

# Executive Director's Report

In last month's article I had stated that one of my goals was to encourage and guide our ABATE organization into a more pro-active stance and attitude in 2016. What does pro-active actually mean? Webster's Dictionary defines active as: (1) abounding in action, or busy (2) being in or capable of action, movement or performance, (3) causing or promoting action, change, or movement, (4) agile, lively, or quick, and (5) characterized by actual participation - an active member!

ABATE of California truly lives up to some of these definitions and unfortunately fails miserably in some of the others. Agile, lively and quick somehow doesn't seem to fit well into our organizational structure and is a constant issue with some of our members and our motorcycle friends. Yes, our Officers can make routine, mundane, everyday decisions regarding our operation, but for important and critical decisions we must, as dictated by our Policy and Procedure Manual and our ABATE

By Laws, seek membership approval before we can act. Thus ABATE of California will never function as quickly as some would desire, but we do function and produce positive results for our members and the general motorcycling community.

We have a long and documented history in California and our success cannot be denied by anyone. Yes, we have failed on several high profile pieces of legislation, and we will undoubtedly have more failure in the future, but if we do not attempt to influence and protect our rights as motorcycle riders, we will probably all lose our right to ride. Our job is to protect ourselves and you from becoming a lost dream in the harsh reality of corporate operation where cost and profit is more important than pleasure. The Legislature finished off February with the introduction of over 2,000 new bills. Add that to the 2,300 bills they introduced last year, many of which already passed or are now still making their way through the system. I have read and reviewed all of them, and at the present time, I can't find any bills introduced that would call for mandatory smog checks for motorcycles or the banning of lane splitting.

However, many of the bills were just written as spot bills. Meaning that the bill opens up with a law code section that generally covers climate change or greenhouse gases, etc. Those bills could be amended to compel smog checks. So,

I have marked many bills to alert me if they are later amended to include motorcycles.

Most of these bills will be heard in March, for sure before the April 22nd deadline to pass out of their policy committee. So, stay tuned for our Legislative Alerts!

Assemblyman Quirk's AB 51, the lane splitting bill, will probably be heard sometime in June if it is brought up at all. I have had discussions with Quirk's staff and they are fairly vague as to whether they will hear the bill this year. They told me that they will hold meetings with us, and other stakeholders, before they decide to present AB 51 in the Senate.

I have had many requests to meet with candidates who are looking for ABATE's endorsement for this year's Primary Election, and I am keeping Chuck Pedersen, our Legislative Director, updated.

Nick Benson and I are working on this election's ABATE Voter Guide so you will be the best informed as to motorcyclist-friendly candidates and the most realistic chance of winning their races.

community," Annette Torrez, chair of the New Mexico Motorcycle Rights Organization (NMMRO) and National Coalition of Motorcyclists (NCOM) board of directors, announced that; We received the following message from Chief Justice Judge Nash concerning motorcycle vests in District Courthouse, "Please be informed that the Bernalillo County Sheriff's Department will NOT be requiring members of your organization to turn their vests inside out upon entry into the Second Judicial District Courthouse and its' Courtrooms in the future."

The NMMRO and the NNMCOC (Northern New Mexico Confederation of Clubs) sent Judge Nash a



letter regarding an issue in which Bernalillo Sheriff Officers were asking the Guardians of the Children to remove their vests and turn them inside out so none of the patches were visible. "These vests and patches are what identify them to the abused children who they are there to support in court under difficult circumstance as these children have to face their perpetrators or have to sometimes testify," explained Torrez. "While we can all benefit from this victory, it is the abused children from our community who will benefit most, as now members of motorcycle community can continue to support and accompany them in court. Your voices were heard as we united in support."

Nash's message specifically denotes "members of your organization" which is why "it is so important we as motorcyclists join and support the NMMRO, an organization that stands and fights for your rights, freedoms and liberties," said Torrez, adding; "Thank you to Judge Nash for doing the right thing as we believe our 1st Amendment was being violated. We must also remember that we must be respectful at all times in our courthouse, we must be on our best behavior so that we may continue to wear our patches and motorcycle related attire in the courthouse. I want to thank the Guardians of the Children for bringing this to our attention. Thank you to Double D from The Motorcycle Profiling Project and Attorney Dan Sorey for their support and advice in addressing this issue."

## MANIFESTO ON THE MOTORCYCLE INDUS-TRY AND FREEDOM OF THE ROAD

"I have a major bitch and a project that could BIKER ATTIRE ALLOWED IN NEW MEXICO save the custom motorcycle aftermarket and place COURTROOMS Declaring "A great victory for our freedom at the forefront of our nation once more."

> WHEN YOU CAN'T GIVE UP, WRITE -- A Brief Manifesto; "Sounds ominous but it's not, then again it is a tough alteration to current government thinking. And I believe our industry could be at the forefront.

> Why can't we prove that Freedom always needs to be a consideration? Why can't we prove that all the custom motorcycles in the country will never have any significant impact on the environment and agencies need to leave us alone?

> If we were successful, this could place Freedom at the forefront in many applications from hot rods, to

go carts, to speed boats."

As evidence of governmental regulation usurping personal rights, Ball (Bandit@Bikernet.com) submitted the following news release on behalf of SEMA (Specialty Equipment Market Association) entitled "EPA Seeks to Prohibit Conversion of Vehicles into Racecars":

"The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has proposed a regulation to prohibit conversion of vehicles originally designed for on-road use into racecars and make the sale of certain products for use on such vehicles illegal. The proposed regulation was contained within a non-related proposed regulation entitled 'Greenhouse Gas Emissions and Fuel Efficiency Standards for Medium- and Heavy-Duty Engines and Vehicles - Phase 2'.

The regulation would impact all vehicle types, including the sports cars, sedans and hatch-backs commonly converted strictly for use at the track. While the Clean Air Act prohibits certain modifications to motor vehicles, it is clear that vehicles built or modified for racing, and not used on the streets, are not the 'motor vehicles' that Congress intended to regulate.

'This proposed regulation represents overreaching by the agency, runs contrary to the law and defies decades of racing activity where EPA has acknowledged and allowed conversion of vehicles,' said SEMA President and CEO Chris Kersting.

Working with other affected organizations, including those representing legions of professional and hobbyist racers and fans, SEMA will continue to oppose the regulation through the administrative process and will seek congressional support and judicial intervention as necessary. The EPA has indicated it expects to publish final regulations by July 2016."

## BILL IN WASHINGTON WOULD ALLOW MO-TORCYCLES ON SHOULDERS IN TRAFFIC

Washington State might give motorcyclists preferential treatment on some highways during traffic jams under a bill that has the support of the state Senate. The measure would give motorcyclists permission to drive on the far left shoulders of divided highways when traffic is moving under 25 miles an hour.

"It really is about relieving congestion," said State Senator Tim Sheldon (D-Mason County), the bill's sponsor. He tried passing a bill last year that would have allowed what's known as "lane splitting," allowing bikers to ride between cars stopped in traffic, but that bill failed.

Sen. Sheldon told CBS King5 News in Olympia that his proposal would alleviate traffic and make highways safer for motorcycle riders in heavy traffic. "When congestion basically stops traffic, a motorcyclist... they're vulnerable to over-heating as well as being rear-ended."

## KANSAS HOUSE SPEAKER GIVES HORSE-POWER TO 3-WHEELER REFORM BILL

A House committee in Kansas kicked the tires of a bill creating a special driving examination and license for people who ride increasingly popular three-wheeled motorcycles. Under current Kansas law, individuals are required to take a test on a twowheeled motorcycle even if they own and plan to ride a machine with three wheels. House Bill 2436 would establish a special class of motorcycle licensing that aligns the examination with the type of vehicle to be

Three-wheel licenses issued under the proposed law would forbid the person from legally riding a two-wheeled motorcycle, but anyone passing the two-wheel test could ride both motorcycle variations.

House Speaker Ray Merrick (R-Stilwell) urged the House's Vision 2020 Committee to endorse the "friendly, common-sense update to Kansas statutes."

"Considering the vast differences in the physical requirements between two- and three-wheeled motorcycles," Merrick said, "it is reasonable that a person who can only ride a three-wheeled motorcycle should be allowed to take their license training and test on the type of motorcycle they will be using."

Brian Thompson, a lobbyist with ABATE of Kansas, said the reform proposed by the House bill would benefit young and old riders alike. "Those with less skills would be able to feel the independence and freedom of the road if they desire," Thompson told the Topeka Capital-Journal newspaper.

NEW MOTORCYCLE HAZARD - TEENS WALKING WHILE DISTRACTED Motorcycle riders have a lot to watch for when cruising through an urban environment such as a city or town. While the first focus may be other vehicles, a new study shows bikers should watch for teens crossing the road while distracted by their smartphone.

According to research released by Safe Kids Worldwide, with support from FedEx, distraction plays a role as 50% of teens admit they cross streets while using a mobile device, and an alarming 40% admit to actually being hit or nearly hit by a car, bike or motorcycle while walking.

Of the teens who have been hit or nearly hit report crossing the street while: 47% listening to music, 20% talking on the phone, and 18% were texting.

"Every hour of every day, a teen is hit or killed while walking," said Kate Carr, President and CEO of Safe Kids Worldwide. "Texting and walking or driving can be fatal. That's why we're asking everyone to put phones down when crossing the street."

## TEENAGER CAUTIONED AFTER SERIOUSLY IN-JURING MOTORCYCLIST

A 14-year-old boy was recently "cautioned" by police after causing "life-changing injuries" to a motorcyclist by tying a rope between two trees on a woodland path. The 17-year-old rider was rushed to the hospital with serious neck and wind-pipe injuries after hitting the rope while riding in woods near St Neots, Cambridgeshire, UK, and he spent seven weeks in the hospital including two-and-a-half in an induced coma.

The boy, who admitted responsibility under questioning by police, was issued a youth caution for causing grievous bodily harm without intent. He must also attend sessions with the Youth Offending Service.

MOTORCYCLE SPEEDER WINS \$180,000 IN CASE AGAINST COP WHO BEAT HIM UP On Aug. 3, 2012, Justin Wilkens was speeding on his Aprilia motorcycle and unwittingly passed Oregon State Police Officer Rob Edwards in an unmarked cop Camaro. After a few min-

utes of chase, Edwards rammed Wilkens off the bike, pulled a gun on him and kicked him in the chest.

If you think that sounds egregious, a jury agrees with you.


Dash cam footage shows Wilkens' motorcycle speeding past cars and crossing double-yellow (no passing zones) lines near Veneta, OR when the officer pulls up behind him at an intersection, hits the bike and knocks the biker to the ground. Edwards maintained this was unintentional; a result of "brake fade" from the Camaro's discs being overworked. At this point in the footage, Edwards enters the frame and lands a kick to Wilkens' chest while drawing down on him with his pistol before cuffing him.

In an interesting plot twist, Edwards stated he did not know the police car's dashcam was running. Wilkens suffered a broken left clavicle, a fractured rib and other injuries in the incident.

After being apprehended, Wilkens brought an excessive-force claim against Edwards. As explained by local news, a jury of eight people "awarded Wilkens more than \$31,000 in economic damages to reimburse his medical expenses and motorcycle repair bills; \$100,000 in noneconomic damages for his injuries, pain and suffering; and \$50,000 in punitive damages," which Officer Edwards will be forced to pay.



# Motorcycle Safety Report

## **These Old Bones**

Well the month of February has been challenging, almost no rain and days like summer down here in the southland. Anyway, we get an extra day this month and that's about it! That storm system of the year is way out there, it's late, but still on the way. At least that's what they keep saying. So I'm shelving this rain savior of California's drought hype until it happens.

The good news is that we can ride without the nuances of bugs because it still gets fairly cold at night, whoopee! It may be different up in the Northern part of California but my residence is down here and I'm reporting from my zone for now. What I'm hearing is that we would like some more of the winter season but not too extreme, at least no rain on the weekends!

I have been preparing my bike for the riding season early this year. I keep a good eye on my bike year round, but because of the down time during the winter season, I really get into the extra things. I usually do the major service and install new parts or have work done around January through March in preparation for the prime riding season so I won't have any major issues during the summer. It also makes sure my bike is safe and trustworthy.

At my age the first thing I think about is my mind and body - getting old kinda sucks, but it's worth it! For some of us our body has changed and it has altered our riding time and distance that we travel. Don't get me wrong, there are many of us that are like that battery, just goes and goes, but for me, and some I know, one of our topics is about what medications we take! We talk about our aches and pains and missing interior parts due to parts being worn out or we face the serious situations of disease - you all know what I'm talking about, the list for us older generation riders is long and has no prejudice what so ever.

For me, and many others, riding is therapeutic. It helps repel stress better than a martini! I do live to ride but I've had my serious medical situations that have limited me, but through all that I've been through I still ride. My doctor recommends me not to, but he didn't say I can't ride anymore. It's a battle that many of us come to realize and that's when we have to say, "I really do like to ride", or "I really love to ride" and "Ride I will until I can't ride anymore!"



This is the mental part, the love of riding. It does require responsibilities as much as keeping your bike ready. The physical aspects are more evident because we have medications or therapy of some sort and sometimes riding makes me feel good until I'm done at the end of the day, then my body lets me know. But I say to myself, give me a couple of days to recoup and I'll be back! That's what I call, ride to live and live to ride, the love of riding!

These old bones do dictate to me! The type of bike I ride is the biggest concern. I'll still ride my Heritage Softail, but I'm leaning towards the grandpa bike, a full dresser of some sorts. I'm not saying this is the choice of older people, but for me I'm in need of comfort as I ride and a trike is not the answer. I'm also thinking about a custom seat with a back rest. But I wonder if I could bring my leg over it as I mount my bike or worse yet, dismounting. It could get real ugly if I fall off my bike because my back said no half way off my bike. Some of you really know this!

This is where the kickstand is your best friend, this phenomenon only happens when other riders are present and you can feel their eyes on you. You double check your kickstand and take your sweet time to get off and you know you can't bring your leg over the backrest so you take a wide step off and drag your right leg over your seat hoping it goes smooth. There are a few things that really test our memory like forgetting to put your kickstand down as you dismount and you remember it as gravity lets your bike down sideways. Your footing also becomes important (this can test our reaction time and strength) because of the loose gravel under your boots that you didn't remember to look for before dismounting. Have you ever had your boot slide as your bike lays down? These things are

common for all riders, but we oldies call it an age thing. One of my favorite styles of bikes are hard tails, to me, it's a younger generation bike or your simple bar hopper, my back will not let me enjoy the coolness of riding these bikes and that sucks.

I have come upon something weird but true. My back and neck is like a radar system, it alerts my eyes and then they tell my brain there's a bump or slight change of elevation ahead of some sort, not your speed bumps in a neighborhood or parking lot but on the freeway/highway. These construction gaps happen wherever there's an overpass two times per overpass. If in fact I hit one it will let my back know, and let me tell you, some of them are downright nasty, I guess this problem was due to the fact that they had the lowest bidder build them, close but no cigar theory! All it takes is missing a few of them and my back is done for the day, unless I'm somewhat medicated or will be soon! My radar system goes on red alert and when I see the next one I do the "harrumph rise" as I cross these joints twice, the harrumph rise is lifting your butt up as you hit these two joints on the freeway and you don't really lift your butt off the seat but you go with the upward motion while hitting them, it takes practice but you'll perfect it very quickly because of the pain it can cause. I love floor boards! I've been riding nearly 40 years using pegs, then when I got my Heritage and it came with floorboards and I love it. I do have pegs on my freeway bars though, they really do help me feel more comfortable while riding long distances and I can put my feet at many different positions while riding, and if I get antsy I can do the heel to toe dance and stretch out somewhat, it

My younger riding buds always bag me on my age (joking of course), calling me old man, grandpa etc. I come back and tell them, hey, if you're privileged enough to get to my age you'll respect me after the fact. I tell them that I've survived this long because of my lack of stupidity and I understand the life of riding and its responsibilities.


also helps doing the harrumph rise as well!


