

The state Legislature passed its first **REAL** balanced Budget for California in years. It's hard for me to remember the last time this happened! Last year, the phony unbalanced Budget, that Governor Brown rightly vetoed, was only passed so that the Assembly Members and Senators could get paid on time.

For motorcyclists, once again, our special fund called the Motorcyclist Safety Fund was not raided to help finance this year's budget. This is the fund that we pay \$2 into with our annual motorcycle registrations to fund the California Motorcyclist Safety Program (CMSP), and also subsidize the rider training program FORNIA RIDERS! fees for *NEW* riders under 21 years old.

The CMSP was one of the reasons Governor Deukmejian vetoed Assemblyman Dick Floyd's AB 36, the first helmet bill he got to the Governor's desk in 1988 - ONE OF OUR GREATEST **VICTORIES!**

Deukmejian's veto sent Floyd into a fit of rage and he cussed me out big time, in public, at a popular restaurant with legislators called Brannan's. It was located across the street from the Capitol,



and he went ballistic at noon, the day of the veto, with a full house enjoying their lunch and Floyd's performance - WHAT A GREAT DAY IT WAS FOR CALI-

I know I repeat this every month, but some riders still do not read my column each month. The bill to codify Lane Sharing, SB 350 by Senator Jim Beall, is STILL a two-year bill and will not be heard until next year.

I am pressing the Transportation Committees in both houses to pass out either, or both, AB 64 by Assemblyman Donnelly or SB 234 by Senator Mimi Walters to grandfather in aftermarket





"BLACK BOX" IN NEW VEHICLES: Congress failed to pass legislation that would have required manufacturers to install event data recorders (EDRs) in all

new vehicles, so a federal safety agency is using its rulemaking authority to mandate that all new cars sold in the United States be equipped with so-called "black boxes" capable of capturing what happened in the



CANTLY SAFER: A study carried out by the German Hohenstein Institute in Bönnigheim shows that motorcycle helmets could indeed be a lot safer if some other measurements would be taken into account, concluding that inner shell size alone is not

enough for providing the best protection-to-

fit ratio, and the head shape is just as critical. The Hohenstein Institute study narrowed the head shapes to 6 major categories, with an amazing width variance of 3.5 cm (1.37"), determining that one helmet size cannot possibly offer the best fit for all these head shapes, even provided the circumfer-

At this point, a quick snap shot explana-

formulated as 10w-40 is no thicker than 10 weight oil under winter (10w) conditions, meaning below freezing. The 40 means it is no thinner than 40 weight oil at 212° Fahrenheit. So, the first number tells us the performance of the oil at or below the temperature of freezing water, and the second number tells us the performance at the temperature of boiling water. The chemicals added to the oil to accomplish this are called Viscosity Index Improvers (VIIs). Expanding on this anymore would be like watching grass grow, or paint dry. You get the point! Lastly, follow your bike manufacturer's

recommendation for type and viscosity. Fossil oils for Harley-Davidson Big Twins are all different for the engine, transmission, and primary. There are a few synthetic oils that are formulated to run in all three systems in Harley-Davidson Big Twins. They are wet clutch compatible (suitable for bike?
