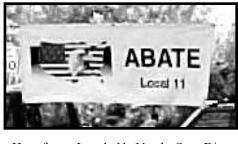

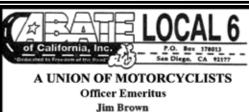

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# Pac/Lobbyist Report

### by Dave Hastings, Treasurer

Just a quick note to bring everyone up to speed on our PAC functions and get you primed for action. First things first, a big "Thank You" to the California Highway Patrol for making public their "Lane Sharing" guidelines. 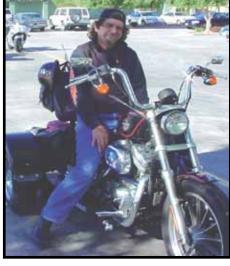

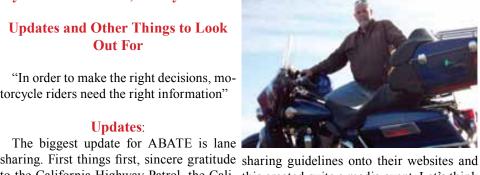

lane sharing in CA; 1) A recent review by one of the original authors of the Hurt report showed that lane sharing was involved in 0.6% of the crashes they investigated for the Hurt report. 2) Twenty-five years later the MAIDS report, the Hurt report for Europe, showed that lane sharing was involved in 0.4% of the crashes they investigated. A side note, lane sharing is an accepted practice in European and Asian countries. 3) A source I know of has been looking at fatal crashes in California where lane sharing was involved between the years of 2004 and 2011. His research shows that lane sharing has been involved in 1% of the fatal crashes in California over this time frame. Put these pieces of information in perspective, this data/facts show that for 31 years lane sharing has consistently been a factor in very few motorcycle crashes in California.

Here is more information/data: In the 2004-2011 crash information, 69% of the lane sharing fatal motorcycle crashes involved a big rig. So here is a huge safety tip, don't lane share around big rigs. Traffic will clear soon enough to allow you to move around the big rig without putting yourself at risk, just be patient. Even the smallest mistake when lane sharing around a big rig can result in a very bad interaction with the dual axle on the trailer. If we take out the big rig fatal crashes, then lane sharing is involved in just over 0.3% of the fatal motorcycle crashes in California. This puts it right back in line with all of the major crash studies that have been done.

There really is a lot more information about lane sharing and its safety benefits. Specifically, there are three papers on lane sharing that discuss the data and facts associated with lane sharing, and the general

#### Safety from page 18 conclusions from these papers is that lane

sharing does have crash reduction potential. And, should a crash occur it would be a less forceful crash compared to a motorcycle and rider getting rear ended. Just a couple of additional facts, starting

with the biggest one: 1) To date there are no known reports, studies, crash data or facts that show lane sharing is a more dangerous practice than sitting in heavy traffic. Some data and observations tend to indicate that moving in or with heavy traffic puts the rider at a greater risk of a crash than lane sharing. 2) Lane sharing, lane splitting and lane filtering all refer to the same basic motorcycle maneuver of moving in the lane/ roadway space between slow moving or stopped cars.

Other Things to Look Out For: In the world of motorcycle rider safety

there are two kinds of safety measures, those that prevent or reduce injuries and those that prevent crashes. Obviously the ones that prevent crashes are the most effective safety measures. That is, if a rider does not crash in the first place then injury reduction and prevention measures are not necessary.

Lane sharing is a crash prevention safety measure; it removes the rider from the high potential rear end crash scenario in heavy traffic situations. Another crash prevention safety measure has recently come to my attention; construction zones.

Before I pass along the safety information for riders to be aware of, let me tell you about a little piece of history with respect to motorcycle rider safety. Back around 2000 the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, (NHTSA), brought together a number of different people involved in motorcycling and motorcycle safety for the purpose of sitting down and coming up

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# ABATE Off-Road Division

ABATE of California's Off-Road division is off and running! We are still looking for new members and are working our butts off to get rid of negative legislation that has been aimed at off-roaders. We have been working with our representatives and at the time this is going to print; we have three bills headed to legislation to help undo the harm AB 1595 has done! Join now and help us to help you!

ABATE of California Off-Road is sponsoring Assemblyman Tim Donnelly's AB 64 which would amend AB 1595 (Congressman Paul Cook's outlandish bill that severely restricts Side X Side modifications, mandates helmet usage, and outlaws aftermarket back seats). After careful consideration, it was decided by all parties that Donnelly's original full repeal of AB 1595 probably would not pass, so instead, Donnelly amended it to (1) exempt all Side X Sides built before January 1, 2014 from the after-market back seat prohibition portion of the bill and (2) would exempt children from wearing a helmet if they are strapped into a child safety seat. We feel that this amended bill has a better chance of passing

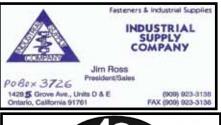
than Donnelly's original bill and will give us a "foot in the door" for future changes to AB 1595.

Also stepping into the arena are two awesome Senators - Mimi Walters (R Irvine, Senate District 37) and Jean Fuller (R Bakersfield, Senate District 18). As a side note; if all our representatives had staff members as astute and prompt as Jessica LaMaack from Senator Fuller's office, our government would have a much higher constituent rating. Jessica is incredible! A couple of well-liked Senators, who (like us) believe in freedom, can only be a plus Senator Mimi Walters has introduced

SB 234 which will amend AB 1595 in the following ways; 1) would make mandatory helmets inapplicable to children secured into an appropriate passenger restraint system with specified requirements, 2) would allow non-factory seats in Side X Sides built before January 1, 2014 if the occupant of that seat is fully contained within the vehicle's rollover protection structure (roll cage), and 3) would repeal the mandate for all passengers to be able to grasp the grab bars while secured in a passenger seat and seated upright with their back against the seat. Senator Walters bill goes a little bit further than Donnelly's. Thirty days after being introduced, Senator Walter's SB 234 may be amended slightly or "tweaked" to clarify any questions.

Senator Jean Fuller has introduced SB 334 as a "plan B" should Assemblyman Donnelly's AB 64 and Senator Walter's SB 234 fail to pass. SB 334 would amend AB 1595 with new language that would delay implementation of the non-factory back seats prohibition until January 1, 2015. This bill was introduced as an "urgency" bill meaning it will be heard sooner and if passed, implemented immediately. Senator Fuller's SB 334 will ensure ample amount of time to amend AB 1595 in the event of AB 64 and SB 234 not passing.

The time is now for all off-roaders to jump in and join the fight to retain our offroading freedoms. We must be proactive in stopping this type of legislation before it takes us by surprise again! 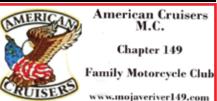


















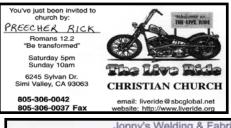

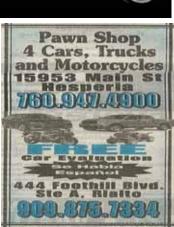














## **Tech Tips** by Craig Griswold **Hydraulic Fork Service**

When your front end sounds like a rusty

pogo stick and you're not on a Springer, it might be time to take a peek at the forks. This is one of those checks that get overlooked by most folks. Usually it takes a leaky seal to draw the attention to that area. The extent of the maintenance and the interval is dependent on the year and model. As an example, factory service literature recommends changing the fork oil every 20,000 miles for a late model Softail. A full rebuild is only mentioned to remedy a problem such as a handling issue or blown seals. On the other hand, The Motor Company recommends rebuilding the forks on late model touring bikes every 50,000 miles. No mention of a fluid change interval. The logic behind this is twofold. A significant amount of labor is needed to access the forks in an FLT for a fluid change. Additionally, the fork wear and tear is assumed to be more significant on the heavier touring model. Rather than change the fluid every 20,000 miles the factory decided that it made sense to just do a full rebuild every 50,000. Fork oil changes are pretty straight forward if you follow the book. Here we'll take a look at what's involved in a rebuild.

For brevity's sake we're going to hit on the highlights to best illustrate the job. If you're doing the job yourself, always follow the service manual procedure to the letter. There are two special tools that you will need. The appropriate size seal installer and table shop do the work.

Remove the forks per service manual procedure. Remove the fork tube plug, spring,



and the drain screw. Drain the fork then remove the 6mm socket screw. This screw is what holds the damper tube to the fork tube. An impact gun will make this process easier as the damper tube will sometimes tend to rotate with the screw. If you don't have an impact gun, reinstall the spring and compress it slightly while removing the screw. The spring pressure will hold the damper in place. After removing the retaining ring from the top of the slider, the fork can be disassembled using a slide hammer action by extending and compressing the tube and

Clean and inspect all components. Unless the mileage is relatively low and the bushings look new, replace them while you're in



After that much effort you might as well be thorough! Also take a close look at the fork tube, especially if you had a seal leak. new seal. The seal driver will be used to install the new upper bushing, washer, and seal simultaneously. Also, you will need to do the aforementioned trick of applying

otherwise the damper tube will just turn with it. Some service manuals list a torque spec and some don't. 180 in/lbs will suffice. Don't forget to replace the copper washers. When filling the forks with new fluid,

there are two methods that can be used; volume (oz/cc) or fluid level (in/mm). Volume is pretty self-explanatory. Use a measuring device to ensure accuracy, such as a Ratio Rite or other product.



The level method involves adding a bit more than the specified volume of fluid and then drawing the excess out with a siphon. The siphon is attached to a tube marked with gradients that will indicate depth.



This must be done with the spring out and the fork tube completely collapsed. Pump the fork a few times to remove trapped air. After final assembly, install and test ride!

Ride safe!

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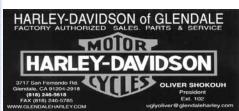

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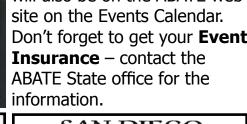
