Lobbyist's Legislative Report



Well, wouldn't you know it, for the third year in a row Governor Schwarzenegger has called another Special Session to deal with our chronic, on-going Budget Crisis. Now that he's a lame duck Governor, the real numbers are out on how deep the California Budget hole is: \$25 Billion! He now hands this off to newly re-elected Jerry Brown. How this affects us as motorcyclists is **CHAOS** in the Capitol! Hearings will be set and routinely cancelled, bills pass that shouldn't, and bills we want passed don't always happen because of the chaos.

The Legislature returns on December 6. I have been invited to join the new Republican Leader, Connie Conway, and meet the newly-elected members of her caucus at the Hyatt Hotel (across the street from the Capitol) before session and then watch their swearing in ceremonies on a live TV feed from the Assembly Floor.

The other leaders of the Legislature are John Perez, re-elected Speaker of the Assembly, Darrell Steinberg, returning Presi-

MEMBERSHIP REPORT



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


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Executive Director's Report |

Paid for and produced by the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee, the smear piece ends with, "We don't need a politician who rides with gangs." The Palm Beach Post reported that the Florida Democratic Party said a West supporter was wearing a South Florida Confederation of Clubs patch, and that confederation "has ties to the Outlaws organized crime syndicate."

West (R) is indeed an active motorcyclist who writes a regular political column for a local South Florida biker magazine "Wheels on the Road" that supported his bid, and the Tea Party favorite did have members of the Outlaws Motorcycle Club providing security during his campaign, but the mudslinging appears to be the desperate last-gasp tactics of incumbent Rep. Ron Klein (D) to hold on to his House seat.

The school board is mulling over the recommendation, which is not mandatory.

School administrators are expected to drive their personal vehicle for work purposes, but it hadn't occurred to district officials to dictate what kind of vehicle they drive, said Eagle Point schools Superintendent Cynda Rickert, adding that "We don't know if the board will move forward on a policy not allowing you to drive a motorcycle if you are doing school business."

OMG: Distracted driving apparently causes fatal crashes affecting bikers and drivers of light trucks more than any other group on the road, according to 2009 statistics from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). Though the statistics don't break down which operator was distracted, only that "distracted driving" affected one or more drivers in fatal crashes, you can be sure there aren't too many bikers distracted by talking or texting on a cell phone while riding their bikes.

















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
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
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The Bigger They Are, The Harder They Hit

Here's some news: Numbers of motorcycle registrations have been rising steadily, more than ever before. Now here's some good news: The number of motorcycle accidents has been falling steadily, less crashes, less injuries, and less property damage-only crashes. And now for some bad news: Up until 2009 motorcyclist fatalities have been on the rise. The numbers don't seem to go together! What's up?

In reading a Special Report by Wendy Moon published in Motorcycle Consumer News, (copyrighted) shows that the rise in numbers in motorcyclist fatalities is in

direct relationship to the rise in sales of Light Truck Vehicles (which includes Sport

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25051 Main St. Capay, California Utility Vehicles). The sale of LTVs/SUVs started to rise dramatically in 1998, which was the year the motorcyclist fatalities began to increase. In 2002 there were three average autos to each one Light Truck Vehicle (or SUV), and yet the number of motorcyclist fatalities are almost equal in number during collisions with LTVs/SUVs or automobiles. A motorcyclist is 2.4 times more likely to die in a collision with an LTV.

The amount of physical damage done to a motorcyclist is greater in a collision with a Light Truck Vehicle for several reasons; instead of the (average) auto bumper colliding mostly against a motorcyclists body below the belt, breaking hips and legs, an LTV/SUV's bumper is much higher - high enough to make the initial strike to a motorcyclist into the area of the thigh, waist and torso, creating a much more likely chance of internal injuries. In years gone by, people would describe a collision that happened when a bike ran into the side of a car as: "yeah, the biker flew right over the car." If we run into the side of a much taller SUV, we'll probably just smash dead-on into the side of the vehicle. The Light Truck Vehicle or Sports Utility Vehicle weighs more than an average auto, creating more footpounds of force when striking something, and most vehicles that are considered an LTV or SUV have a rigid-steel frame-rail

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delivering a much more solid hit than the Uni-Body crumple-design of modern autos.

Now, we're not sitting here talking about terrible-horrible dangerous vehicles which should be banned, because most bikers that I know could drive one of these vehicles forever and never run over anybody. The problems occur when someone who has been driving a small auto for most of their lives, now gets into one of these big, popular, status symbols and doesn't realize that along with taller and higher and wider comes a GREAT increase in blind spots!! And a GREAT increase in their responsibility to other motorists. They can't see us approaching as well, and totally lose sight of things when they get close, as shown by the records in 2002 when 58 children were run over and killed by their own parents with the family SUV. They can make vehicles as big as they want, I don't care if they drive Earth Movers down the street, but it would certainly be a nice thought if the people who bought the Light Truck Vehicles were informed of their dangers, and knew

enough and learned how to drive them properly and safely.

So, these big vehicles are here to stay, until they are made extinct by rising gasoline prices or the whims of fashion. Therefore it is our

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responsibility to ourselves to recognize the blind spots all around these LTV/SUVs and not spend any longer than necessary around them and be ready to let them know with our lights or horn that we are there, and be ready to move OUT of a blind spot on a half-second notice if the driver seems not to see you, or if the vehicle seems ready to move towards you. The right-rear wheel area of an SUV is an especially high target area and, when stopping in a line of traffic, it's not a bad idea to stop off to one side of the lane where you are not quite as much of a target, and where you can scoot out of the way if you see someone in the mirror who

Two-Up or Two-Down

If I want to go a million miles an hour, play Rocky Racer in the mountains and take chances on wiping out in a curve, well that's my choice. Once I put a passenger on the back of my bike though, my responsibility increases a thousand-fold and it becomes my main job to get that passenger home in one piece.

If you take a passenger who has not been on your bike before, don't assume that they know what to do. Lay out the ground rules: They should not do any leaning on their own, just stay level with you; their feet stay on the pegs until you tell them otherwise; no shifting their weight around, especially in curves and at low speed; and tell them that you will say "stopping" if you need to make an unexpected quick stop, so it doesn't take them by surprise and you end up shoved up onto your gas tank. You can assign them the important job of waving at other bikes.



With a passenger the center of gravity of the motorcycle is now more towards the rear, and maybe higher depending on the design of the pillion, or passenger seat, and there is more work for the back brakes to do. On downhill grades there is less traction on the back wheel so cornering is different, and on uphill starts it is easier to do an unexpected wheelie. Your stopping distance is increased, so you will need more

following distance and earlier slowing when approaching curves and stops. Have you checked your tire-pressure recently? Overload causes hot tires, hot tires cause blow-outs and blow-outs cause improper dismounts.

If someone doesn't have years of experience riding a bike, they should not consider carrying a passenger, but a lot of people bum rides for a big run. If you are riding in a crowd, and don't know the experience of the rider and passenger on the bike next to you, don't stay near them.

Check your passenger's clothing; you are not allowed to toss them overboard if they melt their new plastic designer boots into your new chrome tailpipe! Long coats, scarves, and other floppy things shouldn't be allowed near the back wheel. A drunk passenger can cause a fatality just as quick as a drinking rider - tell 'em to take a taxi.

Ride one or ride two, but RIDE SAFE!

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
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Thunder and Lightning!

The forecasters are predicting thunderstorms in different parts of the state this season and so there are a few things to think about while we are riding. Lightning has a tendency to strike the tallest thing around. When we are riding down the middle of the road, we are probably the tallest thing around and your rubber tires will not insulate you from being electrocuted.

If the sound of the thunder and the flash of lightning are one-second apart, the lightning is about one mile away from you. This is WAY too close for you to be outside. In a building is the best place to be. Hiding under a big tree to stay dry will keep me out of the rain, but I am now standing under the tallest thing around and have become part of the perfect lightning target - "KABOOM"! It would seem that under a concrete highway overpass would be pretty safe from lightning. The only hazard I have heard of about hiding out under overpasses is the threat of cars not seeing you and

running into you. One rider noted that you would probably be more visible near the far end of the overpass where you are back-lit from the outside.



Here is the best info I have seen to date concerning riding motorcycles and thunderstorms. (Thanks to the author who is unknown.). DO NOT ride into a lightning storm. If you absolutely cannot get to a safe building, here are some last resort

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choices. If you wait out the storm below an overpass, do not touch steel girders. Move away from your bike and remain on dry surfaces if possible. Overpasses are engineered structures and are likely to be properly grounded. Although an overpass is probably higher than the surrounding landscape, if it is struck by lightning the electrical current should be channeled into the ground. Stay away from water, stay away from any metal surfaces and if you are sheltering under a bridge; be alert for any rising water. If High Voltage electrical tension wires cross a road, you may want to seek shelter directly under these wires; the lightning will seek them out instead of you. Do not get too close to the large metal towers that hold these wires up, stay at least 50 feet away. Electric companies design these high tension wires for lightning strikes, if lightning should strike the wires or towers, the current is designed to safely go deep into the ground.

If you are caught in the open and lightning is occurring within 5 miles, (that's five seconds between thunder sound and

lightning), stop, move fifty feet away from your bike, (you know, that big metal target). and try to find a ditch or low spot to sit in and wait out the storm. You are not safe in these areas, just marginally safer than in the open. Lightning often strikes outside the area of heavy rain, and may occur as far as 10 miles away from any rainfall. You are in danger from lightning if you can hear thunder. Many strong thunderstorms produce hail. If you can't get inside, or if you feel your hair stand on end, which means lightning is about to strike, hurry to a low, open space immediately. If there are no reinforced buildings in sight, and you can take shelter in a car, do so. Keep car windows closed and avoid convertibles. Rubber soled shoes and rubber tires provide no protection from lightning. However the steel frame of a hard-topped vehicle provides increased protection if you are not touching metal.

If lightning hits near you, and does not kill you, you will have some GREAT stories to tell for the rest of your life!









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




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
