FEDERAL HIGHWAY SAFETY GRANTS IN JEOPARDY: Despite a spike in traffic fatalities, states could lose as much as \$120 million in highway safety grants if Congress doesn't change a planned bill to fund the government's operations for six months. Congress passed a new highway bill this year that streamlines the federal grant process that provides state funds for alcohol-impaired and distracted driving prevention, increased occupant protection, motorcycle safety, teen driving safety and data collection. Under the typical rules for a continuing resolution, new programs such as those authorized under the highway bill cannot be

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration recently reported that its estimate of all traffic deaths for the first quarter of 2012 show a 13.5% increase to the highest number since 2008. The substantial increase is the second-largest quarterly jump in traffic deaths since NHTSA began tracking deaths on a quarterly basis in 1975 -- and the biggest since 1979.

NHTSA reported the rate of traffic deaths per be released at a later date. 100 million miles of vehicle travel increased significantly to 1.1 fatalities per 100 million miles year to their lowest number since 1949.

DEPUTY SUSPENDED FOR SEIZING **BIKER'S CAMERA:** The Dallas County Sheriff's office issued a 30-day suspension without pay to a deputy after footage showed him seizing a helmetmounted camera from a motorcyclist as potential evidence of alleged crimes committed by other unidentified riders.

A video viewed nearly 500,000 times on You-Tube shows the Texas deputy on camera issuing this comment to the biker: "The reason you're being pulled over is because I'm gonna take your camera and we're gonna use it as evidence of in the crimes that have been committed by other bikers."

Our legal experts at AIM/NCOM (Aid to Injured Motorcyclists/National Coalition of Motorcyclists) agree that the officer's rationale does not constitute probable cause to make a traffic stop and does not justify seizing the camera, nor is it illegal to wear a camera on a helmet.

The sheriff's deputy eventually arrested the motorcycle rider and according to the Examiner newspaper he then tried to slam the door of the patrol car on the biker's leg before hauling him off to jail. The biker was finally released and issued a ticket for only an obstructed license plate.

The officer was also disciplined for leaving a drunk driver at the jail without booking him before going out on the call relating to motorcyclists riding on I-35.

LONE STAR COURT RULES ON CELL-PHONE SEARCHES: Suds, Texas Commander of the U.S. Defenders/COIR Division, issued the following notice re: Texas Court of Appeals Opinion on Cellphone Searches --

The Court rules in favor of the people. The opinion cited a case where an individual was arrested on one charge, and based on hearsay, an investigating detective went to the property room of the jail and retrieved the individual's cellphone and scrolled through the photos he had stored on it. Originally arrested for disorderly conduct, the defendant now had to face an indictment of improper photography or visual recording.

Prosecutors argued that a jailed individual had no rights to expectation of privacy. The Texas Court of Appeals disagreed and stated that while an inmate has no reasonable expectation of privacy in his cell, his/her stored property does fall than the 900. It was decided then that the study not that individual seeks to enter the United States under reasonable expectation of privacy. It is not as though the officer saw the pictures scrolling on the display screen, rather the phone had to be turned on and the photos accessed and scrolled through. While this may not stop a rogue officer from scrolling through your cellphone, anything found will not be admissible in court without a







The following information is from the CA DMV:

The Importance of Identity Protection and the DMV's Role

Identity theft is one of the fastest growing crimes in the United States. Identity thieves can gain access to a wide variety of personal information by hacking computers, stealing mail and wallets, and resorting to other scams to trick people. Once these thieves get hold of your personal information, accessing your banking and credit card information will be a breeze. Some thieves may go as far as applying for a driver license (DL) and identification card (ID) under your name. Be sure to follow these steps to keep your information private and to prevent thieves from being issued a fraudulent DL or ID: 1) Store your personal information in a secure place. 2) Shred mail that may contain personal information before throwing it away. 3) Make sure passwords are strong passwords that cannot be easily guessed and keep them in a secure location. 4) Do not carry your social security card in your wallet. 5) Only carry one credit card at a time in case your wallet is stolen. 6) Limit the number of pre-approved credit offers you receive by calling 888-567-8688 toll free to opt out of prescreened credit and insurance offers.

Notifying the DMV: To help keep your identity secure, the DMV is doing its part to ensure your personal information remains private. In field offices throughout California, DMV employees are continuously being trained to detect the possible use of any fraudulent documents to ensure the safe keeping of people's identities. If you are a victim of identity theft, notify the DMV immediately by calling 1-866-658-5758, or emailing dlfraud@

dmv.ca.gov, so the DMV is aware that your DL or ID has been stolen. If your ID or DL is stolen, you must schedule an appointment at your local DMV field office to initiate the replacement process. Be sure to schedule your appointment online for faster service. The process will be different from renewing your DL or ID and will involve additional steps to confirm your identity.

At the appointment, you may be asked to provide a statement describing the details of the identity theft. If you filed a police report, make sure to bring a copy with you. If a report was not filed, you may be asked to explain why. You should also bring copies of canceled checks and bills, to confirm your identity, as well as letters from companies or banks indicating the fraud. Confirming your identity is necessary to prove that you have in fact been a victim of identity theft and these documents will help you do so. To prevent thieves for applying for a DL or ID under your name the DMV needs to take extensive steps to confirm your identity to ensure that a DL or ID is being issued to the correct person.

In addition, you will need to prove and validate your identity with additional, official documentation. With the exception of an expired California DL or ID card, only valid, unexpired documents are accepted. Here is a partial list of acceptable original documents that can be used to prove your identity: California DL or ID card, U.S. Birth Certificate, U.S. Passport, U.S. Certificate of Birth Abroad or Report of Birth Abroad, Certification of Citizenship, Certification of Naturalization, Permanent Resident Card, U.S. Military Identification Cards, and/or unexpired foreign passport with a valid I-94 form.

Other forms of identification may be acceptable, but is determined on a case by case basis. Contact your local DMV for other acceptable documents.

Additional Steps: Along with notifying the DMV of the fraud, you should also file a police report and contact all creditors and the three major credit bureaus (Experian, Equifax, and TransUnion). Keep a copy of the police report and a log of all conversations related to your identity fraud case so that you have a record to refer to. The more details you have, the better; dates, names of people you talked to, telephone numbers of the agencies you called, the time you spent on each conversation, and expenses incurred, are all things that should be noted.

Follow-up on important conversations in writing and send them by certified mail and request a return receipt. You want to document everything so that you can prove that you are a victim of fraud.


EFI Performance (Part II)

In our last column, we discussed EFI performance in terms of upgrades. Specifically, we identified the two basic types of performance modules. One type allows tuning of the fuel and ignition curves, while the other fuel only. In either application, both have evolved along with the changing fuel injection systems. In 1995, The Motor Company offered Electronic Fuel Injection (EFI) as an open-loop systems, which operate on a fixed (pre-temps and detonation. programmed) map.
