Cruel Shoes

While designing the Twin Cam engine, the Motor Company was faced with quite a few challenges, not the least of which was reducing emissions. When we think of emissions, we usually think of exhaust. While that is at the top of the list, noise emissions are a significant challenge to the engineering process. Ever increasing EPA restrictions on noise and exhaust emissions force manufacturers to rethink the design process.

Harley's reason for going back to two cams was simple. This allowed a reduction in the angle of the lifters and pushrods. The pre-Twin Cam engines had significant side loading of the lifters due to the angle of the pushrods, especially the front cylinder exhaust lifter. It was not uncommon to have one or more of those lifters go south before the 50,000 mile mark. The system to drive the new two cam set-up had to be different than the previous gear drives of the past in order to pass noise emissions. The answer was a "silent chain drive." Picture 1 shows the set-up used from 1999 to 2005.






The first systems from model year 1999 to early 2000 had trouble with cam bearing failures. It was discovered that the rear cam bearing, which was a ball bearing, could not handle the radial tension or side forces. The fix was a replacement with a roller bearing. It was also discovered that the tensioner shoes were wearing out beyond service life as early as 30,000 miles. There was no consistency in the shoe longevity. Some would last over 60,000 miles while some were completely gone by 30,000. The problem then becomes a cost issue as most shops charge one half to a full hour of labor to inspect the shoes. Most shops will recommend inspection every 20,000 miles.

In 2006 (Dynas only, 2007 all big twins), HD redesigned the cam support plate, chains, shoes, and oil pump. The new shoes were now utilizing a hydraulic tensioner, a much improved design over the spring tensioner it replaced. The chains were also changed to a roller style, which are less abrasive (see picture 2).

The good news for all you pre '06 folks is that there are several options to retrofit the new hydraulic system to your bike. Andrews sells conversion cams that can be used with the new plate and tensioners. Harley's Screamin Eagle line has a complete kit which allows the use of the pre 2006 cams. This is a nice option if you want to




continue to use your existing cams. Another option is the gear drive system offered by S&S (see picture 3). Although a bit more costly, there are no concerns with wear. They can be a bit noisy. Depending on gear fitment, a whine or tick similar to worn lifters can be heard. Gears should be measured to ensure the best fit possible. Pinion shaft run-out is a criteria with gear drives as well. Pay close attention to S&S's instructions. If run-out exceeds specifications, the gear drive system cannot be used (see picture 4).

Deciding which system to use depends on performance requirements, cost, and even annual mileage. If you're mostly interested in keeping your bike stock, and put very few miles on the odometer, why spend the cash? More radical set-ups would be better served with gear drives. Ask a reputable shop before spending that hard earned cash.

Intersection Double Trouble

Would you like to meet new people and try some exciting deathdefying aerobatics? No, not Bungee Jumping, just roll on into that next intersection! In any urban area about half of all collisions happen at intersections; most of them because someone did the wrong thing at a yield, stop sign or red light. A high percentage of motorcycle collisions occur when a car driver makes a bad left turn. Watch them!

When you are going through a crowded intersection, try staying as much out in the open as possible where you are visible to everyone. We will be in someone's blind spot about a thousand times a day, but the trick is to stay there as short a time as possible,

drop back or move forward. One of the worst blind spots on a big truck is just off the right-front fender. Also, if you are next to the truck or behind it, if you can't see the truck driver's face in the mirror, he or she can't see you. Can you make eye-contact with a driver at the next intersection? If not, consider that car to be double trouble.



Anyone changing lanes in an intersection creates a hazard. Many people doing a "Right On Red" forget the part of the law that requires "After a full stop and after yielding to anyone close enough to be a hazard". These are the same people who think a Stop Sign means "slow down", a Yield sign doesn't mean much at all, and a Yellow Light means "Go Real Fast".

Tailgating is a chronic and dangerous habit. If you need to make a sudden stop at an intersection, you can expect someone to be close behind you, very close! Many bikes are hit while stopped at a red light. As you are stopping, check the mirrors and flash your brake lights if you think the person when they don't. Many drivers just don't see motorcycles. We are shaped like pedestrians, so should catch peoples attention, but for some reason we really don't register. It's kind of like an airplane in the sky; people may hear it, they may look at it, but they don't really "see" it.

Look at that car at the next intersection waiting to make a left turn; are his wheel straight or already turned? Does he look aware and awake? Do you think he "sees" you?

If you expect everyone at the next intersection to make absolutely the worst possible mistake, then you are ready and can be pleasantly surprised ground. Be Aware and Ride Safe!

Unfortunately all of the laws passed in the world about DUI or DWI don't make a difference because those people just keep driving, and most of them keep driving and drinking. DUI is DOWN amongst younger drivers because of the different programs like MADD, and that is good. I don't care if someone gets drunk in their living room every night and blows a .08 or a .10 or a .90, as long as they stay the hell away from a vehicle. Once they get in or on a vehicle, then it is my danger and my concern. For some reason the judges do not take alcohol and driving seriously. Someone wrote yesterday that "no one that they know is "drunk" at a .08. Not "drunk" but certainly "impaired". Maybe they are not at the point where they wear a funny hat and fall off the bar stool, but the first thing to go at .08, is someone's judgment. And the first thing that the poor judgment tells them is "Hey, I'm ok to drive, or ride".

About twenty years ago a law was passed that anyone driving or flying commercially was considered DUI at .04, while they were on duty. We truckers really thought that was ridiculous and bigoted. Then one of the trucking magazines did a series of tests on two truck drivers, trying to prove that the law


was bad. They tested both drivers for skill and timing. Then they gave each driver drinks until they were blowing a .04 and then gave them skill and timing tests again. The one driver showed that his reaction time was 35 percent slower and the other driver's reaction time was 50 percent slower. So what they were trying to prove, the opposite results came out.



who is sober is traveling at 40 MPH, and an emergency occurs, they will travel 30 feet during reaction time before their foot ever touches the brake pedal. If the .04 alcohol increases their reaction by fifty percent, they will now travel 45 FEET during their

reaction time before they get to the brake pedal. That could make the difference between missing that motorcycle in front of them by ten feet or running over them by 5 feet. And if it is ME or YOU on that motorcycle, that matters!

Do you feel your state DUI laws are too stiff? We have been told that punishment in many other countries is much stiffer. Here is an unofficial list: Australia: The names of the drivers are sent Using the equation "speed times 1 1/2 to the local newspapers and are printed under the heading, "He's drunk and in jail." Malaya: The driver is jailed; if he's married, his wife is jailed too. South Africa: A 10 year prison sentence or the equivalent of a \$10,000 fine or both. *Turkey*: Drunk drivers are taken 20 miles from town by the police and forced to walk back under escort. *Norway*: Three weeks in jail at hard labor, one year loss of license. If the driver commits a second offense within five years, his license is revoked for life. Finland: Driver is automatically jailed for one year at hard labor. Sweden: Driver is automatically jailed for one year at hard labor. Costa Rica: Police remove plates from the offender's vehicle. Russia: License revoked for life. The Highway Patrol is under pressure to issue a lot more tickets than last year with at least 30% increase in fines over 2009, so beware of radar guns, highway and traffic cameras installed everywhere and rules.


