

JUNE 5, 2012 ELECTION Headline — \$16 Billion State Budget hole again! The June 15th deadline to pass a budget, or Legislators don't get paid, is also fast approaching.

Welcome all new and returning members! Our Southern Regional Rally is now over. How impressive it was to see many of our Locals represented at this event. The opportunity to meet with people from all over our great state and discuss ABATE in a casual setting was indeed invigorating, educational, and inspiring.

Elections and candidate support: Information on candidates is being processed now and should be available soon. Look to see who ABATE suggests and offer them help with phone calls, putting up signs, and/or canvassing. These are the candidates who will support us so we should support them where we can.

One of ABATE's flyers caught the attention of the California Department of Justice (DOJ). The main item that caught the attention of the DOJ was the advertising of a poker run with a money payout for a high and low hand. And the second item was the "proceeds would benefit ABATE". ABATE being a 501 C (not-for-profit) the DOJ was concerned that a benefit was being held by ABATE and ABATE could be "cheated out of its' money". Promoters of fund-raisers must be registered, and the "charity" beneficiary must be named; "often-times big promoters put on fund-raisers and never turn money over to the charity", so they were looking out for ABATE. "And if the event is not registered – ABATE would have no



legal recourse to get the money." By the way, charities are "supposed" to receive 90% of the profits".

Poker runs for money and 50/50's are NOT LEGAL and SHOULD NOT BE on the flyers, nor conducted at anyone's event. Failure to comply has very serious consequences. It jeopardizes ABATE as an organization, - ABATE could lose its 501 C status, and the Local putting on the event could lose any monies the DOJ determines you collected, and of course federal fines and the pending expensive litigation. This won't stop us from having runs; we will just have to adjust our wording and activities.

It has come to my attention that Local 00 is not truly a Local that pays fees to support ABATE. It is meant to be a holding point for members who have lost their Local. It is not meant to be a permanent home and those in it need to find a Local, as soon as they can, in their area, to join and become active, supportive members of an active Local in ABATE of California.















Pac/Lobbyist Report

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

CONGRESS TO CONSIDER MOTORCY-CLE-ONLY CHECKPOINTS: In Congressional action on the federal highway bill, a conference committee has been named to consolidate the House-passed bill H.R.4348 and Senate bill S.1813. Language to prohibit federal funding of Motorcycle-Only Roadside Checkpoints is contained in H.R.7, and riders are encouraged to contact their congressional members to urge the conference committee to adopt that wording into the final measure.

LEGAL BATTLE CONTINUES AGAINST MOTORCYCLE ROADBLOCKS: Although the first round in the battle that the law firm of Proner & Proner is waging on behalf of motorcyclists to prevent the New York State Police and other agencies from conducting motorcycle-only checkpoints was won by the police, AIM (Aid to Injured Motorcyclists) Attorney Mitchell Proner believes the judge's ruling overlooked the evidence that motorcyclists were targeted for reasons other than

The challenged checkpoints were set up in proximity to well known motorcycle events. Motorcyclists traveling to those events were forced off the roadway by the police, regardless of any individualized suspicion, and compelled to undergo inspections. Although the inspections were termed "safety" inspections, the majority of tickets issued at the checkpoints were for violations unrelated to safety and the prevention of motorcycle accidents.

The attorneys of Proner & Proner are appealing the District Court decision to the 2nd Circuit Court of Appeals. On March 21, 2012, Mitch Proner filed a lengthy brief arguing that the checkand seizure under the Fourth Amendment. Oral decision soon thereafter.

Proner has vowed to take the fight all the way to the Supreme Court if necessary. As a rider himself and a trial lawyer, Proner is intent on defending the rights of all riders who are being unfairly targeted. "Our right to be free from unreasonable seizures was a gift from our founding fathers which must be defended regardless of personal cost."

> PENNSYLVANIA PROPOSAL WOULD MANDATE SAFETY COURSES FOR YOUNG RIDERS: A bill aimed at increasing the safety of young motorcycle riders has passed in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives 181-1 and is on its way to the Senate.

"Experience counts when it comes to motorcycle safety," Grove said. "Operating a motorcycle is very different than driving a car and my goal is to increase the safety and awareness of Pennsylvania's young motorcyclists."

Also under Grove's bill, riders on a class M learner's permit and under the age of 18 must complete 65 hours of practical driving and have held the learner's permit for six months before they can take the junior license exam.

Currently, riders have to pass a test in order to get a riders' permit, which is valid for one year, and then pass a driving test to get a motorcycle license.

A course, called the Pennsylvania Motorcycle Safety Program, is optional but is not required. If a rider takes and passes the course, they automatically receive a class M license.

KANSAS LEGISLATURE STREAMLINES MOTORCYCLE LICENSURE: Kansas Governor Sam Brownback has approved a measure to allow class M motorcycle license applicants who have successfully completed prior motorcycle safety training in accordance with Department of Defense instruction 6055.04 (DoDI 6055.04) to receive their license without completing further written and driving testing. House Bill 2459 was sponsored by Rep. Tom Sloan (R-Lawrence), and was signed into law by Gov. Brownback on March 21, 2012.

PERMANENT MOTORCYCLE WARNING SIGNS INSTALLED ACROSS U.S.: To kick off National Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month, "Watch for Motorcycles" signs are being donated and installed by Allstate Insurance to help prevent motorcycle crashes at intersections.

Currently, there is no standard sign for motorcycle awareness, and Allstate aims to standardize warning signs for motorcycle safety to target dangerous intersections in more than 30 cities across the country this year.

The yellow, diamond-shaped signs were developed by Allstate as part of its "Once is Never Enough" program, an awareness campaign that encourages people to look twice for motorcycles at intersections.

The permanently installed signs caution motorists to "Watch for Motorcycles" at intersections, which is where most multi-vehicle collisions occur for riders. The signs were designed to establish a standardized warning device that can be used by any local or state agency and would be recognizable to riders and motorists across the country.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, 46% of all multi-vehicle Anyone under 18 would have to take the crashes occur at intersections, oftentimes as a result of a vehicle turning left, impeding the motorcyclist's right-of-way.



> Abaton said according to the helmet law, any person caught not wearing the standard protective motorcycle helmet will be punished with a fine of P1,500 for the first offense; P3,000 for the second offense; P5,000 for the third offense, and P10,000 and confiscation of the driver's license for the fourth and succeeding offenses.

Since writing that piece I had an opportunity to attend training on driver roadway performance/human factors. This training was an evaluation of the current data and research that has been done for drivers using the roadway. Part of this research included "Gap Acceptance."

A very rough description of "Gap Acceptance" is that drivers intending to cross a roadway from a side road, make a left turn or merge into traffic tend to accept a gap of 6 seconds for the approaching vehicle as being too close to safely make their intended movement. In other words, if I am riding down the roadway and a car waiting to make a left turn sees me and that driver estimates that I am about 5 seconds away, that driver will tend to wait for me to pass before making their turn. If they believe that I am more than 6 seconds away, they will tend to make their turn.

This research also shows that in heavy traffic where roadway users, which is drivers and us riders, have to wait for a longer period of time in order to make a move, will tend to reduce their gap acceptance. That is they could make their movement if they believe they have a 4 second gap, or less at times of heavy traffic with long

I have to say again, I am not saying that we should never scan ahead 12-15 seconds or maybe even further when we can. There are times when looking this far ahead can be effective. What I am suggesting, is that as riders we need to be aware of the complete roadway conditions we are riding in and that the current research suggests the greater hazards to us are closer to us so this is where our attention should be. One other very important point about this research to keep in mind, even though it was done with drivers in vehicles, some of these drivers are also motorcycle riders. So this information does apply to us as riders.

Just a few last points to go over again. We are responsible for our own safety. Yes we do want to push motorcycle rider awareness on the roadways, but people will always make mistakes. We cannot rely on other drivers or riders to keep us safe, we have to do it ourselves. No safety technique or practice is absolute. Crashes can still happen to anybody, and unsafe riders can ride without crashing. The best we can do is try to give ourselves the best potential at being safe. The more we increase the potential of our riding safety, the longer we should be able to ride without incident. Conversely, sooner or later the odds will catch up to that unsafe rider in a bad way.

I hope I have showed in this piece that research, information and data gives us the best chance at solid rider safety information. There are a lot of different sources of information out there in many forms. It is always proper to verify the source of any safety information that you hear or read about in order to make sure that the information is good. I will always try to provide the sources of my information, but anytime I don't, please ask me to do so. You need to be sure you are getting the right information in order to make the right decisions.

As always, thoughts and information are always welcome email anytime. I am always interested in anything that anybody has to say or wants to talk about when it comes to rider safety - I kind of think I showed that at the rally - sorry I just can't help myself.

Tech Tips by Craig Griswold

When I was a kid I worked at Mel's Chevron, located in the little one horse town of Colfax, CA. The full service gas station was a dying breed back then, but there were still a few around. Mel was my first real mentor in work ethics. Man, if you were on the clock you had better be doing something productive. Standing watch over the gas station was not one of the tasks. No customers to help? Start washing windows or scrubbing oil spots. When a car pulled in they got damn near everything but a tune-up along with a tank of gas. That sounds like the old days, but it was only the early 80's. Since then, gas stations have evolved into primarily self serve outfits. Gasoline has changed as well.

This month we'll hash over some gouge on the fuel that feeds our scoots, an interesting topic in more ways than one. Several years back, when we thought two and a half bucks a gallon was appalling, I heard somebody say that a gallon of gas is still cheaper than a gallon of milk. Nice analogy, but I don't consume 150 gallons of milk per month! Either way, the more expensive this precious commodity becomes, the more inclined we'll be to get out on two wheels. Let's talk about some of the "ingredients" in gasoline and what they mean with regards to performance.

Breaking fuel down to the degree of a chemistry lecture would not only bore most folks to tears (including me), it would be counterproductive. Who cares? But there are a few elements that have significant importance to folks. The first

thing that comes to mind is octane.

For starters, a fuel's octane rating is nothing more than that fuel's ability to resist detonation. Detonation, the great engine destroyer is also known as pinging and spark knock. Ideally, combustion is a controlled, uniform event. A nice clean flame front traveling across the top of the piston at just the right time is the intent. When fuel burns in more of an uncontrolled manner, due to insufficient octane, it results in detonation. The sound could be characterized as marbles banging around in the cylinders. Higher octane ratings by themselves will not give you better performance. Higher octane does allow an engine to operate with higher compression and the result, with all other things equal, is higher performance.

While at the pump, if you're not watch- and on facebook. ing the price readout spin through the numbers in an unreadable blur while the gallons ticker is barely moving at all, you might wonder what all the mumbo jumbo is under the octane number. It is the formula that was used to calculate the octane rating, which by the way, is not a true octane number. It is what is called an "antiknock index" number (AKI). This number is the average of two octane numbers arrived at by two different kinds of tests. One is called ASTM Research Method and is often abbreviated R or RON. The other is the ASTM Motor Method, M or MON. The antiknock index number on the pump is then this average, or R + M divided by 2 = AKI. A rule of thumb is that the Motor Method octane number (MON) is approximately five points less than the AKI. That's a fun fact, but gets us down in the weeds quite a bit.

To round off the topic, we should discuss what additives are used to set the octane level of a given fuel. Lead was the major ingredient from the early 20's up until the late 90's. It also served double duty as a valve wear preventative. Due to health and environmental concerns, it was phased out. Valves and seats were redesigned with

I used to run 87 octane all year round in my harder materials. Additives to replace lead such as MTBE, ETBE, and Ethanol were introduced.

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Medical Conditions and Driving Safety

Many health issues can impair driving - lapse of consciousness is a common one that can potentially cause great danger to you and other drivers on the road. Disorders characterized by lapses of consciousness can result from many different types of medical conditions.

Epilepsy is the most common of these disorders, and is defined as recurrent and unprovoked seizures. Sleep disorders can also manifest themselves as a loss of consciousness. In order to keep the roadways safe, the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) will take the appropriate actions when a driver has been diagnosed with a lapse of consciousness disorder, which may include license suspension, revocation or putting the driver on probation. Placing drivers on medical probation allows the DMV to continually monitor the drivers' medical condition. There are two types of medical probations for drivers with lapse of consciousness disorders- Medical Probation Type II and Type III.

Placing a person on medical probation allows drivers with controlled epilepsy and other disorders characterized by a lapse of consciousness to continue driving while being monitored by the DMV. Once diagnosed, the driver needs to show

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
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Thank you, California Department of Justice, for reminding us of the limits of our rights and freedoms

The posting and advertising of your events on the various web sites on the internet, facebook, etc., are working quite well, and the Department of Justice is busy looking at them.

They are working so well - that one of ABATE's flyers caught the attention of the California Department of Justice (DOJ). Unfortunately that wasn't so good, as they contacted the business that was going to be used for the Local's sign-in and then was directed to the person who was hosting the event, and in turn a couple of other people were informed and finally came to the were looking out for ABATE. The main item that caught the attention of the DOJ was the advertising of a Poker run with a money payout for a high and low hand. And the second item was the "proceeds would benefit could be registered - however - only ONE regis-ABATE". ABATE being a 501 C (not-for-profit) the DOJ was concerned that a benefit was being held by ABATE and ABATE could be "cheated out of its money".

Promoters of fund-raisers must be registered, and the "charity" beneficiary must be named; "often-times big promoters put on fundraisers and never turn money over to the charity", so they



is not registered - ABATE would have no legal recourse to get the money." By the way, charities are "supposed" to receive 90% of the profits".

So there you have some of it – The Poker run tered Poker run per year could take place for the whole State, not each Local Event throughout the year. ONE ONLY.

Next came some more education – what is legal and what is NOT. We probably all have had some idea, just not practicing it. Shame on US! Poker runs for money and 50/50's are NOT LEGAL and SHOULD NOT BE on the flyers,

nor conducted at anyone's event. Failure to comply has very serious consequences. It jeopardizes ABATE as an organization, - ABATE could lose its 501 C status, and the Local putting on the event could lose any monies the DOJ determines you collected, and of course federal fines and the pending expensive litigation.

Any type of "game" that can be considered "gambling' is illegal period. You can hold games that require skill of the participant, and you can have "fun runs" give a raffle ticket for the winner. Also mentioned was Bingo runs – that one was debatable, and the suggestion is to clear the legality of having it with your County or City ordinances for their requirements first. IF they do not give permission, don't have it.




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

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
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
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
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Biker Rights Run by Don Kline

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


