Lobbyist's Legislative Report

November 2 is upon us! I hope that every member of ABATE goes to the polls and votes on this important day. How lucky we are in this country, where we are allowed to form any political party we wish, and establish principles for which we stand. We don't have shootings, bombs or fear for our lives, as is commonplace in many other parts of the world, when we go to our polling places and exercise the freedom to choose our next Governor, US Senator and other State Office holders.

In California, we choose half of our Senators and all of the State Assembly. It trickles on down to many Mayors, City Council Members, County Supervisors and other Local officials, including School and Water Board Members. Many countries don't even have real elections — so how fortunate we Americans really are! We owe our Armed Forces members a **Special Thanks** for the job they do around the world, protecting our freedom to be able to safely ride to our polling place and vote on Election Day!

Our Governor, or "Benedict Arnold" Schwarzenegger, signed SB 435, the **ANTI-MOTORCYCLIST/ANTI-MOTORCYCLE**

NOISE Bill, on September 28. He could have simply vetoed SB 435 and stated in his veto message that since the bill does not take effect until January 1, 2013, he will let the next legislature and the new Governor deal with noisy motorcycles. Instead, he chose to shaft future motorcycle riders when they buy motorcycles after 2012 and have to worry about easily visible EPA noise compliant stampings on their mufflers.

We should be proud, however, of our legislative accomplishments, this year! We **KILLED A MOTORCYCLE SMOG BILL ON THE SENATE FLOOR!** Senator Pavley even gave us full credit when she presented her amended SB 435 in the Assembly Transportation Committee. *"ABATE killed the smog portion of my bill on the Senate Floor,"* stated Senator Pavley. Later, we killed the noise provisions of SB 435 that would have cost **all** riders with pipes **not** having matching Federal EPA noise standard stickers, a \$300 ticket (you would have to replace non-compliant aftermarket exhausts with stock mufflers sometimes costing upwards of \$800 **if** you could still find them). The \$300 ticket would have also been a moving violation, that is, a point on your DMV record.

Any cop could have stopped you just because he didn't see the EPA sticker on your mufflers while driving 70 mph down the freeway. A traffic enforcement officer, or meter maid, could have ticketed you when parked in any public area. Due to ABATE's efforts and pressure, **ALL OF THIS WAS REMOVED FROM SB 435!** *"Benedict Arnold" would have approved a much worse bill instead of what he did sign.* This experience should provide enough motivation to find an ABATE *Voter Guide* (it's on our website, for easy reference) and go work in a local campaign to elect and send more motorcyclist-friendly officials to Sacramento.

We did get AB 1848, by Assemblyman Martin Garrick, signed into law. AB 1848 makes it more difficult to steal our motorcycles. It will be illegal to be near a motorcycle with "pigtailed" that can be used to illegally

start our motorcycles without a key. It was sponsored by San Diego's District Attorney who said that unless a thief was sitting on the motorcycle holding a pigtail, he couldn't charge them and get a conviction. We were requested by Assemblyman Garrick, the Assembly Republican Floor leader and fellow motorcycle rider, **TO SUPPORT HIS BILL.** We took a position at the April meeting to support it, and were instrumental in its passage.

PLEASE SIGN UP FOR OUR LEGISLATIVE ALERTS! As of today, we have less than 10% of our members signed up to receive them (and many of those signed up aren't even ABATE members)! This is how I can send important information, instantaneously, when I need Assemblypersons or Senators pounded with phone calls, e-mails, faxes or personal visits to their district offices to tell them to quit screwing with motorcyclists! It is a very important tool help pass and/or kill legislation, so **PLEASE SIGN UP ON OUR WEBSITE TO RECEIVE THEM, TODAY.**

I will have a full Election Report in the next *Bailing Wire* issue as well as using our Legislative Alerts for updates. That's another good reason to sign up to receive them, today!

nal intention was to drain the swamp. For nearly the past 30 years, ABATE of California has labored hard to maintain freedom of the road for California's motorcyclists, and we have virtually worked our fingers to the bone, basically breaking even in terms of financial success and independence as we have struggled to pay the bills, keep the lights on and the doors open. Through no fault of anyone, that strategy has kept us ticking but it has done little else in terms of organizational growth or making us financially independent. We have struggled to make ends meet, and while we have always managed to stay one foot ahead of the bill collectors and creditors, we have little else to show for our efforts save our legislative accomplishments. It is time to turn our attention to making the necessary corrections to grow this organization in terms of a larger membership base, a healthier financial outlook, and a long over due corporate restructuring.

How can ABATE accomplish its goals? The first thing that I would point to is the need for men and women of de-

liberate will who put the necessary time and effort into creative efforts that will develop a master plan for ABATE of California to follow and grow prosperous under. We also need to begin to establish closer ties with like-minded organizations that can offer us support, outside knowledge and experience. One such beneficial relationship is our membership in NCOM. I would only say while financial support for advertisement has been great for ABATE of California, I believe that we should explore what further benefits we can gain from an expanded relationship with NCOM. Seminars, guest speakers, and information are only some of the possibilities to explore. In addition to NCOM, I would also point out that closer relationships with the MRF, other state's ABATE MROs, and other freedom of choice organizations would be likely to provide a wide range of benefits and advantages that we have been previously lacking in. We also need to put some serious thought and work into a corporate restructuring and developing financial plans to put us on a more independent financial footing. We need to seriously look at new and innovative ideas in this area.

It is time to break out of the box and establish our own plan, mapping out where we want to be in 1 year, 2 years, 5 years, and even 20 years from now.

Once we have established those goals, we must move from that planning stage to setting the machinery in motion to make those goals become realities and not just plans on a piece of paper. First we must become thinkers, then we must become planners, and then we must become organizational builders. While many of these things are easier said than done, until we undertake those first steps towards self-determination, we will always remain in the reactive mode and not the pro-active mode. It is time to begin planning for the future.

draws to a close, his swan song for California motorcycle riders is evident in the photo that sums up his feelings about our state's 1 million+ riders. Instead of simply vetoing SB 435 to kick the motorcycle noise issue “can” down the road to the next Governor and Legislature, like he recently did with the 100-day overdue budget, he signed SB 435. Luckily for him, his modified fishtail-muffled bike will probably escape being ticketed for the lack of muffler noise emission stamps because of SB 435 AMENDMENTS FORCED INTO THE BILL BY ABATE ----THAT EXEMPTS ALL EXISTING MOTORCYCLES AND EXHAUST SYSTEMS MADE BEFORE 2013. So much for The Terminator!

With the signing of SB 435, our motorcycle-riding Governor continues to disappoint over 1 million+ California riders. In 2008, he vetoed a modest bill to have Caltrans re-post “Motorcycles OK” freeway signs in HOV lanes, designed to alert drivers that they need to share HOV lanes with motorcyclists. 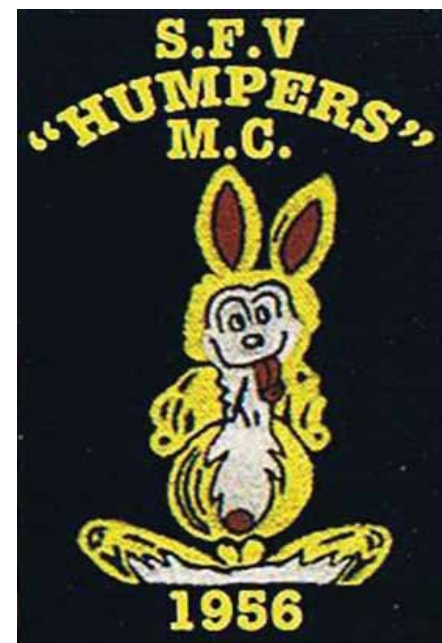

That's it for now. Be good ABATE Freedom Fighters and get a new member or two for the membership drive. Regards, Sporty.

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


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Pac/Lobbyist Report

Just got back from the State Board meeting in Sacramento and 14 hours in the saddle always gives me a little time to examine and scrutinize a few of our ABATE agenda items. We always seem to struggle with our Lobbyist funding and as it stands right now, our Lobbyist Fund is totally depleted. One of the items that jumped off the page for me at this meeting was the participation, or more importantly, the lack of participation of some of our Locals. We currently have 32 "active" Locals in California and 14 of the 32 have not contributed a single penny to our Lobbyist account during 2010. Even worse yet, of our 32 "active" Locals, 17 have not contributed a single penny to our State General account and 19 have not contributed anything to the PAC account this year.

Why? Why do we allow 44% of our Locals to contribute nothing to our contractual Lobbyist fund and 53% of our Locals to contribute absolutely nothing to our General fund? I'm not so concerned with the PAC fund because none of that money is used to pay for "obligated expenses". The PAC fund is used to "donate" to the candidates we are supporting, but ABATE is not obligated to donate anything, and our money and even more importantly your time spent helping a candidate in that effort is always sincerely appreciated but not mandatory. No funding just means we need to give more of our time to their campaign staff wherever they need it and believe me, they always need your volunteer time for something!

But let me get back to the axe I was grinding all the way home today. Our General fund is obligated to the day in, day out, expenses of our organization. It pays our office expenses, prints your Bailing Wire, pays for postage and UPS charges, your yearly renewal cards and pins, telephone and computer access lines, the list goes on and on, just like your home. And just like your house, our ABATE house has tried to cut expenses to the bone to get through these difficult financial times. Just like you, ABATE knows this is not the time to ask the boss (our members) for a raise because the money is just not out there. BUT - and this is what's so important, if I work for you I want to get paid for the hours I put in and 53% of the time ABATE is not receiving a dime of what's owed to us! No employee would work for free in the real world and ABATE of California should not be a "welfare" organization. These non-contributing Locals use our copyrighted name, our web site and Bailing Wire to solicit new members and advertise, use our tax ID and "not-for-profit" number to sanction their Local and even use our Policy and Procedure Manual and By Law's for their personal benefit.

Why should we (the contributing Locals) be expected to carry the load for these people - our own "welfare" members? Should we place these Locals on some type of sanctioned status? Should we institute some type of "work program" for the Locals that are unable to contribute financially? Possibly a volunteer status for the Local at the State Run, or the Northern or Southern Regional Rally? We must find a way to make

them accountable to the "Mother Ship" - ABATE of California. If we can't pay our "obligated and contractual" expenses because only 47% of our Locals are contributing, should we place the non-contributing Locals on an inactive status so we can cut out our "welfare expenses" and then institute a reorganization to ensure a better cash flow and a more secure future for our organization?



every effort to contribute in any way possible to ABATE of California. Unfortunately, I sometimes get the impression that some of our Locals are either not aware of this or purposely choose to ignore the By-Laws they swore to uphold. Their only concern is with their own obligations.

That's what happens when you spend 14 hours in the saddle and look for something to pass the time!

Maybe I've got white line fever but you've got to help me find an answer, a cure, for the sickness in our organization. These are just some of the ideas that ran through my head but I always try to channel the anger into something useful. First, ask your Officers if your Local has contributed this year and if not, why? Then give me a call at (760) 947-4700 or e-mail me at davesautorpair@aol.com and give me your thoughts and input on our funding crisis. The greatest asset ABATE has is our members and I'm sure you have some thoughts and ideas that will benefit all of us. 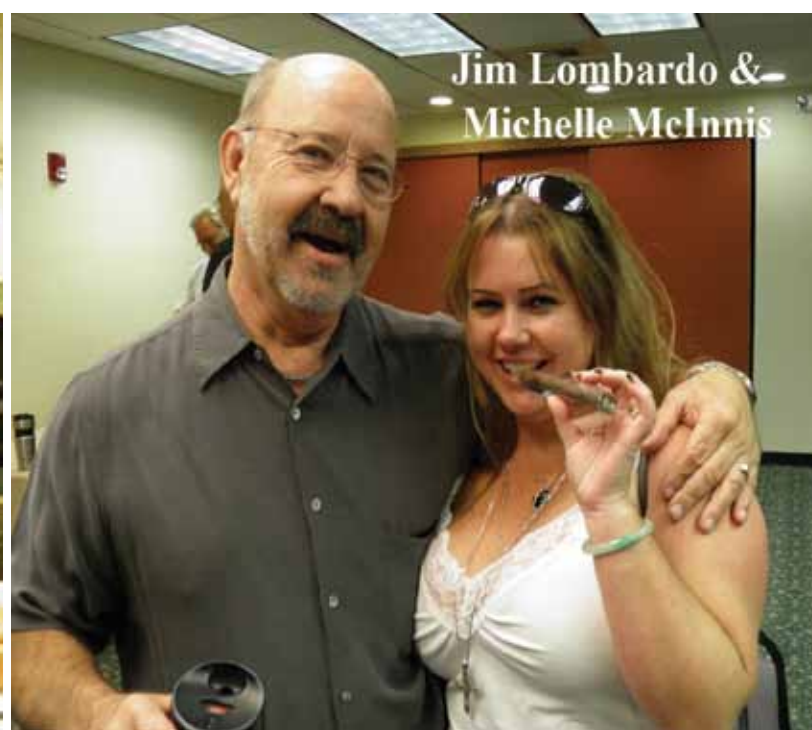

FEDS PUSH HELMET LAWS AND MOTORCYCLE-ONLY ROADBLOCKS:

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) is seeking applications from law enforcement agencies across the country to conduct federally-funded motorcycle-only roadside checkpoints.

Now mirrored in other states, "Motorcycle-Only Safety Checkpoints" were initiated in New York last year and are set up during large motorcycle rallies or near large biker gathering spots to check not only license, registration and insurance, but also for DOT-compliant helmets and legal exhaust systems. ABATE of New York is working with NY AIM (Aid to Injured Motorcyclists) attorney Mitch Proner on legal actions to halt these discriminatory roadblocks in the Empire State.

But police forces across the country may soon receive public funds to target motorcyclists, though U.S. Reps F. James Sensenbrenner, Jr. (R-WI) and Tom Petri (R-WI) along with several colleagues in Congress have written to Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood asking him to suspend funding of the federal grants for the NHTSA checkpoint program.

In addition, after learning that NHTSA recently testified to the Senate Committee on Commerce Science and Transportation that "The most important step we could take would be to assure that all riders wear a DOT-compliant helmet," according to NHTSA Administrator David Strickland, who added "NHTSA will actively work with Congress to promote helmet use," Congressman Sensenbrenner and fellow Congressional lawmakers have also introduced H. Res.

1498 which "supports efforts to retain the ban on the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's ability to lobby state legislatures using federal tax dollars and urges NHTSA to focus on crash prevention and rider education."

The US Defenders have joined with other state and national motorcycle groups in urging riders to contact their Congress members to support H. Res. 1498, and to write DOT & NHTSA to oppose federally-funded motorcycle-only safety checks. "This is one more piece of evidence of the constant profiling attempts targeting our community at large," said Escondido Paul, National Lt. Commander of the US Defenders, in issuing a nationwide Call To Action through all Confederations of Clubs and coalitions in every state. For further information, consult www.USDefenders.org.

BLACK MOTORCYCLISTS AT HIGHER RISK: African-American motorcyclists are more likely than others to die in crashes, even though they are more likely to wear a helmet, according to a study done to determine if race had anything to do with motorcycle crash mortality; and the results stood out in black and white.

Researchers at The Johns Hopkins Medical Institutions analyzed statistics from the National Trauma Data Bank of 68,840 people involved in motorcycle crashes from 2002-2006, and found that black motorcycle crash victims were 1.5 times more likely to die than similarly injured white riders.

The findings do not help support the push for helmet laws since African-Americans mortality rates were still 50% higher even though they were 30% more likely to wear a helmet; although the highest mortality rates are among African-American motorcyclists without helmets. Whites who weren't wearing helmets were less likely to be killed in crashes than blacks who wore protective headgear.

The study, published in the American Journal of Surgery, raises questions about the efficacy of injury prevention strategies such as state helmet laws that may not be protecting all riders equally.

"For reasons that we are still trying to figure out, one size of injury prevention does not fit all groups of people and just wearing a helmet is not enough," senior author Dr. Adil Haider says in a statement. "Helmet for helmet, African-Americans have more lethal injuries."

Haider suspects several factors -- such as lack of health insurance, reduced access to healthcare, poorer quality of care and a greater number of pre-existing illnesses/injuries -- may be combining to account for the survival gap.

It is possible, he says, riders of different races may prefer different types of helmets or style of motorcycles, suggesting that more research is needed.

MOTORCYCLE FATALITIES PLUMMET IN 2009: It's not surprising when accident rates increase in proportion to increased usage and number of miles traveled, but last year motorcyclist fatalities decreased more than any other category of road users despite more motorcycles being ridden more miles!

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's Fatality Analysis Reporting System reports that 4,462 riders died in 2009, 850 fewer than in the previous year, representing a 16% drop in fatalities despite a 5% increase in miles traveled and 4.5% increase in the number of motorcycles on the road. The Motorcycle Industry Council recorded half a million more motorcycles in use in 2009, up from 11 million in 2008, and according to the MIC 2009 Motorcycle Owner Survey, they were ridden 1.3 billion more miles.

There was also a decrease in motorcycle accident injuries, down 6.3% from 96,000 in 2008 to 90,000 last year.

Overall U.S. traffic fatalities hit the lowest level ever recorded since 1950 when the government began tracking such statistics and the 33,808 road deaths in 2009 was down 9.7% from the year before. All traffic accidents, fatal or not, declined by 5.3% between 2008 and 2009, though motor vehicle crashes are still the leading cause of death for those between the ages of 3 and 34, NHTSA said.

CALIFORNIA ENACTS ANTI-MOTORCYCLE NOISE LAW: Motorcycle-riding California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger has put his stamp of approval on a controversial law aimed at cracking down on motorcyclists who replace stock exhaust systems with aftermarket pipes that don't comply with federal EPA noise and emissions standards.

Under SB 435 by State Senator Fran Pavley (D-Agoura Hills), the Motorcycle Anti-Tampering Act makes it illegal for motorcyclists to remove and replace federally

required emissions equipment, and motorcycles manufactured after January 1, 2013 will be required to display a readily visible and unalterable label stamped into the pipes that indicates that they meet federal standards. Bikers will still be able to install aftermarket exhausts, but for bikes built after 2013 the replacement parts must be EPA-certified and permanently stamped.

Similar anti-noise laws have been enacted recently in Boston and Denver.

Illegal tampering with emissions systems in California will be a secondary violation, meaning that motorcyclists would have to first be pulled over for some other infraction before officers could inspect for the presence of the EPA stamp and issue a citation. First time offenders could face up to \$100 fine, but it will be considered a "fix-it" ticket and proof of repair would get the violation dismissed, though subsequent infractions could result in fines of up to \$250.

Pavley's original bill sought to include motorcycles in the state's SMOG emissions testing program, but after being stymied by intense lobbying by state and national motorcyclists rights organizations, she later reintroduced the measure to instead force motorcycles into compliance with existing federally-mandated sound and air pollution levels.

US SUPREME COURT TO RULE ON PROTESTS AT MILITARY FUNERALS:

A group of patriotic motorcyclists recently staged a counter-demonstration during the Arlington National Cemetery burial of a local Navy SEAL, parking motorcycles and revving engines to oppose a protest staged by members of the fundamentalist Westboro Baptist Church of Kansas.

Similar scenes play out across America, as a grieving family lays their loved one to rest, the funeral of a service member killed in action is disrupted by vocal protesters shouting vindictive and incendiary remarks at mourners and wave signs that read "Thank God for Dead Soldiers" and "God Hates the USA".

The motorcyclists, mostly veterans who are members of the Patriot Guard Riders, led the funeral procession and then strategically parked their bikes in between the family and the protesters and revved up their engines to drown their chanting, and saluted in respect

as the funeral cortege passed by giving them a thumbs up.

The church protesters, who contend that God is killing members of the military because of the nation's sins, often demonstrate at military funerals, and are now the subjects of a United States Supreme Court case that will decide if the Constitution protects highly offensive hate speech from civil claims filed by grieving relatives.

In *Snyder v. Phelps*, the father of a Marine killed in Iraq in 2006 was awarded \$5 million in his lawsuit against the church for "intentional infliction of emotional distress", but a federal appeals court overturned the ruling on free speech grounds, and now Albert Snyder is asking the High Court to reinstate the verdict.

Justices heard oral arguments in the case on October 6 and the Supreme Court is expected to render a decision late next spring.

ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES MORE DEADLY THAN MOTORCYCLES: If you think 3 or even 4 wheels are safer than 2, research suggests you think again as more people die after ATV accidents than after motorcycle accidents.

According to trauma surgeons and public health researchers in a presentation during the annual meeting of the American College of Surgeons, even when the severity of injuries was the same, the patients who had been riding ATVs were 50% more likely to die, and 50% more likely to need treatment in an intensive care unit and mechanical ventilation, compared to the motorcycle riders.

Researchers gathered information from a national trauma bank on nearly 60,000 accidents that occurred between 2002 and 2006 (13,749 from off-road motorcycle riding and 44,509 from ATV mishaps). There are somewhere between 800 and 900 deaths due to ATV accidents each year, according to ATVSafety.gov, a government web site.

Dr. Adil Haider, a surgeon from the Johns Hopkins Center for Surgery Trials and

Outcomes Research in Baltimore, Maryland, who headed the study, said he and his colleagues don't know yet why the ATV riders are more at risk than the motorcyclists.

"We think there are much more energy transfers when an ATV turns over, but we can't tell whether that is because of the stability of the vehicle or the weight of the vehicle as it rolls over on a rider," he said in a statement prepared before the presentation.

YEMEN BANS MOTORCYCLES DUE TO TERRORISM THREAT: Riding a motorcycle is a popular pastime in Yemen, but fearing al-Qaida assassins on wheels authorities in Yemen's Abyan Governorate, a growing terrorist stronghold in the Arabian Peninsula, have banned motorcycles from cities in the region's urban centers.

"Using motorbikes in terrorist operations to assassinate intelligence officers and security personnel have been massively mounted over the past nine months in the province," a Yemeni Interior Ministry official

told the Xinhua news agency following a series of assassinations by al-Qaida militants throughout Abyan and will affect some 5,000 two-wheeled vehicles.

"Motorcycles are typically used by terrorists and insurgents to deliver weapons directly if it's a suicide attack or to make a quick getaway," Dr. Theodore Karasik, Director for Research and Development at the Institute for Near East Gulf Military Analysis told The Media Line. "The banning of motorcycles is indicative of how the government, with help from US officers, is trying to cut down on the movements of al-Qaida members and tribal members who support them."

But while the Yemeni government has shown some concern over al-Qaida's presence in the country, this is a relatively recent development seen by many as a ploy to please the United States.

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Riding in a Cloud

The dictionary describes 'fog' as "a cloud that is in contact with the ground." Sooner or later we will encounter fog while out riding. There are some basic things to keep in mind, things that you are already aware of, such as we are unable to see as far up the road as we normally can; our windshield, face-shield or glasses, and our mirrors are misty which reduces our vision of things that are close to us; our depth-perception is hindered in the fog; and even though it may not be raining the roadway surface is also wet, which increases our stopping distance and increases our chances of skidding and encountering an unexpected improper dismount.

There's a dangerous problem that has been discovered by researchers in the past few years. A part of our brain becomes confused when we are driving or riding in the fog that causes us to think we are going slower than we really are, and makes us feel as if we are further away from things around us than we really are. Because we are riding in wet conditions with poor visibility, which calls for even more space around us than usual, this 'brain-fart' effect can cause us to pick up speed and be going faster and closer than we should be. The driver of the car coming up behind you is subject to the same confusion, and will be approaching closer and faster than is healthy for you.

Be ready to flash your brake lights to wake up the car coming in behind you. Because most of us don't have high intensity fog tail lights like the ones used in Europe, cars and bikes here can get closer

to each other in the fog before they realize the other vehicle is there. The headlights and taillights of our newer motorcycles are on all the time, and the headlights should be on low beam to be shooting under the fog, rather than high beam which just bounces off the droplets of water in the fog and back into our eyes. The cars around you should have their headlights on, but very often do not, and are just ghosts in the mist.

It is common in fog or blowing dust for people to bunch-up and get too close to the vehicles in front of them. They don't want to lose sight of the road, so they creep even closer to keep sight of the vehicle in front. The result is those hundred vehicle crashes that you see on the evening news. If the whole situation starts ganging up on you and you feel that the visibility is way beyond safe, just say 'fog it' and pull off the road until conditions improve. We should pull a good distance off the road, not just onto the shoulder, and turn your lights off. We want to become invisible so the next guy coming up the road behind us doesn't see our lights, think that we are on the right road, and follows us in.

To see or not to see; that is the question. Be Aware, Be Prepared and Ride Safe.

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A Near Miss or a Near Hit?

"That guy ran the red light and almost killed me! My light was green I had the right of way!" I didn't? That driver was supposed to yield the right of way to me, but if he doesn't, then I don't HAVE the right of way! The National Safety Council describes 'Defensive Driving' as "driving to save lives, time and money despite the conditions around you, and the actions of others." Another favorite of the National Safety Council describes an 'accident' as "when a tornado hits town and carries off your garage. Whereas a 'collision' is what happens when a motor vehicle hits something."

Whose fault is the collision? 'Fault' or 'blame' are words used by lawyers, not by safety professionals. That's because investigation reports show that most traffic crashes have driver error as their number one cause. Instead, we will become better riders if we think about preventability. The National Safety Council describes a 'Preventable Collision' as "one in which the driver(s) failed to do everything reasonable to prevent it." If I am involved in a collision and if there was ANYTHING I might have done differently to change the outcome of the collision: Was I checking left-right-left as I approached each side-street? Was I maintaining a full following distance, expecting the worst from the drivers around me and maintaining my escape routes? If there was ANYTHING I could have done differently and did not, then I am partially responsible for that collision. The insurance companies call that 'contributory negligence'. In other words, if the other guy came through a stop sign and hit me, BUT there was plenty of visibility, why didn't I notice that this car was not slowing

down as he approached the stop sign? And the insurance company might 'charge' the other car with 90% of the collision, and me with 10%. Or at an uncontrolled intersection, the chargeability might depend on which vehicle hit which vehicle, and where did they hit them, front, middle or rear.

The reason insurance companies use this gobbledygook terminology, is so they can try to find a way to bail out, and avoid responsibility for their client's actions, so they can avoid paying for the collision. By the same token, if we go around trying to duck any responsibility after we are involved in a collision or close call i.e. "That idiot pulled right out without looking", "It's that dummy's fault he looked right AT me and didn't SEE me", then we are trying to lay the blame totally on someone else, and we are doomed to repeat our involvement in the next collision. You have heard that type of person talking, "Yes, I've had 13 accidents, but only one of them was my fault." Whereas someone who rides defensively would consider, "Was I being observant enough? Should I have expected that driver to make that move? Traffic was getting a bit heavy, could I have used a bit more following distance? I have a cold; will I need more reaction time than usual? Was I in that guy's blind spot? Even though that driver messed up BIG TIME was there anything reasonable that I could have done to prevent the collision?" THEN we are using the situation as a learning experience!

"What doesn't kill me should make me a smarter rider."

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Tech Tips by Craig Griswold

Winterizing

This month's topic is season appropriate as we'll hit the highlights on winterizing your scooter. The first item on the list is your battery. Unless you're one of the few hardcore, all weather riders, your bike may sit idle for periods of time, especially during the winter. Batteries have a static discharge that will, over time, pull it down to just below useless. Motorcycle batteries are much more susceptible to this than their automotive counterparts. Battery tenders resolve this issue by providing a regulated charge that will bring the battery to a full state of charge and then reduce the output to maintain the battery without overcharging. If you don't

own a battery tender, GET ONE! They are reasonably priced, easy to use, and it's not uncommon to get 5 years of service or more from a good, maintenance free battery (we'll discuss battery types in a later article). Most tenders come with a pigtail that can be installed on the battery, making the connection a breeze.

Changing fluids and maintaining tire pressures are a few other things you can do. Last, and definitely not least, is the fuel. Fuel stabilizer is a wonderful thing. Gas sitting stagnant for prolonged periods does nasty things to fuel delivery systems, and doesn't burn worth a damn either! Add a shot of stabilizer (quantity varies by manufacturer, read the directions) and run the engine for a few minutes to distribute. You can also drain the fuel, but the former option keeps you ready for that unusually warm day that may spring up out of nowhere.

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Crossroads Crunch

Do you want to meet new people and try some exciting, death-defying aerobatics? No, not Bungee Jumping, just roll on into that next intersection! In any urban area about half of all collisions happen at intersections; 22% of them because someone did not yield at a stop sign or red light. A high percentage of motorcycle accidents occur when a car driver makes a bad left turn. Watch for them! Are his wheels straight or turned? Is he on the car phone? The new car phones just clip onto someone's ear and we don't get the tip-off of seeing their hand up next to the side of their head. Does he look aware and awake? Does he SEE you?

Be visible: When traffic is heavy, car drivers often jump back and forth from lane to lane and often don't check the blind spots around their vehicle. Be conspicuous: In daytime heavy traffic a headlight modulator or running a high beam can cause you to be seen quicker. When you are entering a big crowded intersection, stay out in the open as much as possible where you are visible to most of the drivers. Be visible! When you are coming to a stop at an intersection, the

traffic coming in behind you is where your hazard is. Flash your brake lights, be visible, but be ready to scoot!



We will be in someone's blind spot about a thousand times a day, but the trick is to stay there as short a time as possible - drop back, move forward, or change lanes. One of the worst blind spots on a big truck is just off their right-front corner. Big trucks have big convex mirrors to help the driver

see along the sides of the truck, but motorcycles show up as just a little blurb. If you are using a high beam headlight you are more visible to them.

When you see a car at the next corner, consider them to be potential trouble. Can you make eye contact with them? If not, for whatever reason, consider them to be double trouble! Anyone changing lanes in an intersection creates a hazard. Many people doing a "right on red" forget the part that requires them to make a full stop. These are the same folks that think that an amber light means "go real fast". The last vehicle into the intersection on a yellow and the first in on a green are usually those involved in a collision. YOU KNOW THAT PEOPLE JUST DON'T SEE MOTORCYCLES! If you expect everyone at the next intersection to make the worst possible mistake, then you are ready and can be pleasantly surprised when they don't.

Now you have a better chance of getting through that intersection with both wheels on the ground. Be Aware, Ride Straight, and Ride Safe!

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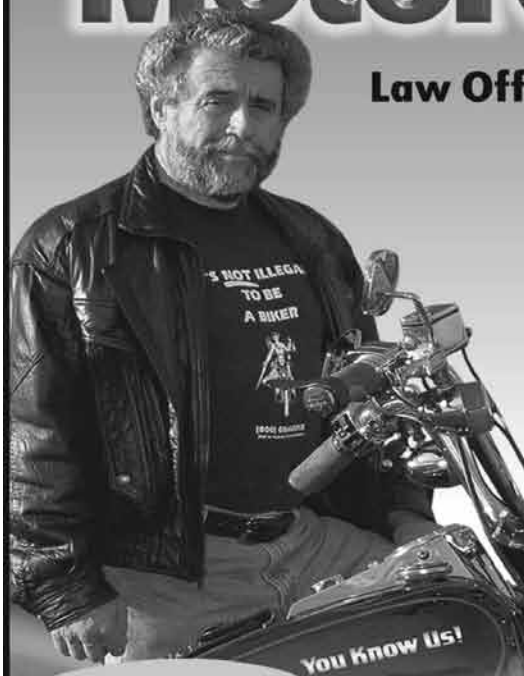
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BREAKDOWN? GREAT DEALS!

We all know the feeling we get when we are riding toward an intersection and see a car waiting to make a left turn in front of us. The driver appears to be someone well on in years, wearing a pair of really thick glasses, leaning forward to peer through the windshield..."Uh Oh"! Our preservation instincts are ready with throttle or brakes in case the situation goes bad.

We are not discriminating, because younger drivers can make mistakes just as easily. Teen drivers have as high an accident rate as the over-70 crowd. Beside vision, older folks have more of a problem judging the distance and speed of an approaching vehicle, have more of a problem with night vision and their reflexes are slower. On the plus side, according to the Insurance Institute of Highway Safety, older drivers have been involved in less and less collisions over the past ten years. The reasons include the laws of 18 states that are requiring a closer watch on driver's licenses and less time between renewals after a certain age; and the fact that more older drivers are choosing to limit their driving to areas and times of day that they feel comfortable with.

Which brings us to 'us'. "A biker doesn't stop riding because he or she gets



older; they get older because they stop riding". I know there are a lot of people who get to a certain point and you just don't see them out there on the road anymore. Unless you know them, you don't know if they had an incident or if they just reached that point. More and more folks in the baby-boomer age bracket are showing up on three-wheeler trikes. My personal hero is the 83 year-old

guy in the news who crashed his motorcycle into a cow at midnight on Wildcat Canyon Road. When I reach 83 I'll be lucky if they let me out of the house!

The people who don't admit to aging, "I'm just as good as I was when I was twenty," will go down in a blaze of glory one day. But the folks who realize that their reflexes are slower, and their night vision and glare recovery take more time, and then compensate for the liability with more following distance - they are ahead of the game.

You have seen the folks that can't find their keys, or hat, or left shoe and you wonder if they'll be able to find their brake pedal when they need it in a hurry. The more that we don't use our brain cells, the quicker they die off. Well, we can exercise our brain in just the same way that we exercise other muscles. Challenge your brain: Eat with your opposite hand; change the position of your wall clock or wristwatch; put on a blindfold and walk slowly through your house; find some neat brain games on your comput-

er at <http://games.aarp.org/>. Make your brain work for you!

You can do the same type of exercise for your eyes. Blink often; breathe deeply - your eyes need oxygen; if you are riding on long trips or reading or working at a computer, look up, look away, look back. Good nutrition builds strong eyes. Do carrots help your vision? The WWII Night Pilots thought so. Besides, have you ever seen a bunny wearing glasses? When you are sitting somewhere, exercise your eyes with the 20/20/20 method every 20 minutes look 20 feet away for 20 seconds. The younger you are when you start exercising your brain and eyes, the sharper you will stay.

You may decide when it is time, for your own safety and others around you, to park the bike. Or you can follow the credo of "you won't get my motorcycle keys until you pry them out of my cold, dead hand".

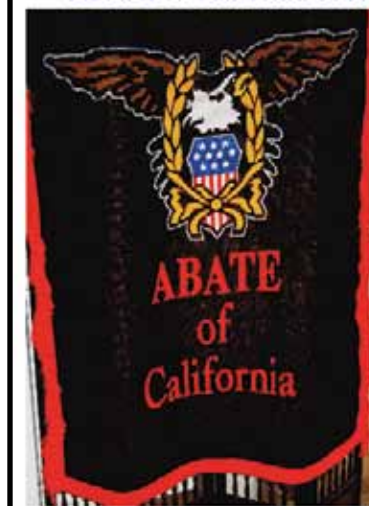
