

ALL BILLS held over from last session will have one shot to pass out of the policy committee; the Transportation Committee, in our case. Then, the week after, one shot in the Appropriations Committee, and then just two weeks more to clear the Assembly or Senate Floor.

Our bills, Chris Norby's AB 695 to repeal the motorcycle helmet law for adults, and AB 1047 by Kevin Jefferies to stop motorcycle-only p.m. in Room 4202 (that's the same hearing room for those who have attended the show, before) at the State Capitol in Sacramento.

We will have our Freedom Rally on the South steps of the Capitol at 11 am; if you want to be in the group picture, please be there by 10:30. Both Assemblymen Norby and Jefferies will be keynote speakers. Also, outspoken Freedom Fighter Assemblyman, Tim Donnelly, who represents our office in Hesperia will also be a featured speaker! Please attend and send some folks! They don't have to be fellow riders; JUST SHOW UP TO SUPPORT OUR CAUSE — FREEDOM!

The Board Meeting and Legislative/ PAC meeting will be at the La Quinta Inn on January 8th — see the Bailing Wire for complete information and the special motel rates that apply.

Please, all Locals need to send in support letters to the Assembly Transportation Committee, 1020 N Street, Room 112, Sacramento, CA 95814, so that you can be listed in support of both bills. Also, if our **Business supporters** wrote in, as well, that would be a big help!







Our Treasurer reported we made money on our End of Summer run to Santa Cruz. Everyone agreed to send \$100 to our State Lobbyist. Caroline




Local #25 Sacramento





December date line: ABATE toy runs means opportunities to give the ABATE spiel to potential new members and to remind older members to renew if they haven't done so.


We, as an organization, have the tools to get and retain members. In your attempt to get new members you can use our accomplishments list which is like a greatest hits lists.

During the holiday season, the California Highway Patrol sets up DUI checkpoints which have led to hundreds of citations for driving under the influence across California. These checkpoints are great way to prevent drunk drivers from staying on the road. Driving impaired can cause serious injury or death to you, passengers in your vehicle or other people on the road. The Department of Motor Vehicles cannot stress enough the importance of a designated sober countermeasure that is designed to re- quirement. duce the number of drunk drivers on the road.



DOUBLE-DOUBLE YELLOWS: Sets of double-double yellow lines are considered a barrier or island. We may never cross those even to get into or out of our own driveway or to make a u-turn.

NARROW STREETS: When riding in parts of town with small, narrow streets where there is not a centerline painted in the street, the Driver Handbook suggests that we ride out near the middle of the street, when no traffic is approaching us from the opposite direction. This reduces the chances of someone in a parked car making a move that would surprise or endanger you. Naturally, near an intersection we would be back towards the right side of the roadway.

TURNOUT AREAS AND LANES: Special "turnout" areas are sometimes marked on two-lane roads. Drive into these areas to allow traffic behind you to pass. If you are driving slowly, you are required to pull in if there are five or more vehicles behind you that want to go faster. (Pg 35 CA Drivers Manual).

SOMETIMES THESE TURNOUT AREAS ARE UNLIT AND UNPAVED, AND ESPECIAL-LY AT NIGHT, MOTORCYCLISTS WOULD HAVE TO MAKE SERIOUS CHOICES TO USE THEM OR NOT.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY ZONE: A "safety zone" is the area or space lawfully set apart within a roadway for the exclusive use of pedestrians and which is protected, or which is marked or indicated by vertical signs, raised markers or raised buttons, in order to make such area or space plainly visible at all times while the same is set apart as a safety zone. CA Vehicle Code 540.

CROSSING BICYCLE LANES: As long as there are no bicycles using the bicycle lane anywhere near enough you to be a hazard, you may cross a bicycle lane to turn into or out of a driveway. If there is a bicycle lane, and no bicycles are using it, and you plan on turning right at the next corner, you should check your mirror, signal, check your blind spot, and move into the bicycle lane NO MORE THAN 200 feet from the corner (three tractor-trailer lengths) to approach your right turn. You may park in a bicycle lane, as long as there is no sign that proclaims "Bike Lane No Parking".

Motorists passing bicyclists are to be patient when passing a bicyclist. Slow down and pass only when it is safe. Do not squeeze the bicyclist off the road. If road conditions and space permit, allow clearance of at least three feet when passing a bicyclist. CA Driver Handbook.






