SB-1024 Jones Off-highway vehicles: This bill would exempt specially constructed motor vehicles operated solely in organized racing or competitive events upon a closed course from the identification device requirement for motor vehicles operated exclusively off the highways. The bill would repeal provisions relating to special transportation identification devices for motorcycles and corresponding fees, and would make other related conforming changes. The bill would additionally provide that competition all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) are not exempt from identification. Assembly Transportation

*SB-1147 Glazer State park system: Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area: This bill would express the intent of the Legislature to enact subsequent legislation that would preserve the Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area for conservation purposes. Gut & Amend Candidate like 2019, which <u>we defeated last time</u>

*SB-1032 Allen State parks: Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation Commission: This bill would make the creation of the commission permanent by deleting the January 1, 2023, repeal date. The bill would require the commission members to instead have expertise in and represent off-highway vehicle recreation, environmental protection, motorized access to nonmotorized recreation, law enforcement, environmental restoration, public health and safety, rural landowners and residents, biological or soil specialization, or the public at-large. Trailer Bill Candidate, August Budget Revise. Protecting makeup of Commission to be Rider Friendly.

SB-1351 Beall Department of Transportation: state highways (Amended) Planning: This bill would prohibit the director from approving an allocation of an amount greater than $5\overline{\%}$ of a transportation planning agency's annual revenues. Existing law authorizes certain statutorily created transportation planning agencies to allocate up to 3% of their annual revenues for transportation planning and programming processes, and alternatively authorizes the allocation of a greater amount upon approval by the Director of Transportation

This bill would require those rules and regulations to be updated at least every four calendar years to reflect changes to the operators' transfer policies, payment methods, and any other relevant policy changes. This bill would provide that, if the Commission on State Mandates determines that the bill contains costs mandated by the state, reimbursement for those costs shall be made pursuant to the statutory provisions

noted above. Assembly Transportation

AB-1964 Frazier Autonomous vehicles: This bill would expand the definition of the term "autonomous vehicle" to also include a remotely operated vehicle, defined as a specified type of vehicle that is capable of being operated by a driver or operator that is not inside of the vehicle. The bill would instead specify that a vehicle is not an autonomous vehicle if it is equipped with a collision avoidance system that is not capable of driving the vehicle without the active control or monitoring of a human operator that is seated

in the driver's seat of the vehicle. *Trailer Bill Candi*date, August Budget Revise

AB-2121 Friedman Traffic safety: This bill would require, beginning June 1, 2022, and every 6 months thereafter, Caltrans to convene a committee of external design experts to advise on revisions to the Highway Design Manual. This bill would extend the period of time a prima facie speed limit may be justified by an engineering and traffic survey, as specified, if a registered engineer evaluates the section of the highway and finds that there has been an increase in traffic-related crashes. Trailer Bill Candidate, August Budget Revise

AB-2225 Grayson Smog check: exemption: historic vehicles: This bill would exempt motor vehicles that have been issued with the specialty plate described above from the requirement that it be inspected biennially upon registration. Trailer Bill Candidate, August Budget Revise

*AB-2551 Bauer-Kahan Off-highway vehicular recreation: Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area: Alameda-Tesla Expansion Area: This bill would authorize the department to dispose of the portion of the Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area known as the "Alameda-Tesla Expansion Area" to permanently preserve that land for conservation purposes, as specified, if the department determines that disposing of the land is in the public interest. Gut & Amend Candidate like 2019, which we defeated by Lobbying Governor

*AB-2761 Gallagher Off-highway vehicles: reciprocity: This bill would permit application of that exception only if the other state recognizes an identification plate or device issued by the department as valid for use in that state. By narrowing the exception, the bill would expand the scope of an existing crime and would therefore impose a state-mandated local program. Trailer Bill Candidate, August Budget Revise

*AB-2785 Cervantes Vehicles: off-highway ve**hicles (Spot)**: This bill would delete obsolete provisions relating to the report, and would make other technical, nonsubstantive changes. Gut & Amend **Candidate**

AB-3311 Grayson Vehicles: insurance: This bill would increase the amount of liability insurance coverage an owner or operator of a motor vehicle is required to maintain to \$30,000 for bodily injury or death of one person, \$60,000 for bodily injury or death of all persons, and \$25,000 for damage to the property of others as a result of any one accident. This bill would make conforming changes to the definition of "proof of financial responsibility" for purposes of the provisions described above. *Trailer* Bill Candidate, August Budget Revise

*Protect Motorcycle Safety Fund and Off-Highway Vehicle from Trailer Bills/August Revise (After Taxes are Collected July 15 since April Deadline was postponed). We protected the Accounts so far through June Budget Vote - no money was stolen or defunded!




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What is ABATE?

Hello August and riders around our state. We just had our quarterly Board of Directors meeting online. I want to thank everyone who participated. We had good communication and exchange of ideas.







California has always allowed valid "out of state" OHV registered vehicles to use our public lands. It has come to our attention that some of our neighboring states have recently implemented a "non-resident" fee for OHV's being operated in their state. By no longer honoring our California registration these states are reneging on a long standing tradition in the OHV community. These new regulations will be expensive and prove onerous to every legally licensed OHV owner that travels and recreates in other states. Our ABATE OHV Division is asking for your help and financial support in fighting this type of legislation. Assembly Bill 2761 sponsored by Assemblyman Gallagher (Republican-Yuba City) seeks to remedy this issue of reciprocity and ABATE of California is asking you to help the OHV communities of our states restore equal access to OHV areas for all legally licensed users.

In addition to AB 2761, Abate of California is proposing two other bills for our elected official's to consider this year. Our first bill would require DMV to allow rider's to take both the M/C skill's test and their DMV written exam during their CHP certified M/C training classes. After a rider successfully completes and passes both tests the school would submit the information to DMV and they would issue a valid M/C endorsement card by mail to the rider that is valid for the duration of their current California drivers license. Upon license renewal the M/C endorsement would then be added to their new license thereby saving the student the time and expense associated with visiting and testing at their local DMV office.

Our second bill would seek to exempt all M/C riders and especially our Military Veteran riders from being accessed a toll fee when traveling on a toll road within the

Hello All! Needless to say, it's been some interesting months and I hope everyone is safe and healthy. I attended the last Board of Directors meeting on Saturday, July 11th, which was online. The meeting was good with a lot of good discussions and was well attended by Local 8 members. An item that was talked about was the anti-profiling bill, which is doing well. Also, that no federal funds can be used for a motorcycle only check point.

The ABATE membership drawing has been pushed to the October 10th Board of Directors meeting in Fresno. That way the drawing will be drawn in an in-person meeting.

The Legislature was scheduled to return July 13th, however two Members of the Assembly, Autumn Burke (D – Los Angeles), and Tom Lackey (R – Palmdale, who Coauthored our Lane Splitting Legalization, as well as multiple Capitol staff, tested positive for the Coronavirus.

The Legislature was returning to start work on the August revise of 202 Billion Dollar State Budget now that the State Taxes have been collected and numbers finalized after the July 15th Tax Extension Deadline.

On June 15th a temporary "Band-Aid" State Budget that relied heavily on Federal Funds from Congress & the President, which have not materialized, was passed on a prayer that a new FEDERAL BAILOUT would include State Budget assistance - slim chance when you've sued the President with over 100 lawsuits!

Expect some major cuts to state programs come October! So far, we have been successful at keeping the California Motorcyclists Safety Program and Off-Road Vehicle Accounts protected and not pillaged as they always try.

We have been able to move SB 1024 Jones (R – San Diego) out of the Senate. It's awaiting a hearing in the Assembly Transportation Committee when the Legislature returns – tentatively on July 27th. We have been meeting with the Department of Parks, DMV and various stakeholders these past months and continue to through this extension. This bill would allow racing competition bikes, as well as the ones for the kiddos, to continue to be sold by our Motorcycle Dealers and ridden and used in the riding areas of California! A Big Win if we can push it out of the Transportation Committee with all these Legislative shutdowns.

The Bills trying to close the Carnegie-Tesla Off-Road park are still stuck in Committees: SB 1147 Glazer (D – Orinda) AB 2551 Bauer-Kahan (D – East Bay). We expect them to be amended into one of the 40 Assembly Budget Trailer bills or one of the 40 Senate Trailer bills currently being discussed. They tried a "Gut & Amend" last year after we defeated only to have it Vetoed by the Governor.

We have been successful so far, but will be ready to battle these Trailer bills until the August 31st deadline when the Legislature is set to adjourn. We have heard they may be called into a special session after the deadline. So be prepared for a busy fall with elections and political work.

A big "Thank you!" to all the Locals that send in their monthly shares to support the dedicated Lobbyist Fund and those who stepped up, as usual, sending money into the Special Request Letter from the Board!

Lastly at the Board meeting Jeff Bassler, Local 19 President accepted a 1-year Board position

In the PAC meeting it was talked about that there was not much going on with new bills yet as the State Senate has been going over the budget.

Our ABATE Local 8 meeting on July 13th was held online again. We touched on what happened at the Board meeting. We also talked about the status of events and merchandise Local 8 has to sell. At our next meeting there is going to be many things to discuss, so I hope to see you all there.

MOTORCYCLISTS' CON-ADDRESSES CERNS: Congress moved to reauthorize the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act), which expires on September 30th, when House Democrats unveiled the INVEST in America Act ("Investing in a New Vision for the Environment and Surface Transportation in America"), H.R. 2; a new 864-page \$494 billion long-term funding plan for the nation's surface transportation infrastructure like highways, vehicle safety and public transit.

Included by unanimous consent during markup of H.R. 2 by the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee on June 18th are three amendments offered to bolster previous tenets contained in the FAST Act of 2015: (1) A provision to extend the prohibition against using federal funding for motorcycle-only checkpoints would also prohibit using federal funds to profile and stop motorcyclists based on of their mode of transportation or style of dress. (2) An amendment to require the Department of Transportation to consider motorcycles in safety studies on autonomous vehicles and would also include a motorcycle safety group in the DOT working group on autonomous vehicle deployment. (3) An extension of the Motorcyclist Advisory Council, including a seat on the council for motorcyclists' rights groups and manufacturers.

In addition, as originally introduced, the IN-VEST in America Act seeks to increase Motorcycle Safety Funds to states by 25%, to \$5.8 mil-

YET ANOTHER REASON TO RIDE!: Comments made by President Donald Trump during a recent roundtable meeting at the White House have prompted speculation that Americans might receive a domestic travel credit as part of a second round of stimulus payments.

On May 18th, Trump met with restaurant executives to discuss the future of the industry amid the COVID-19 pandemic. During the meeting, Trump suggested a possible credit that could benefit the restaurant and travel industries, two of the hardest-hit by the Coronavirus.

"Create an 'Explore America' tax credit that Americans can use for domestic travel, including visits to restaurants," said President Trump, adding "That's a big deal."

While the President didn't mention any specified amount, U.S. tourism industry lobbyists have been circulating a proposal in Washington that would give people an extra \$4,000 in tax breaks to spend at U.S. theme parks, restaurants, hotels and other travel-related businesses, the Orlando Sentinel reports.

Details of the "Explore America" tax credit are still being finalized, according to the paper, but early drafts propose covering 50% of airfare and other travel costs up to \$4,000 through 2021.

POST-COVID: MOTORCYCLES WILL BE THE LOGICAL CHOICE: If we are to believe the so-called "experts," travelling will never be the same again. Even when the Coronavirus itself is under control, we have to take into account the risk of contamination or a new wave of the pandemic for a long time, if not forever. Already politicians and medical experts speak of a socially-distanced society in which we have to keep away from one another in the public space, including public transport, schools, restaurants,

"Assuming that we will be able to travel freely soon, there will probably, at least for a period of

time, be limitations to our freedom," states the head of the Federation of European Motorcyclists' Associations (FEMA), "Not in distance or direction, but in the way we travel as a result of the need to keep distance from each other."

FEMA's General Secretary Dolf Willigers concludes that the capacity of public transport, buses, trains, airplanes and the such will be limited, and we will have to switch to more individual ways. At the same time, he notes that city councils allocate more road space to pedestrians and cyclists instead of cars and commercial vehicles. This calls for vehicles that are smaller than cars and trucks, so "for personal transport and partly for goods transport, powered two-wheelers (motorcycles, mopeds, e-bikes, etc.) will be the logical choice."

Road authorities and city councils should keep the use of motorcycles possible and facilitate the use of them by keeping roads open for them, says Willigers in calling for the creation of dedicated parking spaces and safe charging infrastructure for electric powered two-wheelers (PTW). "The use of small individual motorized transport -- as powered two-wheelers are -- allow people to travel into the cities while maintaining the needed social distance and leaving room for pedestrians, cyclists and users of other kinds of micro-mobility."

RIDING WITH A MASK UNDER YOUR HELMET COULD LEAD TO BLACKOUTS: As an ongoing part of the government's guidelines to combat the spread of the Coronavirus, face masks are recommended (and even required in some places) to be worn while out of our homes. However, one motorcycle-riding doctor has spoken out against wearing face masks under full-face and modular motorcycle helmets while riding, cautioning that the material used to filter out particles before they enter the lungs could cause riders to take on too little oxygen and potentially cause them to lose consciousness.

While riding a bike, adrenaline will begin circulating through the rider's body, elevating their heart rate and increasing the amount of oxygen the rider needs to take in. In circumstances such as this, the restrictive nature of a surgical type face mask could prevent the rider from taking on enough oxygen and potentially lead to the rider passing out.

"Surgical masks restrict your breathing," explains Dr. Tommy Lim, a rider and surgeon, warning that this can be fatal at high speeds when your adrenaline kicks in. "Adrenaline will cause your heartbeat to double depending on your speed. This, in effect, will make you breathe faster and these masks will restrict your breathing and give your heart a hard time. Next, your brain will also suffer due to lack of oxygen until you blackout."

HARLEY-DAVIDSON TAKES A STAND AGAINST RACISM: Harley-Davidson Motor Co. has made an unprecedented stand against racism and bigotry in the aftermath of the George Floyd protests, taking to social media to make the statement that racism has no place at the Milwaukee firm and that H-D stands shoulder to shoulder with those people protesting against racism and bigotry in any form.

America's most famous motorcycle maker recently posted on their Instagram page that;

"Racism, hate or intolerance have no place at Harley-Davidson. We stand in solidarity with our Black colleagues and riders, as we condemn acts of racism and bigotry of any kind, and move forward together toward and equitable society for all. United we ride."

BIKER GANGS RIDING TO SEATTLE TO FIGHT ANTIFA": In mid-June, "news" started circulating on social media platforms that the Hells Angels and Mongols were riding together "on their way" to Seattle, Washington, to scrap with Antifa, or anti-fascists, in the city's Capitol Hill Autonomous Zone (CHAZ), a so-called "cop free" area that was set up by protesters amid widespread rioting against police brutality and racial injustice.

This incendiary hoax was supported by little more than unfounded tweets and unrelated years old YouTube videos, but no evidence was ever provided to support this claim, and Sonny Barger of the Hells Angels has issued a statement refuting these rumors in a Facebook post on June 13, 2020, in which he wrote: "People have asked me about these fake articles involving the Hells Angels and another club going to face antifa. Stop, it's untrue and will never happen."

MISSOURI HELMET LAW ON VERGE OF REPEAL: Once again, Missouri motorcyclists are hopeful for major changes to the state's mandatory helmet law after legislators recently approved a massive transportation bill that contains a provision that would allow most adults to ride without a helmet, but they must be at least 26 years old and have medical insurance and proof of financial responsibility. The state's Senate and House approved the legislative package; now it's up to the state's governor to give his final stamp of approval.

Representative Jared Taylor (R-Nixa) told Missourinet.com that Governor Mike Parson (R) promised he'd sign the measure that is now sitting on his desk, but Parson's spokeswoman says while he has "indicated he is supportive of this issue, but like always, there will be a thorough bill review to see what else is in the bill."

The new rules also restrict police from pulling over helmetless riders to check if they have the required health insurance.

The motorcyclists' rights organization "Freedom of the Road Riders of Missouri" (FORR-MO) supports the repeal effort and has lobbied the perennial issue annually at the Capitol for

more than 25 years, successfully getting a bill to their governor on multiple occasions since 1999.

At least three Missouri governors, including GOP Governor Parson, have vetoed helmet repeal legislation in the past. Governor Parson vetoed a broad bill in 2019 that included a helmet repeal, though the governor's objections were to a different part of that overall bill.

If Governor Parson approves the current proposal, H.B. 1963, the changes will take effect August 28, 2020.

AUSTRIAN NOISE BAN WOULD EXCLUDE LEGALLY-SOLD NEW MOTORCY-CLES: Officials in Austria have enacted a ban on motorcycles that emit noise above 95dB on a popular scenic tourist route through the mountains of Tyrol, and several top-selling motorcycles will not be allowed to operate on more than 100 kilometers within the resort area.


The debate over noisy motorcycles has been brewing around the world, but now even bikes that pass strict Euro standards will be barred from the road, including brand new models from Kawasaki, Aprilia, BMW, Ducati and KTM, which all register noise levels just above the limit.

Frustratingly, the ban only covers motorcycles, while noisy cars are not included, but the law will give police the authority to carry out spot checks and hand down 220 euros (\$246 USD) in fines.



Well the road through my column has been successfully completed. Yea baby! In closing, try to sign-up some new members for the membership drive and support any ABATE runs/events that are being held.


