the flyer program in this issue, you don't need to use him, but he will pay for the privilege to advertise on your flyers. We need to think out of the box.

NOW the next question is: HOW DO WE GENERATE MORE MONEY/FUNDS? Attend the ABATE STATE RUN this September 18-20. Attend more ABATE runs, then other types of runs. Charity should begin at home (ABATE of California). Please pass on your ideas that might/may generate money to help ABATE, help us think out of the box, plus it should be something the majority of the Locals can get behind and support.

Hope to see you all at the next Board meeting (October 10) in San Jose. Until then, take many safe rides, be careful out there and hopefully, we all will weather this storm and come out OK.

In an ongoing effort to support and promote the activities of NCOM member organization and/or Confederation of Clubs member groups and affiliates, the Aid To Injured Motorcyclists program is offering to pay for the printing of run flyers whenever the small ad strip below Is incorporated Into the flyer. In return we ask that an AIM display box with free stickers, magnets, and info cards be prominently displayed at the front registration table at the event.

We at AIM/NCOM realize that one of the most costly aspects of putting on a run or rally is the printing of the flyers. ABATE is not just about helmet laws - ABATE is all about individual integrity, dignity, and freedom; the right to be left alone to make your own good or bad decisions regarding your own health and safety. The compulsory helmet laws are clear and convincing evidence of the disdain our elected "servants" hold for our capacity for self-determination. Safety laws can, in themselves, lead to injury: I was riding bareheaded in non-helmet Montana, and was thrown off of a bike during a high-speed wobble. The added weight of a helmet under those circumstances would have likely broken my neck. We should have the right to make personal decisions, as well as to take the responsibility to live with the outcomes.

Do your part to defend not just your right to make your own helmet decisions, but your right to make your own personal decisions in all areas of your life. Ride Tall, Longrider Mike.

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COAST TO COAST BIKER NEWS

MULTI-FACETED MOTORCYCLE BILL ENACTED IN TEXAS: Senate Bill 1967, authored by Texas State Senator John Carona (R-Dallas) and sponsored by Representative Norma "Da'Lady" Chavez (D-El Paso), introduces many motorcycle-related changes in the Lone Star State. Included in the bill are:



1) Funding by Texas Department of Transportation for a public awareness campaign to promote motorcyclist safety and the concept of sharing the road with motorcyclists.

2) Changes to the definition of a motorcycle to include certain enclosed three-wheeled passenger vehicles.

3) Changes to the licensing requirements for enclosed three-wheeled passenger vehicles.

4) A requirement for all applicants for a motorcycle license or endorsement on a regular or commercial driver's license to provide proof of successful completion of a basic motorcycle operator training course.

5) Penalties for failure to yield the right-ofway violations resulting in bodily injury range from \$500 to \$2,000 while those resulting in serious bodily injury range from \$1,000 to \$4,000.

6) A prohibition against stopping or detaining a motorcycle operator or passenger solely to determine whether the person has successfully completed a motorcycle operator training and safety course or is covered by a health insurance plan.

7) A requirement for the Department of Transportation to develop a standard of proof of health insurance coverage for adult motorcycle operators and passengers.

8) A requirement that all driver education motorcyclists.

MISSOURI RIDERS SEEING RED:

For most drivers red means stop. But if you're riding a motorcycle or a bicycle in Missouri, it will soon mean stop, but only sort of. A new Missouri law that takes effect August 28 allows motorcycle and bike riders to run red lights, but only if they stop first and the signal remains red for an "unreasonable time."

Missouri will join a growing number of states that have enacted similar laws, which are intended to address occasions when motorcycles or bikes aren't detected by traffic signal sensors in the road. Many traffic signals are triggered by a magnetic reaction coupled with wires embedded in the pavement. The wires are sized in such a way that they are more likely to be tripped by a car or truck, but some motorcycles and bikes tend not to trip the signal because they have less mass and are made with parts that aren't attracted to a magnet.

In cities with intersections patrolled by red-light cameras, when a picture is taken of a red-light runner, police should be able to apply the law by looking at video of the possible violation, and if a rider does get a ticket the new law will provide a defense.

Missouri is the eighth state to pass this kind of law since 2002, and three other states considered similar legislation this year.

Upstate New York has earned a reputation as the speeding ticket capital of the country, but even with overeager state troopers patrolling the highways, motorcyclists feel singled out by law enforcement. > For nearly two years now, the New York State Police (NYSP) have been conducting highway roadblocks diverting only motorcyclists from the state's roadways to perform "safety checks". According to ABATE of New York, "Since motorcycles operated in New York are already required to pass annual safety inspections, the current NYSP initiative continues to serve only to harass, intimidate and inconvenience motorcyclists traveling upon the state's roadways. Further, motorcycle-only roadblocks of this nature are a discriminatory and unconstitutional infringement upon an individual's right to travel without interference, and an abuse of discretionary power as acknowledged by the New York State Court of Appeals."

Proner told Autoblog.com that he is filing the federal class action suit at the Federal Court for the Northern District of New York on behalf of his fellow riders. ABATE of New York has pledged support of the class-action initiative brought on behalf of the National Coalition of Motorcyclists (NCOM).

CITIES MUFFLE MOTORCYCLE

NOISE: Many state legislatures and city councils are making lots of noise about motorcycles, with new ordinances popping up across the country to silence loud exhausts. "Loud Pipes Save Lives" has been a biker mantra for years, but politicians spurred by citizen complaints have discovered new ways to muffle unwanted exhaust tones.

Ordinance now reads: "It shall be unlawful in the Downtown Quiet Zone by operating a vehicle in a manner that willfully creates excessive engine noise because of revving the engine to magnify the engine noise."

Bikers blasting through East Greenwich, Rhode Island may want to steer clear of town if their exhaust systems aren't the proper match for their bikes. The Town Council unanimously passed an emergency ordinance in late July allowing the police to pull over and levy fines on bikers if the noise-rating data stamped into the chrome of their exhaust doesn't match the label on the bike frame. Modified exhaust systems are outlawed.

The ordinance, now in effect, provides for fines \$500 for the first offense, and jumps to \$700 the second time and \$1,000 for the third and each subsequent violation. Buddy Cardoso, president of the Rhode Island Motorcycle Association, who said his group supports courteous riding, inquired that if the labels have to match, "What do you do, throw away the motorcycle if the exhaust wears out?" Owners of other vehicles are allowed to use after-market exhaust systems, and it is unfair to single out bikers, he said.

In West Virginia, the Charleston City Council let it be known loud and clear that nuisance noise will not be tolerated, and unanimously passed an ordinance on August 17 to crack down on loud music, barking dogs and revving of car and motorcycle engines in residential areas, with fines up to \$250.

In an attempt to silence community concerns regarding excessive motorcycle exhaust sound, the Boston City Council fast-tracked enactment of Docket 0658 on June 3, 2009. The new ordinance mandates that all onhighway motorcycles built after December 31, 1982 must have either OEM (original equipment manufacturer) or aftermarket exhaust systems that comply with the US EPA labeling provision in the Code of Federal Regulations. Violations will result in a \$300 fine.

Earlier this year in California a bill was held over that would have required periodic emissions testing for 2000 and newer on-road motorcycles in an effort to make aftermarket exhaust systems illegal if they do not comply with EPA labeling.



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ABATE of California Board of Directors Elections "High Jacked from" the Policy & Procedures Manual

<u>MEMBERSHIP RIGHTS</u> - The membership is the highest authority of ABATE and shall be empowered to take or direct any action consistent with the bylaws of the organization. The specific rights of a member in good standing (membership dues are current) are:

a) To nominate and vote on ABATE Local representatives.

b) To nominate and vote for the State Board of Directors of ABATE of California.

ABATE membership information shall only be used for authorized ABATE business, and shall not be used for any personal purpose. No member shall be personally liable for debts or obligations of the organization.

<u>BOARD OF DIRECTORS</u> - The overall management of the organization will be the responsibility of the Board of Directors:

- a) The authorized number of directors shall be eleven (11).
- b) Directors will be elected by the general membership each December for a term of two years to commence at the first Board of Directors Meeting of the year following the elections. Six Board members shall be elected for a two-year term on even election years, and five Board members shall be elected for a two-year term on odd election years.

So with the above in mind ... it's an Even Year coming up for Electing 6 Board Members ... and Nominations are now open. Your nominee must be a current Member of ABATE of California and should be a Member for at least one year. 

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

As Seen By Bill Bish, National **Coalition of Motorcyclists**

About 30 years ago, bikers got tired of being told by a bunch of bureaucrats and politicians who'd never thrown a leg over a motorcycle what they HAD TO WEAR, how they HAD TO RIDE, and what our BIKES HAD TO BE BUILT LIKE!!

Over the years, motorcyclists organized themselves into a viable political force and evolved into one of the few TRUE grass roots movements in the country. Others may share an avocation, profession or recreation. but they don't share the passion. They don't have the kind of *passion* it takes to support organizations that can protect their rights. They don't have the kind of *passion* it takes to volunteer time and money to protect their own rights. And they don't have the kind of *passion* it takes to confront a legislative body and say, "*LEAVE US ALONE*!!"

And that's largely what the bikers rights movement is all about ... just leave us alone. Whether it's helmets, leg protectors, safety equipment, let US make the choices regarding our own personal safety and protection. LET THOSE WHO RIDE DECIDE!

Our organizational leaders and political activists don't have a financial stake in motorcycle legislation. We're not asking for any special privileges or exemptions, tax relief or bailouts. The only thing at stake is our passion for riding. When our grass roots, VOLUNTEER lobbyists speak to legislators about our issues, they're talking from the heart, not from the wallet.

Our movement consists of a diverse bunch of people, most of us staunch individualists, but with one common denominator and a common goal Freedom of the Road.

As influential as our lobby has become our nationwide biker rights movement didn't come easy and it didn't happen overnight The kind of camaraderie that brought the first two motorcycle riders together to share a ride down a country lane is the same kind of camaraderie that formed our early motorcycle clubs and associations and, eventually, our motorcycle rights organizations.
