

# Executive Director's Report

Greetings Brothers, Sisters & Friends: I'd like to start off by wishing everybody a safe and joyous 4th of July celebration

The 4th of July marks an occasion that is more than just backyard barbecues, gatherings of friends and families, and fireworks displays, but it also marks the occasion when our Founding Fathers, men of great vision and courage, initiated one of the most profound and far reaching revolutions in the history of mankind. While the history books will tell us about the Industrial Revolution as one of those major historical events, the fact of the matter is it would more aptly be titled the "Industrial Evolution". Even though the introduction of industrial machinery did revolutionize the way manufacturing, agriculture and many other industries mass produced and marketed their goods, products and services, it has been a never-ending and constantly evolving process that has led to a level of "standardization" and saturation of consumer markets never seen before in the history of man. Unfortunately, there has been a never-ending legislative evolution in the way free Americans have been led back to the yoke of oppression

The American Revolution and subsequent War of Independence, followed by the French Revolution, were entirely different "revolutions" in that the ideas and concepts of freedom, liberty, justice and equality for all men and women were incredibly revolutionary ideas and radically transformed nations, governments, religious institutions and entire populations by virtue of the pledge of freedom and the promise of throwing off the yoke of tyranny and oppression. While many of us are familiar with the words and concepts expressed in the Declaration of Indepen-

dence, far too many of us conflate those ideals and concepts with the U.S. Constitution and the Bill of Rights. The Constitution is nothing more than a document that lays out the structure of the Federal government and the Bill of Rights was added later to insure ratification of the Constitution. So, while the Bill of Rights guarantees our civil liberties, the original introduction of such ideas and concepts came from the Declaration of Independence. That is what we are supposed to be celebrating on the 4th of July. Free men came together united in a single purpose and cause to FIGHT and overthrow the oppressive and tyrannical rule of the British monarchy, the incredibly unfair and unjust economic system of British mercantilism and disproportionate taxation.



Unfortunately, ever since that incredible moment in history, those formerly in power have steadily chipped away at what our forefathers wrought for us with their blood, sweat and tears. Yeah, we've scared them a couple of times since then, what with the Great Civil Rights movements of the Sixties, when many of us marched in the streets demanding change; as some went to jail, some were beaten and some even died for what they believed in. Freedom is indeed a very messy business! The right of the people to peacefully assemble and demand

redress of their grievances is very much under assault today as evidenced by recent occurrences within ABATE. The October 2009 and January 2010 BOD meetings saw law enforcement gathering license plate numbers, taking photos and harassing a veteran's organization for allowing an ABATE meeting to be conducted on their premises. It begs the question what law enforcement is going to do with the intelligence information they gathered during these broaches of our civil liberties and of invasions of privacy by police, not too mention being incredibly poor demonstrations and breaches of etiquette and good taste by the agencies involved.

But those are only small isolated instances of our rights being infringed upon. The real damage is done by those wearing suits and who find themselves in possession of a title either elected or appointed, and of the two, often it is the appointed officials who are the most dangerous. Worse yet, some elected representatives manage to get one of his or her bad ideas passed into law. It is then turned over to some state agency filled with unqualified cronies or termed out legislators and they are then allowed to develop regulations that have not been vetted by the process of traveling through the halls of the legislature. At least with elected representatives, they can be voted out and there is some small measure of accountability. With appointed bureaucrats, it is often hard to determine the chain of command; stonewalling though the employment of recorded messages where you have to Press 1 for English is rampant and passing the buck from one bureaucrat to the next is the name of the game. We are constantly under assault from so many different quarters as to often make it extremely difficult to decide which flank we need to defend!

# Executive Director's Report

All this aside, I am extremely proud of the manner that the membership of ABATE of California has pulled together to fight SB-435, an extremely unnecessary and poorly crafted bill authored by State Senator Fran Pavley. I am in hopes that by the time you are reading this article that ABATE of California has already announced SB-435 went down in flames. For two years ABATE members have risen to the challenge every time Pavley has changed tactics and we have managed to hold this discriminatory, unjust and inappropriate legislation at bay. At the Eleventh hour, after suffering several defeats, Pavley decided to adopt yet another tactic and changed SB-435 to a "noise bill" which is where she was headed all along I suspect.

As I write this the battle still is being waged, but the simple fact is this: Without the incredible outpouring of opposition to SB-435 by ABATE members, SB-435 would long ago have been passed and the California motorcycling community would have been saddled with another piece of burdensome legislation whose only real impact would be to make life more difficult for us and to transfer wealth from our pockets to government coffers. ABATE members statewide have all contributed to the fight against SB-435, and I am very proud of your efforts. Give yourselves a hand! As I close, let me say that should SB-435

pass out of the Assembly Transportation Committee and make it to the floor of the "Let us hope for the best but prepare for the legislature, we still have not lost. We need worst". to keep the pressure on the legislature and keep those letters, calls, faxes and emails coming in to the offices of your district legislators. In addition, I would take this opportunity to once again urge all who are able to make a donation to one or more of the funds which helps keep ABATE defending your rights to Ride Free. The General Fund, the PAC Fund, and the Lobbyist Fund are all in needs of donations to help sustain us through this time of immediate crisis, and beyond that, there is always a new threat too from the legislature and special interests who would rather see motorcycles as museum pieces rather than a form of transportation and recreation.

And lastly, after reviewing much of the background documentation presented by such diligent and stalwart ABATE members as Splatt and Dennis Stalter, it appears to me that there will be sufficient and compelling grounds for legal action to challenge SB-435 in the courts should it come to pass. My suggestion to the membership

and to my colleagues on the Board of Directors is that we immediately begin planning to once again implement a "Judicial Fund" should it become necessary to fight SB-435 in the courts system.

As has been stated by so many others,



# Vote No On SB 435 As Amended - Now It's a Motorcycle Exhaust Noise Enforcement Bill!

SB 435, as Amended, will be heard in the Assembly Transportation Committee by the end of June. Due to strong ABATE opposition, all of the motorcycle smog check provisions were stripped out and SB 435 reportedly will be amended to provide that if bikes don't have mufflers with matching federal EPA noise standard labels, they can be cited for a \$300 non-fix-it ticket. That's if you're riding it or it's just parked, anywhere.

California Vehicle Code Sections 27150 and 27151 have already been on the books for 40 years and are used routinely for loud motorcycle exhaust violations. Why enact overlapping existing law in a state with a \$20 billion budget deficit. Isn't that irresponsible? Besides, the EPA muffler label stamps on mufflers are the equivalent of the tags on bed mattresses — they are manufacturers' warranties. In this case, the labels mean that the muffler complies with the federal noise standard for new motorcycles for one year or 3,730 miles, whichever comes first. After that, due to wear and tear or damage, compliance with the noise standard no longer applies.

Under current law, if the mufflers are replaced with noise compliant ones, labels or not, and verified by peace officers, the citations are written off with a \$25 court fee. This way, a proper correction to a violation is accomplished.

The aftermarket muffler industry has supplied replacements due to wear and tear or damage for decades. For the tens of thousands of aftermarket catalytic mufflers that wear out, where does one get a replacement, if stock parts aren't available, since CARB reportedly has approved only *one* aftermarket replacement, so far? 


### **Membership Report** by Lee 'Sporty' Milligan, Membership Chairman


