# Motorcycle Safety Report can be dangerous if not properly addressed,

#### Riding in Hot Weather - Heat Exhaustion & Heat Stroke

Have you ever been riding in hot weather and started to feel lightheaded, a little faint, or maybe tired and or weak all of a sudden? How about getting a headache or hallucinating as well? If so, any of these conditions could lead you into making a life threatening decision for you and or a friend! Riding in hot weather (90+ degrees) can be a challenge to your body without you knowing it.

stroke! Depending on the severity it could ing in hot weather is a big deal to me. lead to organ damage and possible death, you are in a desert, jungle, mountains or in your backyard! It doesn't matter if you're walking, jogging, doing yard work, working out doors or even riding your bike, you could be in the shade or on a hot tin roof, and Heat Exhaustion can and does happen, real

quick if you're not paying attention to your body. Heat waves result in more deaths in lightning, and earthquakes combined.

Exhaustion and Heat Stroke symptoms: Headache, nausea, muscle cramps, profuse sweating, dizziness, confusion, exhaustion, dry skin and hallucinations. you could be riding and not notice any sweat on your arms or head, but you have to think about evaporation as you ride, (remember dry skin) you could be blow drying yourself at any speed, and this is very misleading to your brain because other symptoms may happen in due time when you think it's all right, that is for now. Wearing shorts, no helmet, or no shirt will not make you any cooler than if you were fully dressed. In fact it's better if you knew you were sweating than not knowing, i.e. you sweat because your body is trying to cool down and now you know it. At this point you can make a decision to prevent Heat Exhaustion or Heat Stroke. 

REQUIRED FOR MOTORCYCLES: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has dropped its requirement that Phoenix-area motorcycles undergo annual emissions inspections, the last place in the country to require such testing. The federal agency has approved a request from state environmental officials in Arizona that motorcycle tests be discontinued, effective immediately.

requiring the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality to do an analysis of pollutants emitted by motorcycles and make a proposal to the federal agency. "Our analysis has determined that the cost and inconvenience is not providing a significant environmental benefit," said Trevor Baggiore, deputy director of air quality at ADEQ.

3.5% of vehicles on the area's roads, the department's analysis determined that they emit "insignificant" amounts of pollution, accounting for less than 1% of total emissions in the Phoenix metro area.


Even though motorcycles account for

Pima County (Tucson) and Maricopa County (Phoenix) were the only areas in the United States that required motorcycles to pass yearly emissions inspections at a cost of \$19 per test, and Pima County halted motorcycle testing in 2007.

Congratulations to ABATE of Arizona, the MMA of Arizona and the Arizona Confederation of Motorcycle Clubs (ACMC) for their years of stalwart efforts to relieve Grand Canyon State riders of these unnecessary costs and burdensome time wasted in long lines.

ANTI-ABORTION MEASURE RIDES MOTORCYCLE BILL THROUGH N.C. HOUSE: In controversial political maneuvering, the Republican-controlled North Carolina House recently pushed through anti-abortion legislation, using as their vehicle a motorcycle safety bill that lawmakers had stealthily gutted and turned into a measure to further regulate abortion clinics.

(S.B. 353) in the House Judiciary Committee the previous morning by attaching the abortion provisions to a motorcycle safety bill -- without first notifying either the public or their Democratic colleagues. "This bill came hurriedly through the Senate, rerouted through the House on a motorcycle,"

**GUAM ENACTS "LIMITED HELMET** 

all motorcycle riders in the U.S. protectorate of Guam, but the revised version of his proposed helmet law makes it mandatory only for riders under the age of 18 and for those with less than 3 years riding experience.

After a lengthy public hearing and receiving input from the community, Bill No. 87 "Limited Helmet Law" passed unanimously, and also requires new riders to first complete a defensive driving/motorcycle safety education course prior to being licensed and prohibits licensees from operating a motorcycle or scooter of larger engine size than that which they take the motorcycle exam on. In order to operate a motorcycle with a larger engine, the operator must apply and test for a new license under that engine size.

AMENDED HELMET LAW HAS POSI-Republicans introduced the legislation TIVE ECONOMIC BENEFIT IN MICHI-GAN: Changes last year in Michigan's mandatory helmet law have had a positive effect on motorcycle riding in Michigan, according to ABATE of Michigan. There has been an increase in motorcycle travel in Michigan since April of 2012, said ABATE in a recent press release.

MOTORCYCLE CHECKPOINTS IN NEW YORK NET NEARLY A HUN-DRED TICKETS: More than 80 motorcyclists and their vehicles were checked by specially-trained State Police motorcycle inspectors near Buffalo, NY in mid-June, with two checkpoints resulting in the issu-

ance of 92 traffic tickets for offenses that included helmet and equipment violations. New York has been the epicenter for the Motorcycle-Only Checkpoint debate, which has resulted in four states; New Hampshire, North Carolina, Virginia and California, passing laws to prohibit law enforcement agencies from establishing motorcycle-only checkpoints.

In addition, on the federal level Congressman Jim Sensenbrenner (R-WI) has introduced H.R. 1861 "To stop motorcycle checkpoint funding," and also contains language "to force the DOT to focus motorcycle safety efforts on crash prevention programs, not national helmet mandates."

what all the mumbo jumbo is under the oc tane number. It is the formula that was used to calculate the octane rating, which by the way, is not a true octane number. It is what is called an "antiknock index" number (AKI) This number is the average of two octano numbers arrived at by two different kinds o tests. One is called ASTM Research Method and is often abbreviated R or RON. The oth er is the ASTM Motor Method, M or MON The antiknock index number on the pump is then this average, or R + M divided by 2 = AKI. A rule of thumb is that the Motor Method octane number (MON) is approxi mately five points less than the AKI. That's a fun fact, but gets us down in the weeds quite a bit.

To round off the topic, we should discuss what additives are used to set the octano level of a given fuel. Lead was the major ingredient from the early 20's up until the late 90's. It also served double duty as a valve wear preventative. Due to health and environmental concerns, it was phased out Valves and seats were redesigned with hard er materials. Additives to replace lead such as MTBE, ETBE, and Ethanol were introduced.

In conclusion, running race fuel in you stock Harley is wasting money. You're stil not going to outrun that Hayabusa. If you're not sure which is best, check to see what the manufacturer of your bike recommends of just run 91 in the tank and play it safe!
