This event brings together ABATE and other SMRO's (State Motorcycle Rights Organizations) from all over the USA.

The MRF is chiefly concerned with issues at the national and international levels that impact the freedom and safety of American street motorcyclists. We are also committed to educating Rights Advocates to improve effectiveness at the state and local levels.

The MRF works together with SMROs assisting them with state and local agendas as well as working with them to influence Washington, DC, from Congress to government departments and agencies to the Office of the President of the United States.

The event has many seminars that address some of the issues motorcyclists in the US are facing today. Some of the things that were addressed were Motorcycle Profiling, autonomous vehicles and E85 Fuel.

As some of you already know, in California on July 12, 2021 we were able to get an Anti-Profiling Senate Resolution (SR-41) with the help of ABATE, Senator Caballero from District 12 and motorcyclists from all over California. At this meeting ABATE of California received an award for helping get SR-41 passed. I accepted the award in front of around 300 members of the MRF as well as ABATEs and other SMROs from across the U.S. What an honor this was to represent ABATE of California!

The goal of ABATE of California is to fight for the rights of ALL motorcyclists across the state. We have our Lobbyists in Sacramento with their finger on the pulse of what's going on in California.

I was able to spend some time with Rocky Fox, the legislative representative for the MRF in Washington, DC. We had a great discussion about what is going on at the Federal level in DC with motorcycle rights. Almost everything that we are fighting for here in California and in Washington, DC are the same things. When things get passed at the federal level, they eventually trickle down to the state level. The bottom line is that our way of life is being taken away little by little.

Governor Newson survived his recall after spending close to 100 Million Dollars! It's estimated the state spent \$276 Million to put on the recall with another \$75 Million spent by those that wanted to recall the Governor. He then returned to business in dealing with over 836 bills the Legislature passed and dumped on his desk. But for the second year in a row, with over 2500 bills introduced 10 Months ago, this was the fewest to reach a Governor's desk since the 1950's.

Politics - Legislative Bills At A Glance

AB 43 FRIEDMAN (D — GLENDALE, CHAIR OF ASSEMBLY TRANSPORTATION). TRAFFIC SAFETY. This bill would require, beginning June 1, 2022, and every 6 months thereafter, Caltrans to convene a committee of external design experts to advise on revisions to the Highway Design Manual. This bill would extend the period of time a prima facie speed limit may be justified by an engineering and traffic survey, as specified, if a registered engineer evaluates the section of the highway and finds that there has been an increase in traffic-related crashes.

*Signed into Law by Governor 10/8/2021

AB 122 BOERNER HORVATH (D — OCEANSIDE) VEHICLES; REQUIRED STOPS; BICYCLES. This bill would require a person riding a bicycle, when approaching a stop sign at the entrance of an intersection, to yield the right-of-way to any vehicles that have stopped at the entrance of the intersection, have entered the intersection, or that are approaching on the intersecting highway close enough to constitute an immediate hazard, and shall continue to yield the right-of-way to those vehicles until reasonably safe to proceed.

**Vetoed by Governor 10/8/2021

AB 232 Gallagher (R – Yuba City) Off-highway vehicles: reciprocity. Existing law requires every off-highway motor vehicle that is not registered under the Vehicle Code to display an identification plate or device issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles, with certain exceptions, including an off-highway motor vehicle with a currently valid identification or registration permit issued by another state. Except as otherwise specified, a violation of the Vehicle Code is punishable as an infraction.

This bill would permit application of that exception only if the other state recognizes an identification plate or device issued by the department as valid for use in that state. (SUPPORTING)

*Signed into Law by Governor 10/9/2021

AB-1512 BAUER KAHAN (D – ORINDA) OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICULAR RECREATION: CARNEGIE STATE VEHICULAR RECREATION AREA: ALAMEDA-TESLA EXPANSION AREA * Ordered to inactive file at the request of Senator Glazer amended to SB-155 PUBLIC RESOURCES TRAILER BILL.

The bill would require the department to determine the best use of land known as the "Alameda-Tesla Expansion Area," which is currently part of the Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area, as provided. The bill would prohibit the land from being designated as a state vehicular recreation area. The bill would transfer \$1,000,000 from the General Fund to the State Parks and Recreation Fund for this purpose. The bill would transfer \$29,800,000 from the General Fund to the trust fund to be used for the acquisition and development of properties to expand off-highway vehicle recreation, as provided.

*SB 155 Signed into Law by Governor 9/23/2021

SB 66 Allen (D – Santa Monica) California Council on the Future of

Transportation: Advisory Committee: Autonomous vehicle technology.

This bill would require the secretary to establish an advisory committee, the California Council on the Future of Transportation, to provide the Governor and the Legislature with recommendations for changes in state policy to ensure that as autonomous vehicles are deployed, they enhance the state's efforts to increase road safety, promote equity, and meet public health and environmental objectives. The bill would require the council to be chaired by the secretary and consist of at least 22 additional members, selected by the chair or designated, as specified, who represent, among others, transportation workers, various state and local agencies, and a disability rights organization.(SUPPORTING)

** August 26 hearing: Held in committee and under submission

SB 227 Jones (R – Santee) Off-Highway vehicles.

This bill would require, for the issuance or renewal of a competition identification, a specified configuration for the vehicle identification number and product identification number for an off-highway motor vehicle or ATV that is model year 2022 or later and is used solely for competition not on a public highway. The bill would impose restrictions on the operation of a competition motorcycle or ATV on public lands, including, among others, a requirement that a rider possess a current and valid competition card from a competition-sanctioning organization when practicing for a sanctioned event on public lands. Because operating a competition motorcycle or ATV on public lands in violation of those requirements would be a crime, the bill would impose a statemandated local program. (SUPPORTING)

*Held in committee, Two Year Bill

SR-41 CABALLERO (D – SALINAS) MOTORCYCLE PROFILING: According to the Department of Motor Vehicles, there were 857,273 motorcycles registered in California in 2019. Motorcycle profiling is the illegal use of the fact that a person rides a motorcycle or wears motorcycle-related apparel as a factor in deciding to stop and question, take enforcement action, arrest, or search a person or vehicle with or without legal basis under the Constitution of the United States. Rallies to raise awareness and combat motorcycle profiling have been held in multiple states and six times at the California State Capitol since 2011.

*Passed Senate Floor Unanimously 39-0 on 7/12/2021

California has always allowed valid "out of state" OHV registered vehicles to use our public lands. It has come to our attention that some of our heighboring states have recently implemented a "non-resident" fee for OHV's being operated in their state. By no longer honoring our California registration these states are reneging on a long standing tradition in the OHV community. These new regulations will be expensive and prove overous to every legally licensed OHV corner that travels and recreates in other states. Our ABATE OHV Division is asking for your help and financial support in fighting this type of legislation. Assembly Bill 2761 sponsored by Assemblyman Gallagher (Republican-Yuba City) seeks to remedy this issue of reciprocity and ABATE of California is asking you to help the OHV communities of our states restore equal access to OHV areas for all legally licensed users.

In addition to AB 2761, Abate of California is proposing two other bills for our elected official's to consider this year. Our first bill would require DMV to allow rider's to take both the M/C skill's test and their DMV written exam during their CHP certified M/C training classes. After a rider successfully completes and passes both tests the school would submit the information to DMV and they would issue a valid M/C endorsement card by mail to the rider that is valid for the duration of their current California drivers license. Upon license renewal the M/C endorsement would then be added to their new license thereby saving the student the time and expense associated with visiting and testing at their local DMV office.

Our second bill would seek to exempt all M/C riders and especially our Military Veteran riders from being accessed a toll fee when traveling on a toll road within the state of California.

RPM ACT REINTRODUCED IN CONGRESS: After receiving more than 1.5 million letters from motorsports enthusiasts across the country, the Recognizing the Protection of Motorsports Act (RPM Act) has been reintroduced in the U.S. House of Representatives (H.R. 3281) and U.S. Senate (S. 2736) in the 2021-2022 session of Congress! The RPM Act of 2021 is common-sense, bi-partisan legislation that guarantees Americans right to modify street cars, trucks and motorcycles into dedicated racing vehicles and ensures the motorsports-parts industry's ability to sell products that enable racers to



The RPM Act reverses the EPA's interpretation that the Clean Air Act prohibits a motor vehicle designed for street use -- including a car, truck, or motorcycle -- to be converted into a dedicated racecar. This American tradition was unquestioned from 1970 until 2015 when the federal Environmental Protection Agency took the position that converted vehicles must remain emissions-compliant, even though they are no longer driven on public streets or highways.

NEW U.S. NTSB CHIEF BLAMES BAD ROAD DESIGN FOR TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS: The United States National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) has a new chief, and she says that to reduce road fatalities, the entire system must shift.

NTSB chief Jennifer Homendy, who has worked extensively on investigating air traffic incidents, including the Kobe Bryant helicopter crash, believes the government and all the stakeholders' approach to road safety needs a "fundamental rethink" similar to how aviation now looks at air traffic safety.

Earlier this year, she said that governments and businesses should change the way they look at road and highway safety and must consider the whole system, rather than focusing only on individual driver behavior. She added that the "whole system approach" worked perfectly in aviation, where there were ZERO fatalities in 2020.

"If we are going to get to zero, we will have to do something different," Homendy remarked in a speech to the Governor's Highway

Safety Association conference in Denver, Colorado.

In the US, there were more than 38-thousand road accident-related deaths last year, the greatest tally since 2007, and is up 10.5% in the first three months of 2021, despite a decline in vehicle miles traveled due to COVID-19-related travel restrictions. Homendy added that, rather than focusing only on drivers, the "Safe System Approach" should also take into account other factors, such as the design of highways which, according to her, might encourage drivers to drive faster, or vehicles sold that are designed to go way beyond the established safe speed limits.

NEW EMISSIONS STANDARDS TARGET THAT 50% OF VEHICLES SOLD BE ELECTRIC: President Biden has unveiled another component of his administration's plan to fight the climate crisis, announcing a new target that half of vehicles sold in the country by 2030 will be battery electric, fuel-cell electric or plug-in hybrid.

The future of America's car manufacturing "is electric and there's no turning back," Biden said in signing the executive order at the White House alongside representatives from Ford, GM and Stellantis, and members of the United Auto Workers Union. The automakers are supporting Biden's new target, announcing their "shared aspiration" that 40-50% of their cars sold by 2030 to be electric vehicles, according to a joint statement from the three automakers.

In a follow-up to an NCOM Legislative Task Force presentation on "The Demise of Gas-Powered Vehicles" at the NCOM Convention in Des Moines, Iowa this summer, NCOM-LTF Member Ed Schetter writes; "President Biden recently announced a new emissions standard that targets 50% of the vehicles sold in the US be electric by 2030," noting further that; "This will force the petroleum and the bio-fuels industries to aggressively compete for a shrinking market.

Schetter, who also serves as Executive Director of ABATE of Ohio, warns "We need to be vigilant in our defense of safe and affordable fuel for our motorcycles."

MOTORCYCLISTS SAY 'NO' TO BAN ON PETROL-POWERED BIKES: A recent survey conducted by the Federation of European Motorcyclists' Associations (FEMA), available in 12 languages, shows that a possible ban on the sale of new petrol-powered motorcycles is

rejected by more than 90% of the 23,768 motorcyclists that took part in the online survey.

When asked 'What do you think about a possible ban on the sale of new petrol-powered motorcycles?'; 92.91% of the motorcyclists


When asked what they would do if the sale of new petrol-powered motorcycles was banned, a majority of 53.38% would stop riding when they are no longer able to buy a new petrol-powered motorcycle. 38.96% of the respondents would buy a zero-emission motorcycle when there are no new or used petrol-powered motorcycles available anymore. Only 7.67% would already buy a zero-emission motorcycle when there are still petrol-powered motorcycles available.

Asked if they could enjoy a non-emission bike as much as their current bike, if a ban on all fossil fuel vehicles was implemented, or if they would stop riding, 58.92% would simply stop riding.

FEMA notes that "This could be an even larger issue when city authorities decide to ban fossil fuel vehicles from entering the city, because in that case over 76% of the respondents would change their mode of transport, rather than switching to a non-emissions motorcycle (electric/fuel cell). This could have drastic effects on urban mobility as we know it.
