Politics - Legislative Bills At A Glance

Presented by The Lombardo Group, ABATE Lobbyist

AB 43 Friedman (D – Glendale, Chair of Assembly Transportation). Traffic safety. This bill would require, beginning June 1, 2022, and every 6 months thereafter, Caltrans to convene a committee of external design experts to advise on revisions to the Highway Design Manual. This bill would extend the period of time a prima facie speed limit may be justified by an engineering and traffic survey, as specified, if a registered engineer evaluates the section of the highway and finds that there has been an increase in traffic-related crashes.(TRACKING/MEETINGS WITH STAKEHOLDERS)

*Passed Senate Transportation Committee 7/13/21, referred to Appropriations Committee

AB 122 BOERNER HORVATH (D – OCEANSIDE) VEHICLES: REQUIRED STOPS: BICYCLES. This bill would require a person riding a bicycle, when approaching a stop sign at the entrance of an intersection, to yield the right-of-way to any vehicles that have stopped at the entrance of the intersection, have entered the intersection, or that are approaching on the intersecting highway close enough to constitute an immediate hazard, and shall continue to yield the right-of-way to those vehicles until reasonably safe to proceed. (TRACKING/MEETINGS WITH STAKEHOLDERS)

*Passed Senate Appropriations Committee on 7/15/21

AB 232 Gallagher (R – Yuba City) Off-highway vehicles: reciprocity. Existing law requires every off-highway motor vehicle that is not registered under the Vehicle Code to display an identification plate or device issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles, with certain exceptions, including an off-highway motor vehicle with a currently valid identification or registration permit issued by another state. Except as otherwise specified, a violation of the Vehicle Code is punishable as an infraction.

This bill would permit application of that exception only if the other state recognizes an identification plate or device issued by the department as valid for use in that state. (SUPPORTING)* Passed Senate Appropriations Committee on 7/15/21

<u> AB-1512 Bauer Kahan (D – Orinda) Off-highway vehicular recreation: Carnegie</u> <u> State Vehicular Recreation Area: Alameda-Tesla Expansion Area</u>

This bill would require the department to preserve, in perpetuity, land known as the "Alameda-Tesla Expansion Area," which is currently part of the Carnegie State Vehicular Recreation Area, for conservation purposes, including for nonmotorized public recreation, as provided. The bill would require the department to work with other entities to have \$9,000,000 appropriated, transferred, or donated to the Off-Highway Vehicle Trust Fund for these purposes, as specified.

Dual Similar Bill, SB 799 Glazer, same District - Bill Vetoed by Governor in 2019.

Page 2

SB 66 Allen (D – Santa Monica) California Council on the Future of Transportation: advisory committee: autonomous vehicle technology.

This bill would require the secretary to establish an advisory committee, the California Council on the Future of Transportation, to provide the Governor and the Legislature with recommendations for changes in state policy to ensure that as autonomous vehicles are deployed, they enhance the state's efforts to increase road safety, promote equity, and meet public health and environmental objectives. The bill would require the council to be chaired by the secretary and consist of at least 22 additional members, selected by the chair or designated, as specified, who represent, among others, transportation workers, various state and local agencies, and a disability rights organization.(SUPPORTING)

SB 227 Jones (R – Santee) Off-Highway vehicles.

This bill would require, for the issuance or renewal of a competition identification, a specified configuration for the vehicle identification number and product identification number for an off-highway motor vehicle or ATV that is model year 2022 or later and is used solely for competition not on a public highway. The bill would impose restrictions on the operation of a competition motorcycle or ATV on public lands, including, among others, a requirement that a rider possess a current and valid competition card from a competition-sanctioning organization when practicing for a sanctioned event on public lands. Because operating a competition motorcycle or ATV on public lands in violation of those requirements would be a crime, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program. (SUPPORTING)

SR-41 CABALLERO (D – SALINAS) MOTORCYCLE PROFILING: According to the Department of Motor Vehicles, there were 857,273 motorcycles registered in California in 2019. Motorcycle profiling is the illegal use of the fact that a person rides a motorcycle or wears motorcycle-related apparel as a factor in deciding to stop and question, take enforcement action, arrest, or search a person or vehicle with or without legal basis under the Constitution of the United States. Rallies to raise awareness and combat motorcycle profiling have been held in multiple states and six times at the California State Capitol since 2011.

California has always allowed valid "out of state" OHV registered vehicles to use our public lands. It has come to our attention that some of our neighboring states have recently implemented a "non-resident" fee for OHV's being operated in their state. By no longer honoring our California registration these states are reneging on a long standing tradition in the OHV community. These new regulations will be expensive and prove onerous to every legally licensed OHV owner that travels and recreates in other states. Our ABATE OHV Division is asking for your help and financial support in fighting this type of legislation. Assembly Bill 2761 sponsored by Assemblyman Gallagher (Republican—Yuba City) seeks to remedy this issue of reciprocity and ABATE of California is asking you to help the OHV communities of our states restore equal access to OHV areas for all legally licensed users.

In addition to AB 2761, Abate of California is proposing two other bills for our elected official's to consider this year. Our first bill would require DMV to allow rider's to take both the M/C skill's test and their DMV written exam during their CHP certified M/C training classes. After a rider successfully completes and passes both tests the school would submit the information to DMV and they would issue a valid M/C endorsement card by mail to the rider that is valid for the duration of their current California drivers license. Upon license renewal the M/C endorsement would then be added to their new license thereby saving the student the time and expense associated with visiting and testing at their local DMV office.

Our second bill would seek to exempt all M/C riders and especially our Military Veteran riders from being accessed a toll fee when traveling on a toll road within the state of California.

Senate Resolution 41 Caballero (D – Salinas) passed the Senate on unanimous vote of 39-0! After all the years of work by many from the motorcyclists working group, gathering information such as the study of Motorcycle Riders being profiled and other support documents, we were finally successful in passing SR 41. Many Thanks to Bobby Tabaldo, Gil Mellon, Steve Howe, Chuck Pederson, Spike, Nick Benson Sr., Shawn Mahoney, Nick Haris, and Mynette Boykin with so many apologies to any of those supporters I left out! This of course is only the beginning as SR 41 calls upon the many Law Enforcement departments (Sheriffs and Police) to meet with our group and to come up with suggested legislative solutions to ongoing Profiling by the Police against Motorcycle Riders! Much more work to be done! Stay Tuned...

The Legislature is back from recess as of August 16th and adjourns Session on September 15th. This is the time of year we have to be on our toes because bills are completely gutted and changed to a different bill entirely. If any hostile Anti-Motorcyclists bills appear, we will send out an ALERT! Many of the other bills are moving through the process, go see our Legislative Update Bills At a Glance in this issue of the Bailng Wire.

ABATE of WASHINGTON Safety & Education by Texas Larry Walker

"Texas" Larry Walker is a nationally certified Rider Coach for the novice, intermediate, and advanced training. He is the Senior Instructor for Navy Region Northwest, a long-time motorcyclist rights advocate, with well over 40 years of riding experience.

When was the last time you took any training? Before you hit me with the traditional response of "I've been riding since Noah was a mess cook, I don't need to do that stuff," reconsider. I've been riding for over 40 years, and I teach motorcycle skills for a living, and I still get to training every year. It always pays off in spades to get a fresh set of eyes on me to keep the skills sharp.

There is a lot more stuff out there than just the basic course for novice riders. With the new paradigm in licensing, i.e., advanced testing for full endorsements, the vendors are putting up more advanced training, such as the MSF Advanced Riders Course. It is a level 2 parking lot course, but it will definitely help you up your game. Skills learned at lower speeds in a controlled environment translate directly to the higher speeds of the open road. Beyond that, there are street-oriented classes on closed courses (tracks) that work on developing better vision and line selection in curves and improved active use of the brakes to "tune" the bike while in motion. After that, there are many providers that run actual track days that have classroom instruction as well as in motion demonstration of techniques.

Any of the offered training is appropriate for any style of motorcycle, from big bore road sofa to sport bikes. The techniques are the same, merely the seating position changes.

Finally, before you push back about the \$250-\$350 price tag, price repair parts for your bike, gear replacement, or medical coverage. The price to help you prevent that stuff seems pretty reasonable.

HIGHWAY BILL PASSES HOUSE INCLUDING MOTORCYCLIST-SUPPORTED PROVISIONS: The U.S. House of Representatives passed the "Investing in a New Vision for the Environment and Surface Transportation in America" or INVEST in America Act (H.R. 3684) on July 1, 2021 by a mostly partisan vote of 221-201. The five-year \$715 billion surface transportation and water infrastructure bill directs federal investments in roads, bridges, transit, rail, and clean water programs, and also contains several key provisions

benefiting motorcycle riders:
SEC. 3005: GRANT PROGRAM TO PROHIBIT RACIAL PROFILING was amended to include grant funding to include "the costs

of collecting, maintaining, and evaluating data on the driver's mode of transportation at traffic stops" to help determine biker profiling by law enforcement.

SEC. 3011: STOP MOTORCYCLE CHECKPOINT FUNDING, not only expands prohibitions on motorcycle-only checkpoints, but also prohibits law enforcement activities that "otherwise profile and stop motorcycle operators or motorcycle passengers using as a factor the

clothing or mode of transportation of such operators or passengers."

SEC. 3013: MOTORCYCLIST ADVISORY COUNCIL, reauthorizes the MAC to "advise the Secretary, the Administrator of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, and the Administrator of the Federal Highway Administration on transportation issues

National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, and the Administrator of the Federal Highway Administration on transportation issues of concern to motorcyclists," including "barrier design, road design, construction, and maintenance practices, and the architecture and implementation of intelligent transportation systems technologies."

H.R. 3684 specifies that motorcycles must be taken into consideration when the Department of Transportation (DOT) conducts safety studies on autonomous vehicles.

Additionally, the Highway Bill earmarks \$5,760,000 in 405 safety funds to states for motorcyclist safety in the next fiscal year, and increases program funding by more than a third annually through 2025.

Once the Senate passes their own version of the highway bill, both chambers will come together in a Conference Committee to iron out any differences before sending the bill to the President for his signature.

Time is of the essence, as the current surface transportation bill expires on September 30.

MIC 'RIDE WITH US' INITIATIVE AIMS TO GET "NEW RIDERS, RIDING MORE": "Ride With Us" -- the powersports industry's multifaceted market expansion program -- has been officially launched by the Motorcycle Industry Council (MIC).

"In late 2019 at MIC's Communication Symposium, we shared the MIC's vision for growing ridership – more riders, riding more," said Paul Vitrano, chairman of the MIC Board of Directors and senior vice president/senior assistant general counsel of Polaris, in the announcement. "We were excited to begin operationalizing the plan in early 2020, but the pandemic caused us to pause and refocus our efforts on helping powersports businesses remain open."

"While we were navigating the coronavirus, we also were working hard to prepare for the post-pandemic environment," said Erik Pritchard, president and CEO of the MIC. "Our preparation included a number of initiatives tied to each phase of the new rider journey --

Inspire, Explore, Engage, and Integrate -- as well supporting new-rider education initiatives."

The MIC is leading a task force composed of industry-leading marketing talent to help develop the program. As a part of the 'Ride With Us' program, the MIC is also delivering new 45-minute first-ride experiences for people who have never ridden a motorcycle before.

"Our industry has needed a unifying market expansion effort targeting potential and returning riders, and the MIC is delivering it with Ride With Us," said Vitrano. "We urge all industry stakeholders to rally around this initiative as it rolls out to support people at every stage of their journey to becoming a lifelong rider."

MORE COUNTRIES BANNING GAS-POWERED MOTORCYCLES: It seems that more and more nations are beginning to adopt a policy of allowing only brand new electric-powered vehicles to be sold in their jurisdictions in the near future, and now Indonesia, Southeast Asia's largest motorcycle market with more than 112-million motorcycles on its busy streets, has declared that no more new internal combustion engine (ICE) motorcycles should be sold in the country by 2050.

Singapore also adopted a similar policy by banning motorcycles they consider "old" from their streets by 2028. India, as well as some European nations, had already enacted similar measures earlier. Now, Canada is the newest country that's taking on drastic measures to significantly cut greenhouse gas emissions.

In a recent announcement from the Canadian government agency, Transport Canada (TC), they are accelerating the complete eradication of ICE-powered vehicles by outlawing them by 2035 -- which is 5-years earlier than the original 2040 plan.

"Today, we take another important step on the road to net zero by accelerating our zero-emission vehicle targets to 2035," said Seamus O'Regan Jr., the Canadian minister of natural resources. "Achieving this target will require all Canadians, and businesses big and small, to embrace the change and go electric."

Like other countries initiating combustion vehicle sales bans, the plan is to end new vehicle sales, and does not mention plans for older vehicles. Most such plans rely on older vehicles eventually phasing themselves out as they become impractical to repair and own over time.

<u>EASYRIDERS ON THE COMEBACK TRAIL</u>: Easyriders magazine was known as the "biker's bible" for over 50 years, before ceasing production in 2019, but now Classic Easyriders will kickstart a new era beginning this December, drawing on its rich heritage as an integral part of the biker lifestyle.

"Our industry needs a paper magazine as well as a digital presence now more than ever before, to capture and promote the American motorcycle culture," says editor-in-chief Dave Nichols.

While there will be no nudity as in the original Easyriders, Classic Easyriders (www.ClassicEasyriders.com) will bring readers the look and feel of biker magazines of the 1970s and '80s, with fresh new choppers, bobbers, classic motorcycles and the latest builds by today's top builders. The monthly magazine will also include interviews with biker legends and showcase motorcycle-related parts, products and accessories.
