


Lobbyist's Legislative Report

As this article is being written, there's still no solution to the \$25 billion state budget shortfall, but our Sacramento legislators still had enough time to introduce over 2,350 bills, ABATE's two bills among them!

Executive Director's Report

Greetings Brothers, Sisters, & Friends: I am writing to you this month from the heart. Tough times are upon us as an organization. We are not alone; individuals, entire families, other organizations, as well as local and state governments are all feeling the financial crunch of these tough times. As we've all heard many times, tough times call for tough choices, and the Board of Directors of ABATE of California is faced with making some tough calls right now to insure the survival of this organization. Some may not be too popular with all of the decisions that are being made but let me assure you that they are being made from economic necessity. I can personally attest to how tough life can be for folks in these times having experienced my own personal trials over the past couple of years. Recently, things improved for me with a new job and it has given me a sense of increased optimism for the outlook of ABATE.

I can't think of a single member of the Board of Directors of ABATE of California who has not been impacted by the financial downturn that America has been experiencing. Nevertheless, your Board of Directors has continued to work for the betterment and financial solvency of this organization, often at our own personal expense and with much time and effort invested. We do this because we believe in what ABATE of California represents, what ABATE has accomplished, and what ABATE has yet to accomplish. While there are many motorcycle groups and organizations out there, none have played the pivotal and significant role that ABATE has in fighting for the rights of motorcyclists in the State of California. Unfortunately, our dedication and hard work alone is not enough, and we need participation from everyone and all the Locals in the form of financial support.

In order to continue to operate with a balanced budget, the Board of Directors has made cuts where we can

but making cuts is not the only answer to our financial problems. Locals are going to have to come into increased compliance as well and contribute to necessary expenses such as Directors and Officer's insurance and to the Lobbyist Share program. Currently many Locals are not contributing their fair share to these expenses and it puts an unfair burden upon both the State office and the Locals that are contributing to fund these essential budgetary expenses. In addition, Locals need to comply with their quarterly reports to insure that they are covered by the D & O insurance. The D & O insurance is a yearly expense to each Local of approximately \$60 and the Lobbyist Shares are \$45.45 a month per share for each Local.



I am asking that every Local who has not already done so to send in your share of the D & O premium, and for every Local who is not contributing to the Lobbyist Shares to begin to send at least one share per month. Pass the hat or start a cussing fund or create a dollar donation at each monthly meeting but each Local should be contributing at least \$45.45 a month towards the Lobbyist fund. If every Local was contributing at least one share per month, we would have \$1499.85 a month going into the Lobbyist fund and that would Kampground, 16530 Stoddard Wells Road solve one financial problem for us. \$45.45 a month per Local is fairly inexpensive for what it provides us in Sacramento!

For far too long there has been a lackadaisical attitude among some of our Locals to not contribute to these essential budget items. That attitude needs to change and I am asking all Local Presidents to

take these matters up with their Local boards and members and start the ball rolling to help put us back on track to financial solvency. I know that many new officers and members may be unaware of these obligations but it is time renew our commitments to the guiding principles upon which ABATE was founded. Locals are free to raise revenue and are encouraged to do so but since Locals are operating under the not-for-profit tax-structure of ABATE of California, it is the responsibility of each Local to help support the parent organization by contributing to the various funds we have set-up to operate the corporation.

In addition, the Board of Directors would like to see each Local commit to holding at least one fund raising event per year that is dedicated to raising money for the General Fund. Folks, money won't solve all of our problems but it sure does grease the rails that this train runs on. We are all in this together and we all need to pull together as a unified team working in concert with one another to insure that ABATE of California can continue to do the work of safeguarding our rights as motorcyclists. As we all know, there are an incredible number of motorcycle related events out there every weekend, all of them competing for a limited number of dollars. Therefore, I would also encourage Locals to support each other by attending their ABATE events, which not only fosters good will among our membership but it also keeps our money flowing in the right direction to help us most. Charity begins at home.

With that thought in mind, I would like to close for this month by reminding all that the annual Spring Appeal for donations will be arriving in your mailboxes shortly and that this year's Southern Regional Rally will be held on Mother's Day weekend, May 6, 7, & 8 at the Shady Oasis in Victorville.

Please be generous in supporting the appeal and by making plans to attend the annual ABATE Southern Regional Rally fund raiser. We look forward to seeing you there.

This will be a major victory for motorcycle riders, who are being singled out for profiling. We will need letters and emails on this bill as well! Special Elections: There is a special election runoff in the 4th Assembly District to replace current state Senator Ted Gaines for the Assembly seat he just vacated. Beth Gaines, his wife, won the Republican primary and is in a runoff with Dennis Campanale, a local Democratic. The District has a

> Albert Snyder sued regarding the intentional infliction of emotional distress at the funeral of his son, and won an \$11 million jury award that was later reduced by a judge to \$5 million, but the verdict was overturned by a federal appeals court that ruled the Constitution shielded the church members from liability. The Supreme Court's decision upholds the appeals court ruling that threw out a \$5 million judgment to the dead Marine's father.

palities have also passed funeral-protest ordinances at the local level.

RIDING OUT THE RECESSION:

With gasoline prices approaching \$4 a gallon, commuters are turning to more fuel efficient motorcycles to save money. Sales and interest are up across the country, and many motorcycle dealers anticipate the popularity of motorcycles to increase even more.

Signs that the two-wheeled world is getting back on the road to recovery are coming from not only improving motorcycle sales, but also by the financial health of bikers themselves. Fewer bikers appear to be making late payments or defaulting on their motorcycle loans, according to a report issued by Fitch Ratings, a credit rating agency working with Harley-Davidson's Financial Services (HDFS) division.

In addition, the report also notes the improving market for previously owned motorcycles is again gaining strength, in part due to reduced inventory levels at dealers. This would allow for any repossessed motorcycles to be sold for a better price than they may have the year before.

NEW JERSEY LIFTS BAN ON SUNDAY MOTORCYCLE

New Jersey motorcycle dealers are rejoicing that they can now sell bikes on Sundays. Governor Chris Christie signed a bill into law allowing the Sunday motorcycle sales on March 3rd; though the measure does not affect the state's ban on Sunday automobile sales, nor does it apply in Bergen County where Blue Laws continue to prohibit the sale of most nonessential items on Sundays.

State Senator Donald Norcross introduced the legislation after a Camden County dealership complained about losing customers to stores in nearby Pennsylvania and Delaware as a result of the Sunday ban, adding that most motorcycle buyers tend to make purchases on weekends.

Spring Has Sprung

Old Man Winter is melting away and the good riding days are upon us. Those of you who have been riding all winter will be able to do so with a lot less clothing, and those of you who have not been able to do much winter riding will be suffering from PMS (Parked Motorcycle Syndrome) and will be itching to get out on the road.

How has your bike weathered the winter? Are there any cracks in the tires? Do the tire stems look sound? Give them a twist. How about any cracks in those rubber hoses or chafing on any electric wires? Is there anything on the bike moving that shouldn't, and does everything move that should? Tighten it, lube it, and kick it a couple of times.

There are some bike owners who sat out the cold months in front of the TV. and who will be out there on the first warm day showing off, and end up in a ditch or shoving the rider next to him into oncoming traffic. Be it riding, skiing, or playing the fiddle, if I haven't done much of it for three months, then you're not going to do it extremely well. If someone hasn't been riding very much, they should be aware of their limitations and work into it gradually. They may even want to pop down to the local MSF training area and spend a day on an Experienced Rider Course like the BRC-2, www.msf-usa. org. (The Motorcycle Safety Foundation

is a member of ABATE.) It's good for tuning up skills and costs a lot less than most chrome parts you could buy for your bike. Besides, a good rider never stops learning.

Is some club hosting a big spring ride? Be aware of who you're riding next to in that group. If you don't know them, don't ride near them. If they do something stupid, tell them about it and then make them go ride somewhere else. Don't worry, their feelings have probably been hurt before.

The flowers are blooming and the bees are buzzing. Many allergy medicines will slow your reaction time considerably. Read the label, "Don't operate heavy machinery" isn't just referring to a bulldozer. Because of the spring run-off, we can expect some washed-out sand right around the next bend in the road. On some of those back canyon roads there is a constant trickle of water across the road and there may be moss growing under the water, which is about a hundred times more slippery than sand.

So Spring has Sprung! Enjoy the weather, enjoy the roads. Let's get in the wind and RIDE!



with at least two years' riding experience,
would be exempt from the law and not
have to wear a helmet.

ABATE of California is leading a massive grass-roots effort and you are being asked to contact your legislators to urge passage of this bill.

We applaud Assemblyman Norby's bill, thank him for his support and look forward to working with him in the future.

























Tech Tips by Craig Griswold

This series of Tech Tips will shed some light on cams, including terminology, technical specifications, applications, and installation tips. This will benefit both the home mechanic as well as the non-mechanic in making an educated decision when the horsepower bug bites. We get more questions on cams than any other performance topic. Exhaust systems are probably a close second.

Here in part one we'll cover common terms which we hope will assist in understanding subsequent discussions.

Bolt In: This is a common term used to describe mild performance cams that can be installed with no other engine modifications (heavier valve springs, rocker box clearancing, etc.)





Lift: In the cam specification, intake and exhaust lift are the actual valve lift. This amount of lift is the product of the maximum lobe height and the rocker arm

Duration: The amount of time, expressed in degrees of crankshaft rotation, the valve is open. One of the most critical, and often times overlooked, specification for a cam. Most commonly measured at .053" of lift at opening and closing, although this can vary by manufacturer.

Overlap: Also measured in degrees of crankshaft rotation, the amount of time the exhaust and intake valves are both open. Stock cams generally have little to no (and sometimes negative!) overlap due to emissions.

Lobe Separation Angle (LSA): Just as the name implies, this is the angular separation between the intake and exhaust lobes.

In part two, we'll discuss how all these terms come into play, and bring the cam selection picture into focus. Better Than Average

The motorcycle riders that I know wouldn't be considered "average" people by any stretch of the imagination. Their attitudes and personalities are strong and individual, their choices of machines vary widely in style, design, function and power, and even amongst riders, there does not seem to be such a thing as an "average" rider. We work at it. And so to maintain that image we should certainly work at NOT being "average" in our riding skills.



The average auto driver really doesn't have much of a clue about what's going on around them, and the average driver is involved in a collision about once every five years. The average following distance

used is nowhere near the distance needed to slow or stop in time if the driver in front hits their brakes hard, because the distance needed to slow or stop a moving vehicle is a lot further than the average driver realizes. When the average driver changes lanes, they usually steal the following distance of the car that they moved in front of, thus putting themselves into harm's way or they make lane changes into the next lane too close behind another vehicle, putting them into a good position to become road kill.

The average drivers don't check their mirrors very much, and they'll often make a move without checking the blind spots around them, or even know where those blind spots are. The average driver doesn't consider space, weather or light conditions. With their "Me First" ego attitudes they assume that everyone sees them and knows what they're thinking about doing, and they don't expect other vehicles around them to make any sudden or unexpected moves. The average driver is paying attention to almost anything else except the patterns and action of the traffic around them, and when they have a cold or had a bad night's sleep, they don't realize their perception and reaction time will suffer for it, and that they will need to allow more following distance to compensate. More than thirty percent of fatal collisions involve alcohol, and alcohol contributes greatly to single-vehicle motorcycle fatalities.

Many drivers and riders think that a couple of drinks won't affect their operation of a vehicle and the first sense affected by alcohol is a person's judgment.

As riders, we need to be better than average - a LOT better - so that we can keep ourselves from being involved in collisions caused by those average drivers. Because when a motorcyclist is involved in a collision we suffer more than the average amount and severity of injuries - a LOT more!

Do you practice turning and unexpected stops along the way as you ride? On the weekend there are some courses available at StreetMasters, www.streetmasters.info.com, or the new Advanced Rider Course (ARC) by the Motorcycle Safety Foundation, www.msf-usa.org. That ARC course, done for the military as "Sportbike" and now available to the public, is said to be challenging for experienced riders.

Here is a link to a quick Rider Perception quiz that has some good info; it contains a "Road Sign test" and a "Collision Traps" test, http://www.msf-usa.org/riderperception/. And if you would like to check out some good reading, there is a great book titled *Proficient Motorcycling...The Ultimate Guide to Riding Well* by David L. Hough, from Bow Tie Press.

Let's work at building and keeping our riding skills and techniques at a point way beyond average. Knowledge is Power! Be Aware! Be Alert! And Be Exceptional!







Blowing in the Wind

Do you want to talk about exciting!! You're toolin' down the road on your bike on a beautiful sunny day when out of the blue comes a 4' X 8' piece of plywood, flipping off the roof of a car, tumbling through the air at you! Wow!! Super Adrenaline Rush!!! Do I have time to move to another lane? Is someone in the next lane? Will the plywood shift to

another lane before it lands? If I have to hit it, at what angle should I try to hit it? If I brake hard enough to avoid it, will the car behind me have enough room to stop before he squishes me? Decisions, decisions, decisions, and you only have about one second to make them.

Seeing the problems a little earlier would be a definite advantage. Are you aiming far enough up the road to see cars swerving around something or to see a bunch of brake lights come on all of a sudden? Just about everybody is driving a van or SUV these days. If you're following one of those, you can't see through it, so leave enough following distance to see around it. Do you have enough space to stop or accelerate out to someplace safer?

The most common foreign objects to find lying on the road are bungee cords, and the hook on those can puncture a tire. The next most common things to find lying on the road are the things that bungee cords were holding down. As out the cargo on the vehicles in front of

us. If we can't see any visible tie-downs, we don't stay there! The average driver has no clue as to how much force the wind of popping out of the back of pickup

They'll watch the news on TV and see a 65 mph gale blowing down houses and tall trees on the Florida coast, and yet they'll put wooden chairs, a mattress, or an empty garbage can in the back of a pickup and drive down the highway at 65 mph and expect the stuff to stay there! Expect sudden attacks by beach chairs, empty coolers, barbecue grills, couch pillows, living room chairs, and aluminum ladders. You can run across these anytime, but more so in the hotter weather you'll find big pieces of truck tire, for just about anything that's out there "road 'gators", on the highway. If you see a piece fly off a truck, expect more pieces to be launched at you real soon.

When this stuff appears on the road, how will the car in the lane next to you react? Will they brake in a straight line, or will they get all freaky and swervey? If you're in their blind spot when things go we're riding down the highway, we check bad, be ready to alert them with your horn.

Once that foreign object is on the

road, will it stay still where it is? Big plastic bed liners have a nasty habit trucks. Recently, a rider saw a bed liner lying in the next lane of a freeway as he approached, "Whew, got lucky on that one!" And as the van in front of him passed the bed liner, the vacuum in the air behind the van sucked the bed liner into his lane where his motorcycle smashed into it. Major damage! Major bummer!

It sure would be nice to expect a clear highway in front of us. But until we can fence off a couple of hundred miles of road, and not allow anyone else on it, we'll just need to stay alert and be ready where it shouldn't be.

So, be aware, get your knees in the breeze, and Ride Safe!
