Not since I started as a Lobbyist in 1970, yes of which are being completely GUTTED and Ronald Reagan was Governor of California, have I seen a crazier Legislative Session! Over 2,200 bills were introduced to start the 2020 Session and fewer than 500 will make it to Governor Newson' s desk by the September 1st deadline. The fewest bills sent to a Governor probably since the 1960's. Usually, on average, over 1800 head there with 80-90% being signed into Law.

The Legislature has been in and out of session since the pandemic hit in mid-March, to allow social distancing. As many of you know from your trips up to Sacramento to testify, Committee hearings have been on the Assembly Floor not in Committee rooms.

For us to enter the Capital, we enter on the North gate wearing a mask, have our temperature taken and then we are escorted to the elevator, one person allowed in at a time. After arriving at the proper floor to go to Committee we are escorted by another Sargent to the Gallery, assigned to a specific seat and wait until we are called. Once we testify, and after our bill is heard, we are escorted back to the elevator, one person per elevator, head down to the first floor and then walked to the nearest exit. "Fun times" in Sacramento!

There are still 500 plus bills to track, many Dedicated Lobbyist Fund!

brand new bill language inserted! Stay tuned for Alerts, if we find anymore detrimental bills for ABATE! We will be focused on letters to the Governor asking for a Veto should the time arise.

One Bill we are supporting, SB 1024 Jones as Cosponsors is still alive and moving! It allows for "Red Stickered" Competition Off Road racing bikes to be sold in California and used in training/practicing for adults and kiddos to race in California! This includes use on all Bureau of Land Management and US Department of Forestry Lands. A big win for us, despite last minute opposition from the usual Environmental Community! Letters of support to the Governor will be needed, we will send out an alert with the pertinent information as to how and where to send your emails.

We are working with our Executive Director, Mark Loudermilk, to develop a list (ENDORSEMENTS) of Motorcycling Supporting Legislators and Candidates for the next Bailing Wire since the Mail in Ballots will be out at the same time as our October Edition.







Once compiled, the guide will be distributed to ABATE members by an email blast, just like you receive the Bailing Wire each month.



California has always allowed valid "out of state" OHV registered vehicles to use our public lands. It has come to our attention that some of our neighboring states have recently implemented a "non-resident" fee for OHV's being operated in their state. By no longer honoring our California registration these states are reneging on a long standing tradition in the OHV community. These new regulations will be expensive and prove onerous to every legally licensed OHV owner that travels and recreates in other states. Our ABATE OHV Division is asking for your help and financial support in fighting this type of legislation. Assembly Bill 2761 sponsored by Assemblyman Gallagher (Republican-Yuba City) seeks to remedy this issue of reciprocity and ABATE of California is asking you to help the OHV communities of our states restore equal access to OHV areas for all legally licensed users.

In addition to AB 2761, Abate of California is proposing two other bills for our elected official's to consider this year. Our first bill would require DMV to allow rider's to take both the M/C skill's test and their DMV written exam during their CHP certified M/C training classes. After a rider successfully completes and passes both tests: the school would submit the information to DMV and they would issue a valid M/C endorsement card by mail to the rider that is valid for the duration of their current California drivers license. Upon license renewal the M/C endorsement would then be added to their new license thereby saving the student the time and expense associated with visiting and testing at their local DMV office.

Our second bill would seek to exempt all M/C riders and especially our Military Veteran riders from being accessed a toll fee when traveling on a toll road within the state of California.

SB-1024 Jones Off-highway vehicles: This bill would exempt specially constructed motor vehicles operated solely in organized racing or competitive events upon a closed course from the identification device requirement for motor vehicles operated exclusively off the highways. The bill would repeal provisions relating to special transportation identification devices for motorcycles and corresponding fees, and would make other related conforming changes. The bill would additionally provide that competition all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) are not exempt from identification. *Currently in Assembly Appropriations*

*SB-1147 Glazer State park system: Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area: This bill would express the intent of the Legislature to enact subsequent legislation that would preserve the Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area for conservation purposes. <u>Gut & Amend Candidate like 2019</u>, which we defeated last time – Held in Rules Committee

*SB-1032 Allen State parks: Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation Commission: This bill would make the creation of the commission permanent by deleting the January 1, 2023, repeal date. The bill would require the commission members to instead have expertise in and represent off-highway vehicle recreation, environmental protection, motorized access to nonmotorized recreation, law enforcement, environmental restoration, public health and safety, rural landowners and residents, biological or soil specialization, or the public at-large. *Trailer Bill Candidate, August Budget Revise. Protecting makeup of Commission to be Rider Friendly.*Held in Senate Natural Resources & Water

SB-1351 Beall Department of Transportation: state highways (Amended) Planning: This bill would prohibit the director from approving an allocation of an amount greater than 5% of a transportation planning agency's annual revenues. Existing law authorizes certain statutorily created transportation planning agencies to allocate up to 3% of their annual revenues for transportation planning and programming pro-

cesses, and alternatively authorizes the allocation of a greater amount upon approval by the Director of Transportation

This bill would require those rules and regulations to be updated at least every 4 calendar years to reflect changes to the operators' transfer policies, payment methods, and any other relevant policy changes. This bill would provide that, if the Commission on State Mandates determines that the bill contains costs mandated by the state, reimbursement for those costs shall be made pursuant to the statutory provisions noted above. *In Assembly Appropriations*

AB-1964 Frazier Autonomous vehicles: This bill would expand the definition of the term "autonomous vehicle" to also include a remotely operated vehicle, defined as a specified type of vehicle that is capable of being operated by a driver or operator that is not inside of the vehicle. The bill would instead specify that a vehicle is not an autonomous vehicle if it is equipped with a collision avoidance system that is not capable of driving the vehicle without the active control or monitoring of a human operator that is seated in the driver's seat of the vehicle. *Trailer Bill Candidate, August Budget Revise. Held in Committee*

AB-2121 Friedman Traffic safety: This bill would require, beginning June 1, 2022, and every 6 months thereafter, Caltrans to convene a committee of external design experts to advise on revisions to the Highway Design Manual. This bill would extend the period of time a prima facie speed limit may be justified by an engineering and traffic survey, as specified, if a registered engineer evaluates the section of the highway and finds that there has been an increase in traffic-related crashes. *Trailer Bill Candidate, August Budget Revise. Held in Assembly Transportation*

AB-2225 Grayson Smog check: exemption: historic vehicles: This bill would exempt motor vehicles that have been issued with the specialty plate described above from the requirement that it be inspected biennially upon registration. Trailer Bill Candidate, August Budget Revise. Held in Assembly Transportation

*AB-2551 Bauer-Kahan Off-highway vehicular recreation: Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area: Alameda-Tesla Expansion

Area: This bill would authorize the department to dispose of the portion of the Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area known as the "Alameda-Tesla Expansion Area" to permanently preserve that land for conservation purposes, as specified, if the department determines that disposing of the land is in the public interest. <u>Gut & Amend Candidate like 2019</u>, which we defeated by Lobbying Governor. Hearing Canceled at the Request of the Author

*AB-2761 Gallagher Off-highway vehicles: reciprocity: This bill would permit application of that exception only if the other state recognizes an identification plate or device issued by the department as valid for use in that state. By narrowing the exception, the bill would expand the scope of an existing crime and would therefore impose a state-mandated local program. <u>Trailer Bill Candidate</u>, <u>August Budget Revise</u>. <u>Held in Assembly Transportation</u>

*AB-2785 Cervantes Vehicles: off-highway vehicles (Spot): This bill would delete obsolete provisions relating to the report, and would make other technical, nonsubstantive changes. *Gut & Amend Candidate. Not Assigned*

AB-3311 Grayson Vehicles: insurance: This bill would increase the amount of liability insurance coverage an owner or operator of a motor vehicle is required to maintain to \$30,000 for bodily injury or death of one person, \$60,000 for bodily injury or death of all persons, and \$25,000 for damage to the property of others as a result of any one accident. This bill would make conforming changes to the definition of "proof of financial responsibility" for purposes of the provisions described above. *Trailer Bill Candidate, August Budget Revise. Held in Committee*

*Protect Motorcycle Safety Fund and Off-Highway Vehicle from Trailer Bills/August Revise (After Taxes are Collected July 15 since April Deadline was postponed). We protected the Accounts so far through June Budget Vote – no money was stolen or defunded!






We decided to wait till our September 19th meeting to discuss planning for our Turkey and Toy Runs.







MISSOURI REPEALS HELMET LAW FOR MANY ADULT RIDERS: Missouri has become the 32nd state to repeal their all-rider helmet law when Governor Mike Parson (R) signed House Bill 1963 into law on July 14th; a massive transportation bill that includes a provision to allow adults to ride a motorcycle or trike without a helmet, provided they are at least 26 years old and have appropriate health insurance.

The new rules, which will go into effect August 28th, also restrict police from pulling over helmetless riders to check if they have the required health insurance.

Sponsored by GOP Representative Travis Fitzwater, H.B. 1963 states in part: "Currently, every person operating or riding a motorcycle or motortricycle is required to wear protective headgear (Sections 302.020 and 302.026). This bill provides that persons under the age of 26 who are operating or riding as a passenger on a motorcycle or motortricycle shall wear a helmet when the vehicle is in motion. Similarly, a person who is 26 or older, is operating a motorcycle or motortricycle, and who has been issued an instruction permit shall wear a helmet when the vehicle is in motion. No political subdivision of the state shall impose a protective headgear requirement on the operator or passenger of a motorcycle or motortricycle. No person shall be stopped, inspected, or detained solely to determine compliance with these provisions (Section 302.020.2). The bill also provides that qualified operators who are 26 or older may operate a motorcycle or motortricycle without a helmet if he or she is covered by a health insurance policy or other form of insurance which will provide the person with medical benefits for injuries incurred as a result of a motorcycle or motortricycle accident. Proof of such coverage shall be provided on request of law enforcement by showing a copy of the qualified operator's insurance card. No person shall be

stopped, inspected, or detained solely to deter-

mine compliance with these provisions (Section 302.026)."

"We really feel everything in this bill has been well vetted," Tony Shepherd, who lobbied in support of repealing the helmet law for a motorcycle rights group, ABATE for Missouri, told the St. Louis Post-Dispatch. Other organizations supporting the measure were the Missouri Confederation of Clubs & Independents (CoC), and Freedom of the Road Riders of Missouri (FORR-MO), which has been lobbying to repeal the "Show Me" state's helmet law for decades, successfully getting a bill on their governor's desk four times since 1999 only to be vetoed.

Last year, Gov. Parson vetoed a similar measure that would have allowed anyone older than 18 to ride without a helmet, though his veto was centered on a separate provision in that legislation.

SWEEPING INFRASTRUCTURE BILL PASSED THE HOUSE, GOES TO THE SENATE: On July 1, 2020 the House of Representatives passed by a vote of 233-188 its signature infrastructure legislation, the Moving Forward Act, H.R.2 (previously the INVEST in America Act); providing over \$1.5 trillion in federal spending across a wide range of infrastructure areas including surface transportation, water, aviation, broadband, healthcare, and energy.

Included in the massive 2,213-page plan to rebuild and expand America's transportation infrastructure like highways, vehicle safety and public transit, the new 5-year federal funding measure also addresses several concerns voiced by motorcyclists.

As originally introduced in June, the INVEST in America Act included a provision to increase Motorcycle Safety Funds to states by 25%, to \$5.8 million. Added by unanimous consent during markup of H.R. 2 by the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee were three amendments to: Extend the prohibition against using federal funding for motorcycle-only checkpoints and also prohibits using federal funds to profile and stop motorcyclists based on of their mode of transportation or style of dress; Require the Department of Transportation to consider motorcycles in safety studies on autonomous vehicles and includes a motorcycle safety group in the DOT working group on autonomous vehicle deployment; An extension of the Motorcyclist Advisory Council including a seat on the council for motorcyclists' rights groups and manufactur-

An additional motorcyclist-friendly amendment was approved during the final floor vote in the House to provide federal monies to collect state profiling data regarding traffic stops based on "mode of transportation."

H.R.2 now goes over to the Senate for further action, where Republicans have expressed opposition to the bill as written by the Democrat-controlled House, as well as a veto threat from the Administration, citing the Act's spending levels, regulatory changes, and climate change-related provisions.

'ANTIQUE MOTORCYCLE ENTHUSIAST DAY': A Congressional Resolution, H.Res.1041 was introduced in the House to recognize July 11, 2020 as "Antique Motorcycle Enthusiast Day"

to recognize "the preservation, restoration, and operation of old-time motorcycles in the United States."

Sponsored by Representative Troy Balderson

(R-OH) and co-sponsored by GOP Reps Michael Burgess (TX), and Tim Walberg (MI), House Resolution 1041 states; Whereas many people in the United States

own, restore, preserve, study, or admire motor-cycles that fall into the antique category, meaning they are at least 35-years old;

Whereas the collection, restoration, and preservation of motorcycles is an activity shared across generations and across all segments of society;

Whereas thousands of local motorcycle clubs

and related businesses have been instrumental in

preserving a historic part of the heritage of the United States by encouraging the restoration and exhibition of such historic works of art;

Whereas the restoration of motorcycles pro-

Whereas the restoration of motorcycles provides well-paying, highly skilled jobs for people in all 50 States; and

Whereas, for over a century, motorcycles have been a source of family enjoyment, photographs, songs, movies, and an iconic fashion statement in the United States: Now, therefore, be it Resolved, That the House of Representatives (1) supports the designation of "Antique Motorcycle Enthusiast Day"; (2) recognizes the effect of the more than 120-year history of the American motorcycle and the economic surge that celebrated over 120 American brands in the United States in the first half of the 20th Century; (3) recognizes that the collection and restoration of vintage and classic motorcycles is an important part of preserving the technological achievements and cultural heritage of the United States; and (4) encourages the people of the United States to engage in events and commemorations of "Antique Motorcycle Enthusiast Day" in accordance with public health guidelines that create opportunities for antique motorcycle owners to educate young people about the importance of preserving the cultural heritage of the United States, including through the preservation of antique motorcycles.

GLOBAL MOTORCYCLE SALES BOUNCE BACK AFTER PANDEMIC SLUMP: After a strong start to 2020, motorcycle sales plummeted in March when the Coronavirus forced most of the world's population into lockdown, but with life gradually resuming, sales are bouncing back better than expected despite -- or perhaps because of -- the pandemic.

An increasing number of pundits and publications predict that the pandemic will encourage more people to turn to motorcycles and scooters for transportation -- the perfect type of commuter for social distancing. Although the first quarter of motorcycle sales are down 10.6%, they're selling better than cars which are down 12%.

In the U.S., according to rideapart.com, Honda, BMW, Suzuki, and Yamaha's North American branches reported that sales are thriving since the beginning of the year, particularly in the off-road segment.

The European market is showing a similar, pos-

itive trend; Italian sales numbers for June 2020 show a 37% increase over June 2019, while sales in the U.K. surpassed June 2019 levels by 14.3%.

The market is also on the mend in hard-hit India where local branches report sales are on the rise after the May slump. In the Land Down Under, according to the Australian Federal Chamber of Automotive Industries, sales for the second quarter were also up year over year.

In spite of a rocky Q1, the global motorcycle industry is faring far better than most expected.

MOTORCYCLE RALLIES: South Dakota health officials sent out 20 COVID-19 testing machines capable of producing tests in minutes to help carry out the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally amid the Coronavirus pandemic.

The 80th edition of the annual rally attracted thousands of people to western South Dakota for the iconic biker rally in August. The Rapid City Journal reported that the city council decided to cautiously proceed with the 10-day rally after realizing motorcycle enthusiasts were going to show up regardless.

Likewise, the Horry County City Council realized that there was no stopping the Myrtle Beach Spring Rally, which has gone on for 81 years, despite being postponed from May to July due to the virus. The 97th Laconia Motorcycle Week has been similarly rescheduled from June to August with their City Council's consent.

ABATE of Iowa reportedly held an "Amazing Weekend" 36th annual Freedom Rally in Algona over July Fourth, and even county officials were "pleasantly surprised" by the responsible behavior exhibited by thousands of motorcyclists in attendance.

Unfortunately, though, an estimated twentytwo major rallies have been canceled so far this year, including the National H.O.G. Rally on the Gold Coast, Americade, Hog Wild, Mountainfest, Panama Beach Spring Rally, Roar on the Shore, Rolling Thunder, ROT Rally, Smoke Out, Thunder in the Smokies, Thunder in the Valley, Quail Motorcycle Gathering, Wauseon, Wing Ding 42, and INTERMOT, the motorcycle industry's big show in Germany, was canceled, while America's AIMExpo was "postponed" to next year.

Many races have also been canceled or postponed; World Superbike and MotoGP races, American Flat Track, Isle of Man TT, Pikes Peak, as well as Motocross and Supercross. Easyriders has canceled their Bike Shows and Rodeos.

But as of now Arizona Bike Week is still on, October 7th – 11th in Scottsdale, as is the Four Corners Rally over Labor Day in Durango, CO, Reno's Street Vibrations' Spring Rally was postponed but their Fall Rally, September 24th – 27th is still "scheduled to happen," Daytona's Biketoberfest October 15-18 is currently proceeding, Golden Aspen canceled their May Aspen Cash Rally but reports their Golden Aspen Rally September 16th – 20th in Ruidoso, N.M. is still on, the Lone Star Rally in Galveston, TX has been "postponed" until November 4th – 7th, 2021, Harley Rendezvous postponed, Mama Tried postponed, and AMA Vintage Days postponed, with new dates TBA.

NEARLY 200,000 PROTEST MOTORCYCLE BANS: Thousands of motorcyclists joined forces across central Europe to protest against motorcycle bans on certain Alpine roads, as demonstrations took place in a number of German cities and coincided with the launch of an online petition that garnered 199,663 supporters.

Protesters oppose unfair and largely unjust bans on motorcycles from certain roads, citing exhaust noise as the reason for the bans, although loud cars are not prohibited.

NCOM CONVENTION TO HONOR FALL-EN RIDERS: INVITES NAMES FOR TRIB-UTE: With the 35th Annual NCOM Convention in Indianapolis now just weeks away, the National Coalition of Motorcyclists is requesting that MROs, motorcycle clubs, and riding associations submit the names of those members and bikers' rights activists who have died since last May's Convention, so that we may honor their memories during the traditional "Ringing of the Bell" tribute to fallen riders. Dedications can be handdelivered at the Convention to "Doc" Reichenbach, NCOM Chairman of the Board, or emailed in advance to Bill Bish, NCOM Public Relations Liaison, at NCOMBish@aol.com.

Meetings, seminars and group discussions will focus on legislative efforts and litigation techniques to benefit our right to ride and Freedom of the Road.
