Bills at a Glance

AB-1964 Frazier Autonomous vehicles: This bill would expand the definition of the term "autonomous vehicle" to also include a remotely operated vehicle, defined as a specified type of vehicle that is capable of being operated by a driver or operator that is not inside of the vehicle. The bill would instead specify that a vehicle is not an autonomous vehicle if it is equipped with a collision avoidance system that is not capable of driving the vehicle without the active control or monitoring of a human operator that is seated in the driver's seat of the vehicle. *Double Referred, Committee on Transportation.*

AB-2121 Friedman Traffic safety: This bill would require, beginning June 1, 2022, and every 6 months thereafter, Caltrans to convene a committee of external design experts to advise on revisions to the Highway Design Manual. This bill would extend the period of time a prima facie speed limit may be justified by an engineering and traffic survey, as specified, if a registered engineer evaluates the section of the highway and finds that there has been an increase in traffic-related crashes. *Referred, Committee on Transportation*.

AB-2225 Grayson Smog check: exemption: historic vehicles: This bill would exempt motor vehicles that have been issued with the specialty plate described above from the requirement that it be inspected biennially upon registration. *Referred, Committee on Transportation.*

AB-2551 Bauer-Kahan Off-highway vehicular recreation: Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area: Alameda-Tesla Expansion Area: This bill would authorize the department to dispose of the portion of the Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area known as the "Alameda-Tesla Expansion Area" to permanently preserve that land for conservation purposes, as specified, if the department determines that disposing of the land is in the public interest. *In committee: Set, first hearing. Hearing canceled at the request of author.*



SB-1147 Glazer State park system: Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area: This bill would express the intent of the Legislature to enact subsequent legislation that would preserve the Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area for conservation purposes. *Referred, Rules Committee*.

SB-1032 Allen State parks: Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation Commission: This bill would make the creation of the commission permanent by deleting the January 1, 2023, repeal date. The bill would require the commission members to instead have expertise in and represent off-highway vehicle recreation, environmental protection, motorized access to nonmotorized recreation, law enforcement, environmental restoration, public health and safety, rural landowners and residents, biological or soil specialization, or the public at-large. *March 24th hearing postponed by committee*.

AB-2761 Gallagher Off-highway vehicles: reciprocity: This bill would permit application of that exception only if the other state recognizes an identification plate or device issued by the department as valid for use in that state. By narrowing the exception, the bill would expand the scope of an existing crime and would therefore impose a state-mandated local program. **Referred, Committee on Transportation.**

AB-2785 Cervantes Vehicles: off-highway vehicles (Spot): This bill would delete obsolete provisions relating to the report, and would make other technical, non-substantive changes.

AB-3311 Grayson Vehicles: insurance: This bill would increase the amount of liability insurance coverage an owner or operator of a motor vehicle is required to maintain to \$30,000 for bodily injury or death of one person, \$60,000 for bodily injury or death of all persons, and \$25,000 for damage to the property of others as a result of any one accident. This bill would make conforming changes to the definition of "proof of financial responsibility" for purposes of the provisions described above. *Referred to Committee on Insurance.*

SB-1351 Beall Department of Transportation: state highways (Spot): This bill would make a technical, non-substantive change to the latter provision. *Set for hearing May 29th*.




Hello June! It is warming up nicely. The rain seems to be behind us. Time more than ever to go for a ride.

ABATE focuses on three main areas: legislation, education, and safety. Safety is the one I am interested in here.

With the Covid-19 and all the disruption the government has brought to daily life, the potential for folks to be more distracted than usual and a bit more impatient than usual is real. Be it working fewer hours, getting laid off, concern about family members getting sick or being able to pay the bills, there is a lot on the plate now.

I drive from San Jacinto to Desert Hot Springs weekly. I drive 80-85 and most traffic is passing me like I am sitting still. I have a theory that the police don't want to interact with the public any more than necessary for their own health safety, so unless you are behaving in a very dangerous manner you get a pass. People running red lights has become out of control. And I don't mean the, it was pink, so I went through it, but after the light has turned red and cross traffic started moving folks are blowing the red light.

Riding a motorcycle on the street is a fulltime defensive exercise. I have said before and will say here again, when riding I am invisible, and every other vehicle is going to turn or pull in front of me. Add to that road hazards and debris, animals or people entering the roadway, it is a full-time job staying safe. The potential for major injury or death is higher for us than those in cages, no matter the precautions we take with safety equipment. And the most important safety equipment is our mind and eyes.



Or that girl looking at her phone in her lap instead of paying attention to traffic and weaving all over her lane. You do watch the other drivers' actions in their cars, don't you?



Lobbyist's Report

While we worked with Senate and Assembly offices to track all Covid related measures and amend/defeat upcoming Bill Votes during March and April - the Legislature finally returned May 4th and hearings are being held for Voting or Bills! The Assembly Transportation Committee held its hearing on the Assembly floor so Members could have 6 feet of social distancing. Governor Newson released his May Revised Budget on May 14th which now has an over \$50 Billion deficit! Yes, \$50 Billion deficit! Programs are going to be reduced in funding - BUT not eliminated. He is asking State employees to take a 10% reduction in salary or be furloughed, just as former Governor Schwarzenegger did!

The State Highway Building fund is anticipated to be reduced by almost \$400 Million due to less driving because of the Governor's MAN-DATORY STAY AT HOME ORDERS! Current construction will continue since it was funded in last year's budget, but we could see far less new freeway construction and repairs next year.

What does this budget mess mean to riders? Two important motorcycle programs are safe for now! The California Motorcycle Safety Program and the Off-Road Program funds are still protected by us. The Governor's Department of Finance has not "stolen" these user generated funds YET, as has been done by ALL previous Governors during a budget crisis! We will be attending and watching the Budget Committee meetings to make sure they do not try to take these allocated funds.

There will be another revise of the Budget this August because the Governor delayed the deadline to file taxes until this summer. Plus, there is all the trailer bills (see Bills at a Glance), which our Membership is aware of because of the Governor Brown late night noise amendment that affected all vehicles – these are introduced Spot Bills/placeholders to stuff items in at the deadline!

So, we will continue to monitor these issues as we have been these past months, Stay tuned for any Urgent Calls to Action from us.

We know rides and your other fundraisers are down. We appreciate that you're sending what you can to the Dedicated Lobbyist Fund!

California has always allowed valid "out of state" OHV registered vehicles to use our public lands. It has come to our attention that some of our neighboring states have recently implemented a "non-resident" fee for OHV's being operated in their state. By no longer honoring our California registration these states are reneging on a long standing tradition in the OHV community. These new regulations will be expensive and prove onerous to every legally licensed OHV owner that travels and recreates in other states. Our ABATE OHV Division is asking for your help and financial support in fighting this type of legislation. Assembly Bill 2761 sponsored by Assemblyman Gallagher (Republican—Yuba City) seeks to remedy this issue of reciprocity and ABATE of California is asking you to help the OHV communities of our states restore equal access to OHV areas for all legally licensed users.

In addition to AB 2761, Abate of California is proposing two other bills for our elected official's to consider this year. Our first bill would require DMV to allow rider's to take both the M/C skill's test and their DMV written exam during their CHP certified M/C training classes. After a rider successfully completes and passes both tests the school would submit the information to DMV and they would issue a valid M/C endorsement card by mail to the rider that is valid for the duration of their current California drivers license. Upon license renewal the M/C endorsement would then be added to their new license thereby saving the student the time and expense associated with visiting and testing at their local DMV office.

Our second bill would seek to exempt all M/C riders and especially our Military Veteran riders from being accessed a toll fee when traveling on a toll road within the state of California.

DMV Offers Relief to ID Cardholders, Vehicle Owners and Businesses Waives late fees, delays registration requirements and extends permits and IDs

Sacramento – The California Department of Motor Vehicles today announced it is waiving late fees and penalties for vehicle registration, extending expiring identification cards, temporary operating permits and motor carrier permits.

With authority granted under today's executive order signed by Governor Gavin Newsom, the DMV is:

- Waiving late fees and penalties for vehicle registration renewals due between March 16 and May 31, 2020, and paid within 60 days of the original expiration date. The requirement to have current license plate stickers is also waived for vehicles with registration expiring between March 4 and June 30, 2020.
- Extending identification cards expiring on or after March 4, 2020, to be valid through June 22, 2020 (60 days from today).
- Temporarily suspending for 60 days the requirement to submit a transfer of ownership within 10 days for vehicle transfers occurring on or after March 4, 2020, and the requirement to register a vehicle acquired or previously based outside of California within 20 days once registration becomes due.
- Allowing temporary operating permits that expire on or after March 4, 2020, to be valid another 60 days from today.
- Lengthening motor carrier permits expiring in March, April and May 2020 to June 30, 2020. A motor carrier permit is required for numerous transportation and commercial activities in California, including transporting property for compensation, hauling with a commercial vehicle weighing more than 10,000 pounds, and transporting hazardous materials.

"These measures can help lighten the burden many Californians are experiencing during this difficult time," DMV Director Steve Gordon said.

The DMV continues to encourage customers to renew their vehicle registration and complete vehicle transfers online or by using the DMV Virtual Field Office. Customers can also get replacement registration cards and license plate stickers online or at the hundreds of <u>DMV kiosks</u> across the state. Replacement cards and stickers at the DMV kiosks cost \$22 and print on the spot.

The DMV continues to provide essential services via mail, online, kiosks, call centers, available business partners and virtually to process critical transactions, including eligible driver license and vehicle registration renewals, during the COVID-19 pandemic. Customers can use the Services Advisor on the DMV website to learn their options to complete DMV tasks.

The relief measures are the latest DMV actions during the COVID-19 pandemic, including:

- Temporarily closing field offices. Following deep cleaning, expansion of virtual services and development of new protocols, the DMV soon will offer in-person services in each region. Information on office openings will be announced by DMV in the near future.
- Extending all driver licenses that expire between March 1 and May 31, 2020. Drivers 70 years and older are receiving a 120-day temporary paper extension in the mail, and drivers 69 and younger can request a free temporary paper extension online.
- [] Keeping expiring commercial driver licenses, endorsements and certificates valid through June 30, 2020.
- Temporarily waiving required in-person renewals for eligible driver license and identification cardholders with expirations in March, April, and May 2020. Individuals who meet the criteria are able to renew online or by mail.
- Launching the DMV Virtual Field Office to create new digital options for transactions that previously required an in-person office visit.
- Canceling all behind-the-wheel drive tests to honor social distancing guidelines.
- ☐ Suspending extended office hours and Saturday service.




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

NCOM CONVENTION RESCHEDULED: Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the National Coalition of Motorcyclists 35th annual NCOM Convention has been rescheduled for the middle of October at the Marriott Indianapolis East (7202 East 21st Street), the same location in Indiana as previously planned.

"At this time, the NCOM board urges you and your families to follow the advice of the health departments and keep yourselves safe," said James "Doc" Reichenbach II, Chairman of the NCOM Board of Directors, adding that "Losing one person is one too many."

Stay tuned for further details as NCOM continues to monitor this deadly global outbreak and its impact on the motorcycling community.

MOTORCYCLISTS RALLY AGAINST THE PANDEMIC: As the COVID-19 hysteria makes international headlines, the motorcycling world has come to the aid of those in need. Yamaha Motor Manufacturing has donated hundreds of respirators, Tyvek suits, and thousands of gloves and alcohol wipes to a local hospital in Georgia. Other manufacturers are donating PPE, such as Honda and Polaris.

In addition, Honda made an initial \$1 million pledge to food banks and meal programs across America, Canada and Mexico, and has repurposed its North American 3-D-printing capabilities to create protective force shields for medical providers.

ate protective face shields for medical providers.

Polaris, through its foundation, has donated nearly a quarter million dollars in technology to meet the needs of local students in Minnesota, Wisconsin and

Iowa to transition to distance learning, and employees have volunteered to work at a local ventilator manufacturing plant.

BMW even went as far as switching to face mask production during the global pandemic. Kawasaki, which temporarily shut down production, is producing face shields for health care providers, and donated four 55-gallon barrels of chemicals needed for hand sanitizer.

In Italy, small motorcycle manufacturer Benelli has stepped up and donated ventilators and Tyvek suits to the Italian Red Cross, while tire manufacturer Pirelli and its partners donated \$800,000 as well as 65 ventilators, 5,000 protective suits, and 20,000 protective masks to help local health care providers.

After being forced to close its doors as a "nonessential business," road gear company Vanson Leathers in Massachusetts revamped its facilities to produce face masks for local hospitals. Cycle Gear and parent company Comoto are chipping in with donations of supplies and eyewear for frontline health workers.

Companies aren't the only ones helping out, as countless motorcyclists around the world are helping out with their time and motorcycles. The owners of a motorcycle riding school in Littleport, England, are offering people in their area to pick up prescriptions and deliver them where needed for free. Similarly, groups of riders in the Italian region of Umbria are helping seniors who can't leave their home due to the lockdown by picking up their prescriptions and delivering them to their door. In Sudbury, Canada, members of the Warriors MC volunteered to help the Meals on Wheels service by delivering meals to local seniors on a daily basis.

In New York City, a group of motorcyclists collaborated with MasksForDocs.com to distribute personal protective equipment to doctors and hospitals. If you have an old pair of dirt bike/dual-sport, ski/snowboard, or general lab goggles collecting dust somewhere, Goggles for Docs would gladly take them off your hands, and they have over 200 dropoff locations in 35 states as well as Canada, Mexico, the Netherlands, Spain and Panama.

Alamo Cycle Plex, a dealership in San Antonio, Texas even donated a 2019 Kawasaki Ninja to a local nurse whose bike was stolen while she was busy with the public health crisis.

GLOBAL MOTORCYCLE MARKET IMPACT-ED BY COVID-19: "When the car business sneezes, motorcycles catch a cold," is an old saying in the motorcycle industry, so it should come as no surprise that as the Coronavirus pandemic has negatively impacted automobile sales, it has hurt motorcycle sales even worse.

Worldwide, motorcycle sales have plummeted nearly 50%, with hard-hit Italy reporting a 69% reduction. In India, one of the world's strongest bike markets, sales were down some 40% in the first quarter of 2020, and Q2 numbers portend more dismal numbers as lockdowns and factory shutdowns persist.

China, where the virus started, not only has numerous motorcycle manufacturers who are suffering, but is also home to many parts manufacturers that other companies around the globe rely on to continue building their bikes, causing extreme disruptions to the supply chain.

Here in the U.S., financial analysts forecast the hit to Harley-Davidson sales will be about 25%, according to Reuters. The Milwaukee-based bike maker has suspended production, laid off staff and implemented salary cuts.

Even those motorcycle dealerships that have remained open have reduced hours and staffing and, even worse, are missing out on peak springtime sales.

POWERSPORTS EMPLOYEES INCLUDED AMONG ESSENTIAL WORKERS: According to newly revised federal guidelines, powersports em-

ployees, in manufacturing, distribution, sales, rent-

als, and maintenance, are now considered "essential

workers." This clarifies that many powersports businesses nationwide can remain open, thanks to the addition of new language added to the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) Guidance on Essential Critical Infrastructure Workers.

This guidance, which outlines the federal government's position on essential workers, is currently in use by 33 of the states with stay-at-home orders, and has always listed "automotive repair" employees as essential workers. According to the Motorcycle Industry Council (MIC), the CISA 3.0 guidance for the transportation sector now expressly includes: "Workers critical to the manufacturing, distribution, sales, rental, leasing, repair, and maintenance of vehicles and other transportation equipment (including electric vehicle charging stations) and the supply chains that enable these operations to facilitate continuity of travel-related operations for essential workers."

JOY RIDING DISCOURAGED UNDER "STAY HOME" ORDERS: "Stay at home, shelter in place, self-quarantine, and practice social distancing," are the current buzzwords in response to the Coronavirus worldwide outbreak, but is it okay to just go for a ride? It's not a simple answer, and may vary between states depending on public mandates in place, but for many the answer is "No."

For example, Michigan State Police First Lt. Mike Shaw told WWJ News that "One of the biggest questions that we get through our social media is: 'Does the order allow me to just clear my head by driving around in my car or on my motorcycle?' -- and it does not," referring to Governor Gretchen Whitmer's "Stay Home" executive order in effect since March 24th.

Like many other states, Michiganders are instructed to avoid all unnecessary travel until the order is lifted. "You are supposed to stay at home," Shaw said. "The reason for that is if you break down, the police are going to have to come out there, the tow truck driver, and you're making contact with all those people," Shaw explained. "If you get in a crash, we're gonna have to come out there and police up that crash (not to mention the hospital)."

People are permitted to drive to their jobs, the grocery store or other places they need to be, and police will not be stopping travelers to ask where they're going, so if your state limits travel to essential needs, you're of course allowed to ride your motorcycle.

If you do ride, be sure to plan your trip ahead and avoid contact with other people. Pay at the pump with a credit card instead of going inside the gas station. Wear gloves, a full-face helmet or mask. After your ride, clean and disinfect your bike, helmet, gloves, and phone.

On the bright side, the roads are clear and most police officers won't be pulling people over for minor traffic infractions, or going a couple of miles over the speed limit.

REAL ID POSTPONED AMID CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC: Travelers have myriad other things to worry about, thanks to the COVID-19 virus, but federally compliant driver's licenses are not among them for now.

Real ID is the federally compliant driver's license that was, until recently, supposed to be required for boarding a domestic flight beginning October 1st (if you didn't use some other form of acceptable identification, such as a passport), but is now postponed until Oct. 1, 2021.

The desire for a more secure form of identification is based on legislation that became law in 2005, on the recommendation of the 9/11 Commission.

IDAHO ENACTS ANTI-PROFILING LAW: Idaho Governor Brad Little (R) signed Senate Bill 1292 into law on March 26, 2020, making Idaho the fourth state to pass legislation to "provide that law enforcement shall not engage in motorcycle profiling," and now joins the states of Washington (passed in 2011),

Maryland (in 2016) and Louisiana (2019).

Motorcycle profiling is defined under S.1292 as "the arbitrary use of the fact that a person rides a motorcycle or wears motorcycle-related paraphernalia as a factor in deciding to stop and question, take enforcement action, arrest, or search a person or vehicle."

The bipartisan measure, pushed by Rep. Robert Anderst (R-Nampa) for the past three years to forbid "motorcycle profiling" by police -- deciding to pull someone over or arrest or search them solely because they're riding a motorcycle or wearing motorcycle gear -- handily passed the Senate by a vote of 25-9 on February 26, and then 38-29 in the House on March 18.

As they have for the past two years, motorcycling enthusiasts and members of motorcycle groups turned out in big numbers to testify in favor of the legislation, saying they've been profiled by law enforcement officers when they were abiding by all laws.

"This is not an anti-law enforcement bill," Rep. Anderst told the legislature. Instead, he said the process has helped improve the relationship between law enforcement and motorcyclists.

The U.S. Senate approved a Motorcycle Profiling Resolution (Senate Resolution 154) by unanimous consent on Dec. 11, 2018, addressing concerns of riders nationwide regarding law enforcement discriminatorily profiling motorcyclists over mode of transportation or style of dress.

JUDGE DISMISSES WACO LAWSUITS: A federal judge has dismissed 13 civil rights lawsuits filed by 45 of the bikers arrested after the deadly 2015 shootout involving police who had surrounded motorcycle club members attending a regularly scheduled Texas Confederation of Clubs and Independents meeting at the Twin Peaks restaurant in Waco, Texas that left nine bikers dead, 20 seriously injured, and 192 arrested as "gang members" on RICO charges of "engaging in organized criminal activity."

Ultimately, all charges were dismissed. Only one case ever went to trial, and that ended in a hung jury and mistrial. Three officers who were accused of firing indiscriminately into the crowd were cleared by prosecutors in 2016.

About 134 of those bikers filed civil rights lawsuits alleging that McLennan County, the city of Waco, local law enforcement, and others violated the plaintiffs' civil rights by arresting them on a blanket arrest warrant without probable cause. In a 13-page order issued April 6, 2020, U.S. District Judge Alan Albright ruled the bikers failed to sufficiently allege their unlawful search and seizure claims, due process violations and unlawful arrest. Attorneys for the bikers remain confident the plaintiffs will win on appeal.

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











Sacramento - The California Department of Motor Vehicles will reopen select field offices across the state on Friday, May 8, to assist customers with appointments and with transactions that require an in-person visit to a field office during the COVID-19 pandemic. The DMV continues to encourage customers to use online services, its expanded virtual services and other service channels to complete transactions, including driver license and vehicle registration renewals.

Beginning Friday, the following 25 field offices will open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. with the exception of opening at 9 a.m. Wednesday:



May 8, 2020 DMV Extends All Temporary Driving Permits

Covers driver license permits and commercial learner's permits expiring between March and

No action necessary on the part of drivers

Sacramento – The California Department of Motor Vehicles is extending driver license permits and commercial learner's permits expiring during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Driver license permits expiring between March and June 30, 2020 are extended six months or to a date 24 months from the date of application, whichever is earlier. Commercial learner's permits expiring between March and June 2020 are now valid through June 30, 2020. The extensions require no individual action on the part of drivers.

The DMV is extending these permits for those who may not be able to get a driver license or commercial driver license while behind-the-wheel drive tests are suspended.

The DMV has alerted California law enforcement of the extensions. California drivers may continue to drive with their expired permits. Californians with a suspended record are not eligible for the temporary extension.

The DMV continues to provide essential services via mail, online, kiosks, call centers, available business partners and virtually to process critical transactions, including eligible driver license and vehicle registration renewals, during the COVID-19 pandemic. Customers can use the <u>Services Advisor</u> on the DMV website to learn their options to complete DMV tasks.

The relief measures are the latest DMV actions during the COVID-19 pandemic, including:

<u>Temporarily closing field offices</u>. Following deep cleaning, expansion of virtual services and development of new protocols, the DMV is <u>offering limited in-person services</u> in each region.

Extending all driver licenses that expire between March 1 and May 31, 2020. Drivers 70 years and older are receiving a 120-day temporary paper extension in the mail, and drivers 69 and younger can request a free temporary paper extension online.

Keeping expiring commercial licenses, endorsements and certificates valid through June 30, 2020.

Extending identification cards expiring on or after March 4, 2020, to be valid through June 22, 2020.

<u>Waiving late fees</u> and penalties for vehicle registration renewals due between March 16 and May 31, 2020, and paid within 60 days of the original expiration date, as well as delaying other registration requirements.

Temporarily waiving required in-person renewals for eligible driver license and identification cardholders with expirations in March, April, and May 2020. Individuals who meet the criteria are able to <u>renew online</u> or by mail.

Launching the <u>DMV Virtual Field Office</u> to create new digital options for transactions that previously required an in-person office visit.

Canceling all behind-the-wheel drive tests to honor social distancing guidelines.

Suspending extended office hours and Saturday service.

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
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
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

Recently the off-road community was caught totally off guard by the passage of Assembly Bill 1595 that severely impacts the ability to modify and use "upgraded" off-highway side-by-side vehicles.

AB 1595 prohibits the use of (approved/sanctioned racing style) seat belt harnesses, prohibits the addition of full roll cages, and requires mandatory helmet use in these and ONLY these vehicles.

Portions of this law went into effect on January 1, 2013 and all parts of the law were enforced on July 1, 2013. AB 1595 had an immediate and very negative impact on side-by side safety and prevents the use of many of these family recreational vehicles that have been upgraded with additional safety equipment.


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
