Lobbyist's Report

The Legislature has introduced 4,215 bills for the 2013/2014 session. The Senate, with 40 Senators, introduced 1,464 and the Assembly, with 80 members, introduced 2,751 - plus many Constitutional Amendments and Bond Measures for the June and November Elections, this year!

ALL 80 Assembly seats are up for election and 20 members of the Senate face election as well. I have met with over 20 Candidates for these seats and have four more meetings scheduled, next week. We are sending out ABATE questionnaires to get their views on motorcyclists and motorcycling.

We will have recommendations for you all at the PAC meeting to be held May 3rd in Fresno, so please plan on attending to give your input for our endorsements and be ready for work to elect motorcyclist-friendly candidates in the June primary election on June 3rd, and the general election on November 4th. Please send your Local's representative to the PAC meeting in Fresno.

There are many "*Spot*" bills that have been introduced and will be amended in the next month. So far, the rumor from many of you was that someone was going to introduce a bill requiring us to *WEAR FLUORESCENT VESTS*! That bill has not been amended into a "*Spot*" bill, yet.

I am keeping a lookout for that bill and if introduced, will put out a *FLUORESCENT VEST ALERT TO ALL MO-TORCYCLISTS TO COME TO SACRAMENTO AND KILL THE BILL*!

The Motorcycle Industry Council (MIC), the trade association for motorcycle manufacturers, tried to get several Senators and Assembly Members to introduce legislation that would legalize the use of a roadside noise test to ticket us for illegal mufflers, or just louder-than-stock pipes! I was able to speak with the members and convince them **not** to introduce that bill, **SO FAR**! The MIC is looking for one of the "spot" bills to put their legislation into. **STAY TUNED AND ALERT FOR THIS ONE** — I AM!

Finally, several motorcycle groups tried to introduce anti-profiling legislation, this session, but failed to get any members to introduce the bill. ABATE stood ready to actively support their efforts; however without a bill being introduced again this year it will have to wait until 2015.

See you in Fresno on May 3^{rd} . Thanks to *ALL* of you individuals and Locals that send contributions to the Lobbyist Fund to keep me protecting *OUR* Riding Rights and Freedoms in Sacramento.

Expert Answers to Common DMV Questions By the California Department of Motor Vehicles office closures or service interruptions?

SACRAMENTO – Do you have questions about general driving related requirements like registration, licensing, driver safety, and insurance? Are you unclear about laws and restrictions related to driving? The California Department of Motor Vehicles has answers. "Save Time, Go Online," at <u>www.dmv.</u> ca.gov. You can submit any DMV-related questions at AskDMV@dmv.ca.gov

1. Q. Tax season is here. How do I find the vehicle license fee part of my annual vehicle registration fee, which I've heard may be deducted on my income tax?

A. The vehicle license fee part of your payment is the only part of your annual vehicle registration payment that may be deducted on your income tax. The vehicle license fee can be found on your Vehicle Registration Renewal Notice or you can check on our website at http://www.dmv.ca.gov/FeeCalculatorWeb/ index.jsp, will help determine the Vehicle License Fee. For information regarding tax deductions, please contact your tax consultant. For additional tax information contact:

2. Q. Who is eligible to renew their driver license online via the Internet?

A. You are eligible to renew your driver license online much I'll have to pay? if you meet the eligibility for renewal by mail by answering **NO** to all of the following questions: Have you already received two consecutive five

year extensions by mail?

Has your license been expired for more than one \Box year?

Are you currently on any type of driving probation?

Does your driver license expire more than 60 days from today's date?

Will you be 70 years of age or older when your current driver license expires?

Do you have a driver license from more than one state or jurisdiction?

Within the past two years:

Were you convicted of any moving violations?

Did you violate a written promise to appear in court within the last two years?

Were you suspended for driving under the influence, or for refusing, or failing to complete a chemical vehicle insurance. or preliminary alcohol screening test?

Within the past five years:

Have you had any health or vision changes within the last 5 years that affect your ability to drive safely?

Additionally, in order to process your renewal online, you must:

Be the person named on the renewal notice.

Not have a change of address.

Have a valid credit card or a checking account.

3. Q. I tried visiting my local DMV but it was temporarily closed. Where can I find out about

4. Q. A friend of mine told was that the DMV is hiring for hundreds of positions across the state. Can you tell me more about job opportunities?

A. Thank you for your interest. Your friend is correct; DMV is always looking for great talent to join its team. To apply for a DMV or any State civil service position, candidates must first take and pass an examination for the classification in which they are interested. Examination announcements (also known as "examination bulletins") for the DMV are available in several locations:

5. Q. I'm not sure how much I'll have to pay for my vehicle registration and I'm trying to budget for it. Is there a way to find out how

A. Yes. By going online at http://www.dmv.ca.gov/ FeeCalculatorWeb/index.jsp, you will find a vehicle registration fee calculator which allows you to calculate an estimate of vehicle registration fees and determine Vehicle License Fees (VLF) for tax purposes. Save Time, Go Online! Visit www.dmv. ca.gov or call 1-800-777-0133 for customer service.

6. Q. My father recently took (and legalized) his car to Eric Geron Mexico. I was wondering what forms and/or steps are to be followed now. I went ahead and filled out the online Affidavit of Non-Use Form. Is there something else that we need to do?

A. Customers should file a Change of Address and send a letter to DMV (or use a Statement of Facts-REG 256) with:

- Provide the vehicle description make, year model, California plate number and vehicle identification number.
- Stating the vehicle was removed from the State and where it was taken.
- Provide date (MM/DD/CCYY) the vehicle left the Lady Kay Deli State.

Once received, a status can be updated to the vehicle record so that billing notices are not issued and prevents collection activity when the vehicle registration expires. The Affidavit of Non-Use is only for reporting cancellation of

The DMV offers an array of services to customers 24 hours a day, 7 days a week through its $\underline{\mathsf{Website}}$ including online advance appointments for written and drive tests; vehicle registration and driver license renewals, selection of personalized license plates, changes of address and payment of fees via secure debit transactions. Customers can also effect transactions by calling DMV customer service at 1-800-777-0133. DMV is a department under the California State Transportation Agency (CalSTA).

The Meaning of Sign Colors

Sign, sign everywhere a sign, can you read the sign! I was cruising down the freeway and saw sign after sign after sign, then the farther I cruised the more signs I saw. All kinds of signs, almost all the signs had different colors and shapes, from the little white underpass signs to the mega green ones that list distance to said streets. I couldn't count them all during a one mile stretch on the 118 Fwy in Simi Valley. I'm sure it's like this in pretty much all major cities. If I'd done this it would look like I was texting while driving because of the plethora of signs.

The signs I saw were shall we say government instituted, then there are the billboard signs (off the roadways, most of them) and they defiantly obstruct the beautiful views of our dilapidated buildings that line our freeway systems (example: The I5 southbound in LA). Don't get me wrong, there are some nice buildings here and there.

Sometimes there are so many signs in any given area that they can be hazardous, for instance, entering San Francisco from the north after the Golden Gate Bridge as you enter the city there are so many signs for directions and such that more conservative as time went on. you have to drive slow just to make sure you're going in the through - you know them regulars, they honk and yell at you because you're just reading them signs and don't know where to go.

If you ride or drive on any type of street, highway or freeway you will see many types of signs in a multitude of different colors. The colors of these signs do have a meaning, as we all know sometimes we just get a glimpse as we zip by them, and some just stick out so as you can't miss them. Then there are temporary signs that usually deal with road construction or workers working on the side of streets etc.

The three main types of signs that are most prevalent are: Mandatory or Regulatory, Cautionary or Warning and Informative. All the signs that are discussed have to do with California roadways and could vary from state to state.

The most popular sign color is white with black letters known as "speed advisory signs" and represent the maximum speed at which you can travel safely on that roadway that is with essentially ZERO risk of having an accident caused by that speed - just remember you will not win in court if you get a speeding ticket citing that the word "maximum" was not present on the sign. The courts will say these signs mean "maximum" speed limits, period.

The other speed sign is yellow with black numbers and letters. It is a cautionary sign to coincide with the white signs indicating a sharp turn in the road as in this example: "20 MPH". These safety speed limit signs were engineered a long, long time ago, the engineers collaborated with automobile manufactures and tire manufactures and determined that automobiles could be expected to safely travel

The informative/guide signs that we see everywhere are used for us to identify areas of interest or places that offer services. These signs have different colors and sizes and shapes. These types of signs vary in colors from cities and

also known as aggravation signs (laugh) and most require you to reduce your speed and exercise caution as you drive thru the area. The most important thing about these signs is they usually have a reminder sign that says fines are doubled in construction zones and that could be very expensive!

Signs are the same as laws, you break them, and you'll pay! Our government tells us what's right or wrong (laws) so as to control us, signs are the same way. The government, as they say, is to help us to be safe, and makes it mandatory for all of us to obey and respect these signs/laws.

We all see sign abuse daily. How many times have you seen the person cut across 3 lanes on the freeway to the off ramp they just barely made? Or the mass amount of people running stop signs? Let alone all those who drive or ride over the 65 mile an hour speed limit! It hurt like Hell. So they had a morphine cocktail for me, but I had a problem; I developed a real bad case of heart burn. The doctors thought I was having another heart attack. All along I have had nice nurses to take care of me. I had a special nurse insert what they call a PIC line. That way they can insert antibiotics in my vain. By

My dressing changed two times a day and they do the stuff in my PIC line when required.

So I am here for 6 weeks then I don't know where the journey will take me. But I will do whatever I have to do to get out of this mess and back to work and wheels I miss seeing you folks. Tech Tips by Craig Griswold

Fuel Filters

We've discussed fuel (types, octane ratings), fuel systems (carburetors, fuel injection), and performance issues regarding fuel delivery. Quick show of hands, how many of you think of that fuel filter? It's one of those maintenance items that gets overlooked and in many cases can go on way past the service interval with nary an issue. The problem is, there is always that one that gives up the ghost half way through that cross country ride.

Up until the Motor Company decided to introduce electronic fuel injection in 1995, all bikes made by our beloved friends in Milwaukee were carbureted (fuel injection optional on big twins until 2007, when all bikes, even the Sportster, come with fuel injection only). With the exception of the in-tank screen filter that is attached to the fuel valve, there was no such thing as a filter per-se. There is one and designed it as a replaceable, pleated filter element. a service check that requires removing the fuel valve assembly and cleaning this screen. When that maintenance is neglected, is looks a lot like this:



Most folks are content with the filter screen, but the more vigilant will usually add an aftermarket in-line filter, offering an additional layer of filtration.



There are a multitude of in-line filters to choose from. Most of these are disposable, but some are designed with a replaceable filter element. These, and some of the disposeable filters, are made with glass or clear plastic allowing a visual inspection for replacement. When installing one of these, keep in mind most are directional so check for a flow direction marked on the filter.

There are four fuel filter assemblies for Harley-Davidson fuel injected models (three for the big twins, one for the Sporty). For the big twins, the first filter application fits 95-99 models.





The last fits 08 to present. Harley got smart on this last



What's more impressive is the price difference. The 95-99 version costs about \$160.00 (up from 80 bucks just a couple of years ago). The 00-07 is back down to that less shocking \$80.00. The late model version costs a whopping job can be a bit spendy, it is worth the peace of mind and 19.00! Way to go Harley! Make it better and less expen- much less expensive than a break down! sive

Installation is not too difficult for any of these, although a service manual is a must. The only special tools involved are a stepless fuel line clamp tool, a T-20 Torx driver, and an inch/pounds torque wrench (for the 95-07 big twin models/07 and later XL). Better than a torque wrench, a torque screw driver typically has the lower scale capability re-

quired for this job.





For the 08 and later big twin models, a special spanner wrench is needed to remove the lock ring on the fuel canopy. This lock ring system replaces the self sealing screw fasteners and thus the Torx driver and torque wrench/driver are no longer needed.

The filters reside inside the fuel tank as part of the fuel pump assembly. The fuel canopy must be removed to access this assembly.

For brevity I won't go into specific details (use HD's factory service manual) on the procedure, but once the fuel canopy is separated from the tank, the filter can be changed. This is a good time to inspect the internal fuel lines. In some instances, the lines are routed in such a way that they make contact with the assembly bracket or the fuel tank channel. Vibration causes these areas to chafe and pin hole leaks can occur. If in doubt, replace them!

The Motor Company recommends replacing fuel filters every 25,000 miles. Most shops will recommend this change during the 25K service. Although this particular

Editor's note: The following is an explanation that Nick used for a local 44 meeting, however, this could be used to explain to any local how ABATE PAC works.

LOCAL 44 PAC REPORT by Nick Benson Sr

HOW I CHOOSE WHICH CANDIDATES TO SPEAK AT OUR MEETINGS

I was recently asked how I choose which candidate(s) to speak at our Local 44 meetings. As ABATE is a non-partisan organization, party affiliation plays no part in who ABATE endorses. However, throughout the history of ABATE, the Democrats have generally voted against us, but not always. Conversely, the Republicans have generally voted with us, but again, not always. This can be frustrating for an ABATE member of either party. I will use myself for an example of a member that leans to the right. Because I have so many interests, it gets difficult for me to endorse a democrat that votes with me at ABATE, but completely opposite on all my other beliefs. But for ABATE, I must simply state facts and therefore follow the same criteria for choosing a speaker of either party. Conversely, for a Democrat member of ABATE, it is difficult to endorse a Republican that may vote with motorcyclists, but opposite other Democrat ideology.

All ABATE members need to understand that ABATE of California is a political organization. It is not a social or judicial organization. Although ABATE does encourage all members to socialize and share our fondness of riding, the primary goal of ABATE is to keep our motorcycling rights intact via legislation. Other groups such as B.O.L.T. prefer to keep our motorcycling rights intact through the courts, and still other groups are simply for socializing. Because ABATE is strictly a political organization, it stands to reason that we will try and get only motorcyclist friendly legislators voted into office. Twenty-two years ago when I first joined ABATE we struggled to get any politician to speak at one of our meetings. Now we have quite few that seek us out!

I am not only the PAC rep for Local 44, but I am a member of the ABATE PAC division of ABATE. Any ABATE member in good standing can become a member of ABATE PAC simply by attending two PAC meetings in a row and then not missing two in a row. The PAC meetings are almost always at the Board of Directors meetings. This means that normally there will be two in Northern California and two in Southern California. However, the Board is working on some changes to have only one meeting in Northern California and three in Central California. By being a member of the PAC, you can vote on how our ABATE PAC fund money is disbursed e.g. which candidates will receive money from us. PAC members receive emails and updates of who we are or are not going to support in any given election. Basically, PAC members receive a little more information about the candidates and legislation before the general membership. Then the PAC rep or member will bring that information to the Local meeting. So sometimes my first bit of information about a candidate will come from the ABATE PAC.

- 1. Other times, candidates will contact me and ask me to endorse them. Because I am fairly well known in political circles to be affiliated with ABATE and an
 - activist, it is not uncommon for me to be asked for my endorsement.
 - a. The first thing I do is ask them to fill out an ABATE Question and Answer sheet like the one shown at the bottom of this report.
 - b. Sometimes the candidate will advise me that ABATE already has one on file and then I check with Carol Cromwell to get a copy of it.
 - c. If they fill out the Q&A to ABATE's liking, I then ask them to sit down and have a talk with me.
- At this talk, I will ask them about motorcycle issues and a host of other issues that are of concern to me and are usually the concerns of most ABATE members such as gun control, etc. I also always demand their cell phone number as I want to be able to reach them directly and not one of their flunkies.
 a. If they answer all the motorcyclist related issues to the way most of us would like them too, I then ask them if they would like to speak at our meeting.
 - b. If they say yes, I will contact the President of the Local and ask the President's permission to schedule that candidate to speak at our meeting.
 a start the ADATE of ADATE
- 3. Still other times, ABATE's Legislative Director Sandy Lubbers will contact the ABATE PAC members and tell us about a candidate in our area that is having a "meet and greet" or "fundraiser" and asks if one or more of us will attend that function.
 - a. If it is in our area I will attend that event and talk to them and in most cases I will ask them if they have filled out a Q&A and if not, if they will. From that, I will follow the above criteria stated in #1.
- 4. Sometimes I will read or hear about a candidate that is running for a race in our district. If this candidate seems like he is someone that would support our positions, I will seek him out and follow the above criteria to determine if we would like him to speak at our meeting.
 - There are some reasons I may not ask a candidate to speak at our meeting.
 - a. They may refuse to fill out a Q&A which is mandatory for ABATE to endorse them.
 - b. They may be right up front about not supporting biker's rights.
 - c. They may have a history of writing legislation that is counter to biker's right e.g. Dick Floyd or Paul Cook both of whom wrote and passed helmet bills.
 - d. In our Assembly race, we have one candidate that wants more CARB restrictions put onto motorcycles and cars. I probably would not ask him to speak because I cannot imagine any of us wanting to hear him promote more regulations on us.
- 6. What YOU should do if you want someone to speak at our meeting.
 - a. If you don't know them, contact me and I will contact them.
 - b. Make sure that you have them fill out a Q&A or contact me and I will get one for them. Without the Q&A, ABATE will almost never endorse them.
 - c. Contact me or our Local President Dave Hastings to see what date is available for your candidate to speak.
- 7. What you should do if you have questions about the speakers that I select.
 - a. Contact me!

Finally and VERY important, if you have a candidate in your area that ABATE is supporting and that you also would like to support, contact your PAC Rep, our Legislative Director, Carol Cromwell, or even the candidate themselves and let them know that you are available to help even two hours per month! Candidates cannot buy enough volunteers that WANT to be there helping. Most of us cannot afford to give them money, but it has been shown again and again that what a candidate really needs are volunteers to stuff envelopes, man telephone banks, hang signs, walk precincts, and a whole bunch of other stuff. Don't ever assume that you are unable to offer them something, each of us have our own talent and believe me, your candidate will find and use that talent. And they WILL remember you. I had a candidate call me and tell me that he wanted to know if I would help him and that I was referred by a person that ABATE helped get elected 25 years ago! 2014 is one of the most important years for us that there is. We will probably be getting at least 30 new Assembly members! You can help us make sure that ALL of them are motorcyclist friendly!

The Following are questions that are typically asked of candidates:

Would you oppose legislation and enforcement policies that allow "safety checkpoints" to single out motorcyclists rather than treating all road users equally?

Would you support legislation to include motorcyclists in those interests which cannot be discriminated against by Federal, State, business or private entities, if the motorcyclist's activities are lawful?

Would you oppose legislation requiring smog checks for motorcycles?

Would you support permanently designating the month of May as Motorcycle Awareness month, and support programs to encourage California motor vehicle operators to be more aware of motorcycle riders?

Would you support an amendment to the Mandatory Motorcycle helmet law to allow Freedom of Choice for adult riders?

Would you oppose legislation and enforcement policies that single out motorcycles as sources of noise pollution rather than treating all sources of noise

equally?

Would you support a resolution urging local authorities to set aside dedicated motorcycle parking in downtown and shopping areas? Would you oppose legislation to make lane sharing illegal?
