In Memory of GILL MELLEN 8/16/1942 – 10/28/2020


I have had the pleasure of knowing, riding and working politically on bikers' rights and issues with Gill Mellen for several decades. For those who have met him, he needs no introduction. For the less informed, Gill was a tenacious, patriotic, fully committed freedom fighter that lived to make the biker lifestyle and community a primary concern and strove to preserve, protect and inform as best as he could.

Gill was born, Gilbert Ronald Mellen, in Lowell, Massachusetts, August 16, 1942. His sister 'Lola' recalls Gill having an early interest in Motorcycles and engines as his father, an AMA member, built bikes in the cellar of their home. Gill went on to marry and have two daughters, Beverly and Tammy, then entered into military service. His love for engines and machinery continued in the service where he was part of the 70th Engineer Battalion. As well as qualifying as an expert rifleman and marksman in the carbine, he operated bulldozer and construction machinery and also got his drivers and mechanics badges which helped him later become driver/bodyguard for General Katzenback, followed eventually by an honorable discharge from the Military. After his military service and a divorce, Gill ended up in California where he worked as a marine mechanic in the local harbors and got heavily involved in the motorcycle community and ABATE of California.

ABATE of California and Gill became synonymous of each other. It was the norm to see Gill standing proudly at a political function dressed in his ABATE attire, shaking hands with legislators and anyone who would lend an ear, educating them of our plight or talking of the biker topic of the day.

A 22-year member of ABATE, Local 20 President, State PR Officer and on the State Board of Directors Gill started in earnest with then Local 20 President, Basil Haliburda. Under the wing of this President, patch holder and freedom fighter, Gill was introduced to both the local patched club members and the local and State legislators. He took root and grew!

Basil also introduced Gill to the Totally Kids Rehabilitation Hospital run, ONE MORE FOR THE HEART, which he annually supported



along with his Bike Night friends including Doreen, myself and many others. We would lead a pack of bikes each year along with toys, gifts and financial donations to help the efforts of this great hospital and staff.

Gill was always spearheading charitable events and local political gatherings representing the voice of the biker under the cloak of ABATE. He was a familiar face and voice at the Southern California Confederation of Clubs monthly meetings, informing the Biker Club community of ABATE information and involvement in legislative agendas.

Gill was also a 35-year member of the American Legion Post 0291, supported the Military and did all he could for the Veterans and Veterans organizations, notably Prop 41.

His often brash, non-PC demeanor, was very much a part of his straight shooting, say what you mean, character. Gill could always be relied upon to muster up a Call to Action or stir up support in the legislative arena, meet newly elected politicians and question their stance on biker issues. Although he ruffled a few feathers, he was a much loved and respected, hard-working, dedicated freedom fighter in our community and will be sorely missed by many. I know his wish was to build up ABATE, sign up every biker and continue protecting our freedom and biker lifestyle.

All you up and coming freedom fighters please take a page out of Gill's book and help support and fight the good fight.

We will miss you Gill. Ride free forever.




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What is ABATE?




Membership Report

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Lobbyist Fund

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California has always allowed valid "out of state" OHV registered vehicles to use our public lands. It has come to our attention that some of our neighboring states have recently implemented a "non-resident" fee for OHV's being operated in their state. By no longer honoring our California registration these states are reneging on a long standing tradition in the OHV community. These new regulations will be expensive and prove onerous to every legally licensed OHV owner that travels and recreates in other states. Our ABATE OHV Division is asking for your help and financial support in fighting this type of legislation. Assembly Bill 2761 sponsored by Assemblyman Gallagher (Republican-Yuba City) seeks to remedy this issue of reciprocity and ABATE of California is asking you to help the OHV communities of our states restore equal access to OHV areas for all legally licensed users.

In addition to AB 2761, Abate of California is proposing two other bills for our elected official's to consider this year. Our first bill would require DMV to allow rider's to take both the M/C skill's test and their DMV written exam during their CHP certified M/C training classes. After a rider successfully completes and passes both tests: the school would submit the information to DMV and they would issue a valid M/C endorsement card by mail to the rider that is valid for the duration of their current California drivers license. Upon license renewal the M/C endorsement would then be added to their new license thereby saving the student the time and expense associated with visiting and testing at their local DMV office.

Our second bill would seek to exempt all M/C riders and especially our Military Veteran riders from being accessed a toll fee when traveling on a toll road within the state of California.


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Nomination of Jane Warthen Local 2 for 2020 Freedom Fighter of the Year by Sporty Milligan

The 2020 Elections ARE OVER! So much for the "Blue Democrat Wave" in the United States. While President Trump lost the White House, it appears the US Senate will stay under Republican control with either 52 or 51 Republicans. Perhaps even a tie vote will happen here and there on the floor, which would make California's former US Senator the Tie Breaking Vote as Vice-President. The Democrats lost over 20 seats in Congress with many Republicans winning back seats in California!

In our State Senate, Republicans lost two seats and our HQ home office Senator Wilk is hanging onto a slim 200 vote lead as this article went to print. On the Assembly side it remains at 60 Democrats, 19 Republicans and one independent, Chad Mayes, formally the Assembly Republican leader. Our Home office will be Represented by Thurston "Smitty' Smith, who we endorsed, as Jay Obernolte won his Congressional seat.

The Legislature will meet for one day in December to Elect the Speaker of the Assembly and the Senate Pro Temp. Its expected Anthony Rendon and Toni Atkins will be reelected to lead their respected Houses. They will then recess until the first week in January 2021 for the start of the Two-year session!

As your Lobbyist, we have been taking meetings all fall and scheduled upcoming meetings to get your Voices heard with the newly elected members. The deadline for introducing Legislation is tentatively scheduled for the 3rd week in January with the next deadline not coming until late February. So PLEASE, if you have any ideas for NEW LEGISLATION send them in to be considered for our January Board of Directors and PAC meetings!

As we all know, Governor Newson has proposed eliminating gasoline Vehicles by the year 2035. We will see what legislation is introduced next year and if Motorcycles will be a part of the proposals. Many more bills to follow...STAY TUNED!

A special praise for Mark Loudermilk for doing an outstanding job as our Executive Director - however now we do have a vacation place to stay at his new house in Mexico! We appreciate all the passion Mark put into his many positions as a jack of all trades for ABATE, not to mention fun Board meeting lunches with members and Cigars these past years.









Seniors Now Eligible to Renew Driver's Licenses Online

Temporary waiver allows licenses for drivers 70 and older to be renewed without an office visit

Sacramento – Californians age 70 and older with a noncommercial driver's license are now eligible to renew online or by mail, eliminating the need to visit a California Department of Motor Vehicles office. Licenses with an expiration date between March 1, 2020, throughout the COVID-19 emergency are eligible.

Through Executive Order, Governor Gavin Newsom has temporarily waived the California law requiring drivers age 70 and older to visit a DMV field office to renew their license for the length of California's State of Emergency or until modified. The DMV is completing the programming necessary so customers who meet the criteria will be able to complete their renewal online beginning December 6.

Nearly all California drivers are now eligible to renew their license online or by mail – even if their renewal notice states an office visit is required.

The DMV previously provided <u>yearlong extensions to senior drivers</u> with noncommercial licenses expiring in March through December 2020. Those who received the extensions are eligible to renew online.

Commercial licenses, including those for drivers 70 and older, expiring between March and December are extended through December 2020, to align with federal guidelines.

The DMV previously <u>expanded eligibility for drivers 69 and under to renew online</u>, even if their DMV notification states they must come to an office.

Summary of California driver's license extensions

	Expiration month	Status
Age 70 & older (noncommercial) Age 69 & younger (noncommercial)	Beginning March 2020	Expanded eligibility to <u>renew online</u> or by mail for licenses expiring during the emergency
Commercial (all types, all ages)	March-December 2020	Extended to December 31, 2020
Learner's permits (noncommercial)	March-November 2020	Extended six months or to a date 24 months from the date of application

The ability for senior drivers to renew online is the latest action to help Californians avoid or delay a DMV office visit during the COVID-19 pandemic. The DMV continues to streamline its processes to limit the time customers spend at an office. Customers applying for a REAL ID are encouraged to fill out the <u>online</u> application and upload the required documents before they come to the office for expedited service.

The DMV continues to recommend that customers use its online services, expanded virtual services and other service channels to complete transactions, including eligible driver's license and vehicle registration renewals. Customers can use the <u>Service Advisor</u> on the DMV website to learn their options to complete DMV tasks.

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

BIKERS FROM ACROSS AMERICA BRAVE PANDEMIC TO ATTEND NCOM CONVENTION: Although smaller than normal, due to the COVID-19 threat, the rescheduled NCOM Convention held Oct. 16-18 in Indianapolis succeeded in "being here for those dedicated Freedom Fighters who were determined enough to brave a deadly health crisis to be here for each other," explained a masked NCOM Chairman James "Doe" Paighenback

Chairman James "Doc" Reichenbach. Legal and legislative seminars and roundtables were socially distanced, but fairly well attended, considering the dire circumstances, and seats at the dinner tables were mostly filled for the Silver Spoke Awards Banquet to honor bikers' rights activists such as author and filmmaker John E. (Black Dragon) Bunch II (ENTERTAINMENT); Jad Breiner -Sons of Silence MC, editor of Brothers Behind Bars (BBB) Newsletter (MEDIA); Pete Leehey - AIM Attorney, Iowa (LEGAL); with SPECIAL RECOGNI-TION AWARDS going to Nancy Nemecek and Fred "Sarge" Matthews, and NCOM's RON ROLOFF LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD presented to John Bilotta Jr., Operations Director for ABATE of Virginia.

Dates and location for the 36th annual National Coalition of Motorcyclists (NCOM) Convention in 2021 have yet to be finalized, so stay tuned for further details as they are announced.

CALIFORNIA BECOMES FIRST STATE TO BAN GAS-POWERED VEHICLES: Governor Gavin Newsom (D) announced that he will "aggressively move California further away from its reliance on climate change-causing fossil fuels" by issuing an executive order on September 23rd mandating that all new passenger vehicles be zero-emission by 2035.

His historic action will require all passenger vehicle manufacturers to shun internal combustion engines and fully electrify their line-up, meaning that manufacturers that wish to continue to sell in the Golden State will only be allowed to sell new electric cars and trucks after the deadline.

Motorcycles are not included in the definition of "passenger vehicles," but the order does contain a clause to achieve "100 percent zero-emission from off-road vehicles and equipment operations in the State by 2035," which would presumably include all new ATVs and dirt bikes.

The executive order only applies to the sale of new

vehicles and will not prevent Californians from owning gas-burning automobiles or selling them on the used car market.

"This is the most impactful step our state can take to fight climate change," said Gov. Newsom as California has become the first U.S. state to join with 15 countries that have already committed to phase out gasoline-powered vehicles.

ATVs GET APPROVAL FOR USE ON CITY'S STREETS: Off-road tourism got a boost with news that a city has opened its streets to side-by-side and ATV traffic. In central Wisconsin, the Tomah Police Department reports on its Facebook that "ATV/UTV routes within the City of Tomah are now legally opened for operation and use. Now that all City of Tomah signage is erected, streets within the City of Tomah are now legally opened for ATV/UTV traffic."

Some key points related to ATV/UTV operation within the City of Tomah, WI: 1) Unless otherwise posted, the routes within the City of Tomah include all roads with a speed limit of 35mph or less; 2) ATVs and UTVs may only be operated on approved routes from 6am - 10pm; 3) Operators must be 16 or older and possess a valid license and proof of insurance; 4) All other state statutes related to the use and operation of an ATV/UTV are applicable.

INNOCENT BIKER'S PERSISTANCE NETS NEW HARLEY: The Texas biker may have deserved a speeding ticket, but he didn't think the traffic stop warranted the questioning, roadside investigation, pat-down search, or enduring an hour of detainment along the roadway waiting for a drug-sniffing dog to arrive on the scene; resulting in inconvenience and embarrassment because a law enforcement officer had guessed wrong.

Statistically, police are terrible at determining which motorists are worthy of being detained and searched, often relying on signs of a driver's deception such as twitching, fidgeting or lack of eyecontact, all of which research long has debunked as signals of lying.

"There are no nonverbal and verbal cues uniquely related to deceit," a 2011 review of deception research concluded, while a 2005 study of Texas police found officers performed barely above random chance in being able to discern a person telling the truth from a liar.

Texas police performed just under a million searches during traffic stops last year, according to figures reported to the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement, and though "hit rates" vary by department, only about 1 in 5 resulted in contraband being found. Yet Texas law enforcement agencies seized about \$50 million in forfeited funds in each of the past five years; with proceeds split between police and prosecutors and used to fund more searches.

Police once needed probable cause that a crime was occurring to investigate motorists during a stop. But in 1968, the U.S. Supreme Court allowed brief stops based on a lower standard of "reasonable suspicion" of wrongdoing. A later decision clarified that if the officer can't specify why he suspects a crime is afoot, a traffic stop may last only long enough to check the driver's paperwork and write a ticket or warning.

Most recent national analyses of traffic stops have focused on the disproportionate rate of police searches of Black and Hispanic motorists, though a federal measure currently under consideration in Congress could add motorcycle riders to that profiling study group.

And so this biker was relieved to finally be allowed on his way with just a ticket, but knew it wasn't right and figured his motorcycle club vest must have raised the officer's suspicions.

Innocent people rarely protest meritless searches, so finding an attorney to take his case was difficult. The overwhelming number of legal challenges occur

in suppression hearings, when an officer's suspicions were correct; contraband was discovered and the defendant seeks to have the evidence tossed on procedural grounds.

With the help of an Austin attorney who represents

motorcyclists, the angry biker filed a lawsuit against the Texas trooper in early 2019. Soon after reviewing the dashcam video, lawyers for the Texas attorney general's office said they were ready to settle.

BLACK MOTORCYCLE CLUB SUES COUNTY OVER EVENT CANCELLATION: The East Bay Dragons, founded in the 1950s as the first all-Black motorcycle club to exist in California's Bay Area, has filed a federal lawsuit against Solano County alleging they concocted a reason to cancel a planned club event at the fairgrounds after hearing that one of the club's members had an association with the Black Panthers.

Still in its early stages, the suit claims that the Dragons planned a 60th anniversary event at the Solano County Fairgrounds in Vallejo, but the event was canceled at the last minute, after the Dragons had spent thousands in fees and planning.

According to the lawsuit, the trouble for the planned August 2019 event started when a county employee learned that a member of the Dragons owned a bakery in Oakland, proudly located at the site of the Black Panthers' first headquarters

The suit claims all of this was a problem for the county employee, who allegedly remarked that the Black Panthers were "the greatest threat to the internal security of the country," and started working to cancel the Dragons' event. As a result of this, the suit alleges, fairgrounds staff invented the ruse that there was a credible threat to the safety of the event, "but there was no credible threat at all."

"This insidious belief of EBD's threat traveled all the way to Oakland and with the help of the Oakland Police Department, at the conclusion of the 60th anniversary celebration on September 2, 2019, the EBD were surrounded by Oakland Police Department officers due to racist motives," the civil complaint says.

In East Oakland, the biker club is beloved, says Councilman Larry Reid, who said their clubhouse in his district has distributed food on Thanksgivings and toy drives during Christmas.

MOTORCYCLE MECHANIC GETS COMPENSATION OVER BIKE 'PHOBIA': A mechanic at a Harley-Davidson dealership in England has received over £60k (\$77,665 USD) settlement after being left unable to work due to "motorcycle phobia" sustained in a work-related accident with an at-fault car whose driver admitted liability.

The mechanic was road testing a customer's bike at the time of the crash, resulting in physical and psychiatric injuries, including a newfound fear of riding the motorcycles he had to work on, rendering him unable to continue doing the job he loved.

Despite receiving support from his employer, the mechanic left the bike business and now has hopes to become a photographer.

MOTORCYCLISTS 'A DANGER TO THEM-SELVES' SAYS TRANSPORTATION REPORT: A transport consultation released by the Oxford County Council has branded motorcyclists as pollution emitting liabilities to safety. The paper outlines transport and connectivity plans, which are clearly biased against motorcycle riding, and goes to great lengths

to champion bicycles, walking and public transportation.

Rather than just side with pedal power and walking, the public document goes on to set a worrisome precedent by labeling motorcycles and their riders as dangerous polluters. Just two of the anti-motorcycle statements read: "Statistical evidence suggests motorcyclists are a danger to themselves" and "Motorbikes are mostly still using fossil fuels to run, meaning they are environmentally unsound, not sustainable, and contribute to air pollution."

The British Motorcycle Federation (www. BMF.co.uk) has now picked up the case and are chasing the council to have the anti-biker rhetoric dropped from the official paper. "The Oxfordshire Transport Panel have cynically used the current COVID-19 crisis to attempt to force through the adoption of this outrageous Transport Plan," charged their Chairman, Jim Freeman, further stating that "The BMF urge all members to be especially vigilant at this time in scrutinizing local authorities and other bodies who may use this crisis to 'bury news' concerning similar discriminatory attitudes and moves."

BRITISH MOTORCYCLE RACER RECOG-NIZED BY THE QUEEN: TT champion Ryan Farquhar, one of the world's most esteemed and successful motorcycle road racers, was awarded a BEM (British Empire Medal) in the Queen's Birthday Honours List.

The Northern Irishman received the award for his "Services to Motorcycling" over a career that has seen him secure three Isle of Man TT wins, five North West 200 victories and nine Ulster Grand Prix triumphs, clinching an incredible total of 357 road race victories.

Farquhar says he was completely taken aback by the news of his award, saying it is "very special" to have his achievements recognized in such a high-profile manner outside of the sport itself. "I never ever dreamed I would receive an accolade like this. Motorcycle racing in general, and particularly road racing, doesn't generally get the recognition of other sports."

AIMEXPO, IMS POSTPONED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS: Following a meeting of the MIC (Motorcycle Industry Council) Board of Directors, the difficult decision was made to postpone the 2021 AIMExpo, the industry's annual trade show, to 2022 due to COVID-19 directives "limiting gathering size, travel restrictions, and a myriad of other obstacles created by the pandemic, there are too many unknown factors limiting our ability to create a safe environment that will also deliver the experience and ROI our exhibitors and attendees expect."

Likewise, the International Motorcycle Shows (IMS) have announced that its annual November through February winter tour across the U.S. has been cancelled "as a result of COVID-19 and the risks involved with large crowds at indoor venues" and, in its place, has launched Progressive IMS Outdoors; revamping the tour's nearly 40-year stint to "transition from the traditional convention center setup to a new open outdoor experience" to take place between May and September of 2021.




Well that concludes this month's adventures. Hope you guys enjoyed the ride. Till next time, go out and ride your bike.

AB 1595 had an immediate and very negative impact on side-by side safety and prevents the use of many of these family recreational vehicles that have been opgraded with additional safety equipment.
