
It's almost May already, so it's Motorcycle Awareness Month and OUR ANNUAL CAPITOL FREEDOM RALLY ON MON-DAY, MAY 6th!

The lane splitting (oops, "lane sharing") bill, SB 350, by Assemblyman Jim Beall (D-Campbell) **IS A TWO YEAR BILL!** I, on behalf of ABATE, have expressed serious concerns to the bill as it is currently drafted. It is a SPOT bill, which means it can be changed/amended at a later date in the session. However, it will not be heard in the Senate Transportation Committee until *NEXT YEAR — 2014.*

Many riders, both ABATE members and not, are urging opposition to any changes to the law that currently doesn't prohibit lane sharing, and that may well be the consensus position, but we should at least see which, if any, amendments are ultimately introduced

For example, I wonder how far this legislation would go, if existing bill Section (b) were amended to prohibit peace officers to be able to lane split with, or without, lights flashing and sirens blasting? Stay turned to my MONTHLY Bailing Wire articles FOR **UPDATES ON SB350!**

A bill for us **TO SUPPORT**, however, is AB 1192 by Assemblywoman Beth Gaines (R-Roseville). Her bill will would require ALL PARKING LOTS TO ALLOW MO-



TORCYCLES TO PARK IN/ON THEIR **PARKING STRUCTURES**. Currently, private and public parking structures and lots can restrict and discriminate against motorcyclists by **BANNING** the parking of their bikes in parking areas for all other vehicles. This bill will be heard by the Assembly Transportation Committee, in April.

For May's Freedom Rally, I have lined up many Senators and Assembly Members who want to WELCOME MOTORCYCLISTS TO THEIR/OUR HOUSE — THE CAPI-TOL BUILDING.

Senate Republican Leader, and fellow rider Bob Huff, will be presenting us with our annual Resolution declaring May as Motorcycle Awareness Month!

LEGISLATION WOULD PROHIBIT E15 GAS PENDING FURTHER INVES-**TIGATION:** Congressman Jim Sensenbrenner (R-WI) has introduced H.R. 875, which would require the Environmental Protection Agency to stop the use of gasoline containing 15% ethanol (E15) until its harmful effects are investigated further. H.R. 875, introduced on February 28,

would repeal the EPA's waiver decision approving the use of E15 and the authority of the agency to grant further decisions until the EPA seeks an independent scientific analysis of the effects of the E15 blend. "There have been several tests and warnings highlighting E15's harmful effects on

engines and their components, but they have all been dismissed by the EPA. Therefore, we must force the EPA to stop the use of E15 fuel until the serious safety, durability, per- way has been divided into three or more formance and environmental concerns have been addressed," announced Rep. Sensenbrenner.

Sensenbrenner has introduced several bills to address the risks associated with E15, and his latest legislation to halt the sale of the 15% alcohol blended fuel until further studies are completed, came less than a week after witnesses from automobile and motorcycle industry and consumer groups testified before the Science, Space and Technology Committee that more testing is


needed. "We have a responsibility to ensure that bill for future reconsideration. Americans using gas-powered machinery – whether it be cars and boats or chainsaws and lawnmowers – are not put at risk due to faulty fuel that has not been adequately vetted," Sensenbrenner said.

BILL INTRODUCED IN CALIFOR-NIA TO REGULATE LANE SHAR-**ING:** No sooner had the California High-

way Patrol published guidelines on how to safely maneuver your motorcycle between lanes of slow-moving traffic, than SB 350 (D-San Jose) to codify the rules into law.

California is the only state that allows because there are no laws against it; though officers have a variety of charges they can levy against a reckless rider such as unsafe lane change or too fast for conditions.

Beall's bill would restrict the practice by prohibiting motorcycles from splitting lanes unless specifically allowed; "...when a high-



clearly marked lanes for traffic traveling in the same direction, a person operating a motorcycle shall not pass another vehicle in a portion of a lane occupied by that vehicle unless the following conditions are met:

(1) The passing occurs during traffic congestion. (2) The passing occurs at a safe speed."

Following furious feedback from motorcyclists opposed to over-regulating an act that 87% report doing almost daily during crowded commutes, Sen. Beall soon pulled his proposal and turned it into a two-year

In the meantime, although ABATE of California did not initiate the measure, the group will work with Beall to amend the language, and vows "...our goal is to ultimately submit a bill that addresses the concerns of the motorcycle community; a bill that can be supported and endorsed by the ABATE membership. If the final bill doesn't meet ABATE's requirements, ABATE will vigorously oppose the bill and try to kill it."

DRIVERS CAUSE MOST CRASHES was introduced by State Senator Jim Beall WITH MOTORCYCLES, RESEARCH

For motorcycle riders, people in "cages" "lane sharing" or "lane splitting," precisely bear a disproportionate share of the blame for the high number of motorcycle crashes, while car drivers feel careless motorcyclists careening in and out of traffic are putting their own lives at risk.

So who's mostly to blame when fourwheel and two-wheel vehicles collide? Ac-

Transportation study, bikers are right. Motorists driving cars and trucks are mostly at fault, often failing to yield the right of way to the smaller vehicles.

In analyzing 10 years of Florida motorcycle crashes, Chanyoung Lee, a senior researcher at the University of South Florida's Center for Urban Transportation Research, found that 60% of the time motorists in other vehicles are at fault when they collide with motorcycles.

But the study uncovered more: When looking at all motorcycle crashes, motorcycle operators bear a lot of responsibility as well. They have a significantly higher number of single-vehicle crashes than other drivers. Some 34% of motorcycle crashes involve one vehicle, according to the study, compared to only 19% of car crashes involving one vehicle. When looking at really severe and fatal motorcycle crashes, 50% involve just the motorcycle and no other vehicle, but when multiple vehicles are involved, greater blame falls on four-wheeled drivers. And most motorcycle crashes involve other vehicles.

But it's also a matter of awareness, according to Lee, who is part of FDOT's Motorcycle Safety Coalition. In driver surveys, FDOT has asked people how often they see motorcycles. Those with motorcycle endorsements on their driver's licenses report seeing motorcycles all the time, while those without endorsements who live in the same area report occasionally seeing motorcycles.

Due to minimal levels of protection to their riders, approximately 80% of motorcycle crashes result in injury or fatality, according to the Network of Employees for Traffic Safety, while only 20% of passenger car crashes injure or kill the vehicle occu-

proposed recently by Saskatchewan Government Insurance. "Our MLAs are reporting a lot of feedback on the issue, not just from those who are riders or have motorcycles, but others in general who note that these increases seem to be very high," Wall

When the legislature reconvenes for its spring session next week, the Saskatchewan Party caucus will discuss its next steps, Wall said. He said he's not convinced SGI has exhausted all of its options to help eliminate a \$9-million deficit between crash injury payouts and fees charged to motorcyclists. "Ob-

viously, what's being proposed by SGI for the rate rebalancing means huge increases and immediate increases, if approved, for riders," Wall said. SGI's proposal to the Saskatchewan Rate Review Panel would mean a sudden 73%

jump in insurance costs for the average

motorcycle owner, compared to an overall

vehicle insurance rate increase of 1.03%. The move prompted a backlash from bike enthusiasts and business owners, who fear a big blow to new and used bike sales which could devastate the motorcycle industry.

If approved, the rate increases would take effect in August, but Wall said the chance is "slim" the proposal will stay as is. He wants the government and SGI to look at other

ABATE of California's Off-Road division is off and running! We are still looking for new members and are working our butts off to get rid of negative legislation that has been aimed at off-roaders. We have been working with our representatives and at the time this is going to print; we have three bills headed to legislation to help undo the harm AB 1595 has done! Join now and help us to help you! ABATE of California Off-Road is spon-

soring Assemblyman Tim Donnelly's AB 64 which would amend AB 1595 (Congressman Paul Cook's outlandish bill that severely restricts Side X Side modifications, mandates helmet usage, and outlaws aftermarket back seats). After careful consideration, it was decided by all parties that Donnelly's original full repeal of AB 1595 probably would not pass, so instead, Donnelly amended it to (1) exempt all Side X Sides built before January 1, 2014 from the after-market back seat prohibition portion of the bill and (2) would exempt children from

nelly's original bill and will give us a "foot 1595 with new language that would delay in the door" for future changes to AB 1595. implementation of the non-factory back seat

Also stepping into the arena are two awesome Senators - Mimi Walters (R Irvine, Senate District 37) and Jean Fuller (R Bakersfield, Senate District 18). A couple of well-liked Senators, who believe in freedom like we do can only be a plus for us! As a side note; if all our representatives had staff members as astute and helpful as Jessica LaMaack from Senator Fuller's office and Josh Hoover from Senator Walters' office, our government would have a much higher constituent rating.


Senator Mimi Walters has introduced SB 234 which will amend AB 1595 in the following ways; 1) would allow non-factory seats in Side X Sides built before January 1, 2014 if the occupant of that seat is fully contained within the vehicle's rollover protection structure (roll cage), and 2) would allow aftermarket hand holds that meet the requirements of AB 1595 which specifies

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TECH TIPS by Craig Griswold

Brakes (Part I)

In the performance world, we jump through our proverbial grommets to do whatever we can to make our bikes go faster. Pipes and air, cams and compression, jets and maps. Anything to get that EPA choked dog motivated to get to point B chop-chop! On the other end of the spectrum, how often do most folks think about what it takes to slow down and stop?

It wasn't until 1914 when the first expanding rear drum brake was put to use. Harley stuck with that set-up for many years, with a transition from mechanical linkage to hydraulic operation with the introduction of the 1951 Servi-Car.

All that history is interesting, if nothing else. However, it could be argued that the greatest advance in bike brakes was the introduction of the disc brake. You folks can back me up on this one. Anyone that has ever worked on drum brakes, automotive or motorcycle, LOVES disc brakes! to make. These two fluids are absolutely not compatible, and if mixed, will make a mess of your brakes from one end to the other. The end result looks something like congealed bacon grease, for the lack of a better analogy. Best case scenario, you overhaul every component in your system and start new with the correct fluid. Worst case is obvious! Stock set-ups will have the required fluid type displayed on the master cylinder cover. That doesn't necessarily mean that's what's in there!



HD service literature says inspect DOT 5 and replace as necessary. DOT 5 is purple when new, and turns a light tan as it ages. We flush it with new if it's anything but purple. If you are ever in doubt, check with a reputable shop and err on the side of safety.

Brakes have come a long way since that bicycle coaster rig! The latest and greatest are Brembo calipers and ABS systems on the baggers. Next month we'll wrap up the topic with some gouge on brake pads. Ride safe!
